Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CLOTHING BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts* the Special Board appointed to determine the Lowest Price or Rate which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, the following articles of Men's and Boys' Clothing or Wearing Apparel, namely, Coats (including Overcoats and Cloaks of every description), Vests, Trousers, Jackets, and Knickerbockers, except indiarubber waterproof garments, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 13th April, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked, and replaced by this Determination.

PROPORTIONATE NUMBER (IN ANY FACTORY OR PLACE).

Males.
One male apprentice to every two or fraction of two male workers receiving at wages rates or earning at piece-work prices not less than 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Females.
One female apprentice to every female worker receiving at wages rates or earning at piece-work prices not less than 28s. per week of 48 hours.
An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed was approved on 19.6.16.

PROPORTIONATE NUMBER (IN ANY FACTORY OR PLACE).

Males.
One male improver to every four or fraction of four male workers receiving at wages rates or earning at piece-work prices not less than 50s. per week of 48 hours.

Females.
One female improver to every three or fraction of three female workers receiving at wages rates or earning at piece-work prices not less than 28s. per week of 48 hours.

(2) **Casual Labour.**—Casual employees, i.e., employees engaged at pressing or order cutting for 24 hours or less in any week shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.

(3) **Time of Beginning and Ending Work.**

(4) **Overtime.**—Any employee who, within the hours of beginning and ending work, works in any week for any time in excess of 48 hours, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

Any employee who is engaged outside the hours specified in this Determination as the times of beginning and ending work upon such day shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half.

(5) **Special Rate for Sundays and Public Holidays.**—All work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the rate of double time. If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate should only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

In this Determination the following terms shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say) :—

| "Second class material" | The garment is made mainly of worsteds, tweeds, sergerottes, serges, vicunas, bedford cords, flannel, alpaca, or similar materials |
| "Third class material" | The garment is made mainly of moleskin, corduroy, drill, linen, or similar material |
| "Order clothing" | "Bespoke garments" made to individual measure |
| "Hand made" | That the garments shall be made wholly by hand |
| "Machining" | Machining only, parts having been tacked or otherwise prepared for machining |
| "Made by machine" | Work done wholly by machinist without tacking |
| "Fitting-up" | Cutting facings, collars, welts, bands, straps, and all fittings and linings |
| "Lined" | Coats lined, back and foreparts, or foreparts only with bogies and sleeve linings |
| "Making" | Tacking, adjusting, and preparing all parts for machinist |
| "Ready-made clothing" | Articles generally known as "Stock" garments cut to sizes, including uniforms tendered for by contract where there are not less than 50 garments of one particular kind and description (notwithstanding they be cut to single measures) and given to each individual worker in quantities of not less than three garments of one particular kind and description at a time, but not including other garments cut to measure |
