AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 54 of the Marine Act 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2688). the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

- 1. This Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Examination of Masters and Mates" made by the Board on the 28th day of August, 1903, and published in the Government Guzette on the 16th day of September, 1903, heroinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations," and shall come into operation on and from the date of the publication hereof in the Government Guzette.
- 2. To paragraph 97 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following, namely:-

Provided that a candidate who is the holder of a "foreign-going" certificate of competency as a second mate may be deemed to be eligible for examination for a certificate as mate of a "river and bay" steam-ship if on a consideration of his case the Marine Board is of opinion that his previous service is equal to the qualifying service prescribed by this Regulation.

PHARMACY BOARD OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER REGULATION.—ACCEPTANCE OF UNIVERSITY CERTIFICATES.

W HEREAS by section 86 of the Medical Act 1915 the Pharmacy Board of Victoria is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying Part III. of the said Act into effect. And whereas in the opinion of the Board it is expedient and desirable that the Board should be empowered to accept equivalent University certificates in lieu of the Board's Preliminary Examination. Now therefore the said Board doth make the Regulation following (that is to say): lowing (that is to say) :-

- (1) These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with the Regulations made by the Board and approved by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of February, 1917, and shall come into force when confirmed by the Governor in Council, and published in the Government Gazette.
- (2) After clause 44 of the Regulations hereinbefore referred to there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—
 - 44A. Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulations 43 and 44, the Board may, in its absolute discretion, exempt any person from passing the Preliminary Examination who produces a certificate of having passed the Junior or Senior Public Examination, or some equivalent Examination of the Melbourne University, or of some other University recognised by the Board, provided that such certificate includes amongst the subjects which have been passed, one language and one branch of mathematics.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 671.—GENERAL RATE.—CARWARP WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law follow-
