Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE JAM TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rate which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

Manufacturing jam, fruit jelly, pickles and sauces, or

- (a) preparing, canning, or preserving lemon or other peel, fruit, or vegetables;
- (b) preparing or putting up any of such articles for sale,

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 1st May, 1917, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

<sup>(</sup>b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shaft be time and a half calculated on the rates fixed for the Day Shift.

#### CASUAL LABOUR.

- (4) That casual hands, i.e., persons who are employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter.
- (5) Special Rates for Sundays and Holidays.—All work done on Sunday, Good Friday, or Eight Hours Day (21st day of April), to be paid at the rate of double time, and on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th day of January), Easter Monday, Christmas-Day, or Boxing Day, to be paid for at the rate of time and a half, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for the day so substituted.

(6) That the lowest piece-work prices payable to any person engaged in the following kinds of work shall be :--
