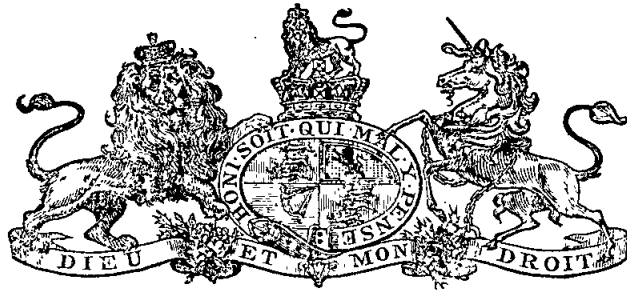

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1917.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the said Trust shall pay for the year 1917 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust, otherwise than by measure, for domestic purposes:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of less than £40, the sum of One pound.

2. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of £40 and upwards, the sum of Sixpence in the pound of such municipal value.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant unoccupied allotments of land shall also be Sixpence in the pound of such annual value, provided that no rate be less than Ten shillings.

4. Water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per one thousand gallons, or such price as may be fixed by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 (twenty thousand) gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price named, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the occupier or owner would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first days of January and July, 1917, respectively, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and receive such rates and charges.

WARRAGUL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Warragul Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 8.

1. The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Warragul Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust, that is to say:—

(a) For every house, building or tenement, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house, building or tenement shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence per annum and provided further that the maximum quantity of water to be used by any ratepayer owning or occupying one house, building or tenement only, shall be 1,000 gallons for every £1 sterling of such municipal valuation.

(b) For every piece of land occupied or unoccupied upon which there is no building erected, a rate of Eightpence in the £1 sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being thereof shall be paid. Provided that such rate shall not be less than Ten shillings and sixpence per annum.

(c) And for every ratepayer owning or occupying two or more houses, buildings or tenements within the Waterworks District to each of which water meters have been and are attached, such maximum quantity to be consumed either wholly at any one or partly at one and partly at any other or others of the said houses, buildings or tenements (and in all cases to be ascertained and paid for by measure) shall, for that part or the whole of the year, as the case may be, during which such ratepayer shall own or occupy such two or more houses, buildings or tenements, but no longer period, be 1,000 gallons for every

£1 sterling of the total sum of the municipal valuations of all the said houses, buildings or tenements owned or occupied by him. If such maximum quantities be exceeded the excess shall be paid for by measure at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

- (d) For water supplied by measure a rate of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be paid, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons, this charge to apply also to all consumers outside the water area.

2. The rates herein are made for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1917, and shall be payable in one sum on the 1st day of March, 1917.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover such rates.

REGULATION FIXING THE MAXIMUM WEIGHT TO BE CARRIED BY VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE SHIRE OF KARA KARA.

WHEREAS by section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2686) it is enacted that the Governor in Council, on the application of the council of any municipality, and being satisfied that the special circumstances of the case require it, may make regulations for declaring the maximum weight to be carried in or by means of any vehicle on any public road in the district of such municipality or in the portion of such district which is mentioned in such Regulation: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, to apply within the municipality of the shire of Kara Kara, viz.:—

No person shall in or by means of a vehicle carry on any public road situate in the shire of Kara Kara a greater weight than the next mentioned (that is to say):—For each wheel of any two-wheeled vehicle a total weight of three hundredweight, avoirdupois and for each wheel of any four-wheeled vehicle a total weight of three and a half hundredweight avoirdupois for each half inch of width of bearing surface of the tire or felloe. The weight of the vehicle shall in all cases be reckoned as part of the weight which may be so carried.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the twenty-fourth day of March, 1915, under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1890*, the Council of the Municipality of the City of Camberwell was authorized to construct a tramway along Riversdale-road, from Burke-road to Boundary-road, within its municipal district. And whereas by an Order in Council made on the sixth day of September, 1915, under the provisions of the *Melbourne to Burwood Tramways Act 1914* (No. 2488), the Hawthorn Tramways Trust was authorized to construct certain tramways within the municipal districts of Melbourne, Richmond, Hawthorn, and Camberwell. And whereas the Hawthorn Tramways Trust, in pursuance with the powers vested in it under the provisions of the *Melbourne to Burwood Tramways Act 1915* (No. 2605) and the *Tramways Act 1915* (No. 2739), has now made application to have the said Orders in Council amended and extended in the manner hereafter referred to, and the said Hawthorn Tramways Trust having duly complied with the requirements of the said Acts and the Regulations made thereunder with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and the Governor in Council being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the said Orders in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of March, 1915, and the sixth day of September, 1915. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance with the provisions of the said Acts, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Hawthorn Tramways Trust shall be and is hereby authorized to amend and extend the said Orders in Council by providing for the following additional sections over the said tramways, and to make the following charges upon the said sections of the said tramways as provided for in the said Orders in Council dated the 24th March, 1915, and 6th September, 1915, in the manner following:—

- (a) For the section between Trafalgar-road, Camberwell, and Prince's-bridge, Melbourne, and *vice versa*, Fourpence (4d.).
- (b) For the section between Boundary-road, Camberwell, and Prince's-bridge, Melbourne, and *vice versa*, Fivepence (5d.).

For each child under twelve (12) years of age (other than children under four years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free), a fare of Twopence (2d.) over section A and a fare of Threepence (3d.) over section B, provided, however, that the fare to be charged for two children travelling together under the age of twelve years shall not exceed the fare charged for one adult.

*Necessary Precautions for Safety of Passengers and Public to be Observed.*

That all cars shall be stopped before entering the curves at the intersections of Wallen-road and Power-street and Riversdale-road and Power-street, and the conductor shall signal the car to proceed only when he, the conductor, shall have satisfied himself that the road is clear. The conductor on the Power-street cars shall proceed to the curves so as to obtain a full view of the thoroughfare into which the car is about to enter, and signal the driver to proceed only when he, the conductor, shall have satisfied himself that the road is clear.

The maximum speed of the cars while travelling upon the said curves shall not exceed four (4) miles an hour.

No. 2645) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations in relation to applications for Orders and to the fees and charges to be paid in respect thereof and to any other matters arising under the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal section 1 of the Fourth Schedule to Order No. 69 granted on the 12th day of March, 1912, to the Kyabram Butter Factory Company Limited, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 20th March, 1912, and doth hereby substitute therefor the following, that is to say:—

"SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the actual amount of energy supplied to him they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For energy supplied for lighting purposes—Ninepence per unit.

For energy supplied for power purposes—Fourpence per unit.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the undertakers may impose a minimum monthly charge of Two shillings and sixpence upon any consumer, irrespective of the amount of energy supplied to him or of the purpose for which such supply is given, regard being given to sections 38 and 39 of the Act."
