Health Act 1915.

BOROUGH OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BY-LAW No. 8.

A By-law of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1915, and numbered 8 for the prevention of the pollution of the Barwon River or its tributaries within the limits of the borough of Newtown and Chilwell.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1915 and any other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Newtown and Chilwell, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the said borough of Newtown and Chilwell doth hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. No person shall discharge, or cause or allow to be discharged, any offensive matter or drainage into any part of the Barwon River, and included within the limits of the district of the borough of Newtown and Chilwell, nor within those limits into any tributary of the aforesaid Barwon River.

2. Any person who, by any act or default, shall be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, he shall be liable to a penalty of One pound for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the Justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order portion only of either of the said penalties (such portion not to be less than Five shillings) to be paid.

SHIRE OF KEILOR.

BY-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1915* and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Kellor in the name and on behalf of the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the respective areas included in the pan charges made or that may hereafter be made by the Council as hereinafter provided for, and to no other portion of the said shire.

4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid or other person having the control or management of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such closet or privy to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

7. The Council shall once at least in every week cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed, with its contents, from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

8. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

9. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

10. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

11. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the first day of April, 1916, and confirmed the fourth day of November, 1916.

STANDS for street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs are hereby appointed in streets, roads, and public places within the city of Richmond in the several positions hereunder stated:—

Bridge-road—

- (1) On the west side of Union-street, ten feet south of the building line of Bridge-road.
- (2) On the west side of Lennox-street, ten feet south of the building line of Bridge-road.
- (3) On the west side of Waltham-street, ten feet south of the building line of Bridge-road.
- (4) On the west side of Hosie-street, ten feet south of the building line of Bridge-road.
- (5) On the west side of Coppin-street, ten feet south of the building line of Bridge-road.
- (6) On the west side of Burnley-street, ten feet south of the building line of Bridge-road.

Swan-street—

- (1) On the east side of Lennox-street, ten feet north of the building line of Swan-street.
- (2) On the west side of Byron-street, ten feet south of the building line of Swan-street.
- (3) On the east side of Little Docker-street, ten feet north of the building line of Swan-street.
- (4) On the west side of Shakespeare-place, ten feet south of the building line of Swan-street.

Victoria-street—

- (1) On the east side of Shelley-street, ten feet south of the building line of Victoria-street.
- (2) On the west side of Church-street, ten feet south of the building line of Victoria-street.

2. The Council, from time to time, may abolish, enlarge, or diminish such stands, and appoint any new stand or stands in such position or positions as the Council may determine, and may abolish, enlarge, or diminish any such stand so appointed.

3. The Council may, from time to time, grant licences to use and occupy such stands to street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs. Every such licence shall be in writing, in the form prescribed by the Council, under the hand of the Town Clerk.

4. The charges to be paid for the right to use and occupy any such stand shall be the sum of Twelve shillings per month in advance, or such other sum or sums as the Council may from time to time determine.

5. The times within which such stands may be used or occupied shall be such as shopkeepers selling similar foodstuffs may sell under the *Shops and Factories Act 1915*, or regulations made thereunder, but no person shall use or occupy any of such stands on any Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or other day or portion of a day which may at any time be fixed by the Council by resolution.

6. The following rules shall be observed by all persons licensed to use and occupy such stands:—

Every such person shall—

- (a) At all times keep his stand clean and free from rubbish, paper, fruit stems, fruit skins and peelings, and refuse thrown upon the footway or roadway contiguous to his stand, or under or near any cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle used by him upon his stand.
- (b) Not at any time cause, permit or suffer any nuisance to exist upon or contiguous to his stand.
- (c) Not place any box, package, basket, receptacle or other thing except the cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle used by him and the contents thereof upon his stand, nor upon the footway, or roadway contiguous to his stand (or near such cart, truck, or other vehicle).
- (d) Not cause, permit, or suffer any horse or other animal to remain attached to such cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle while upon his stand, or while not so attached to remain upon his stand or upon the street.
- (e) Not at any time clean fish, or permit or suffer fish to be cleaned upon his stand.

(f) Not cry or shout his goods or wares, or permit or suffer his goods or wares to be cried or shouted by any other person at or near, or while going to or from his stand.

(g) Produce his licence to the Market Inspector or to any member of the Police Force when demanded.

(h) Have his name and address painted legibly and in a conspicuous place on the right or off side of any cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle used upon his stand in Roman letters of not less than one inch in the shortest diameter of the same, either in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, and at all times have such name legible and plainly visible.

(i) Not use any flap, shelf, or other device on such cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle whereby the length or width thereof is increased beyond the measurements by this By-law specified and prescribed.

(j) Not paint or write on such cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle or display, affix, or carry thereon or suspend therefrom any trade or other advertisements or any placard, poster, streamer, flag, or sign of any kind whatsoever if the Council objects thereto.

These rules shall be printed on the back of every licence authorizing any person to use any such stand.

7. No cart, truck, barrow, or other vehicle shall be used upon any such stand unless the same shall—

(a) be not greater in length than ten feet, and in width than four feet.

(b) have been previously approved by the Market Inspector or other officer appointed by the Council.

8. The Council may at any time revoke any licence to use and occupy any such stand if the holder thereof—

(a) Fails to observe any of the rules by clause 6 of this By-law required to be observed by him or otherwise offends against this By-law.

(b) Is convicted of assault, drunkenness, or disorderliness, using obscene or insulting language, brawling or riotous or insulting behaviour, or such like offence.

(c) Is not cleanly in habits and appearance.

(d) Is convicted of any offence under the Health, Game, Fruit, or Weights and Measures Act or any other Act relating to the sale of food.

(e) Acts in any offensive or discreditable manner in the conduct of his stand.

9. When a licence is revoked under clause 8 of this By-law, notice in writing of such revocation under the hand of the Town Clerk shall be served on the holder thereof, either personally or by posting the same in a registered letter addressed to such person at his address stated in the licence, and the right of such person to occupy such stand shall then cease, and any moneys which may have been paid in advance by such person may be declared forfeited by the Council.

10. If any stand is abolished and any person is then licensed to use such stand, the Council, through the Town Clerk, may allot to such licensee a new stand in place thereof, or shall, if such licensee so demand, repay to such licensee a proportionate part of any charges which may have been paid in advance by such licensee for the use of such stand, and such repayment shall be in full satisfaction of all claims and demands by such licensee.

11. No person shall use or occupy any stand save and except a person to whom a licence to use such stand has been granted or transferred under the provisions of and pursuant to this By-law.

12. A licence to use and occupy any stand may be transferred to any street hawker or itinerant trader not already licensed to use or occupy any other stand who shall be approved of by the Council.

(b) Every transfer of any such licence shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, and shall be signed by the person named in such licence or his executors, administrators, or assigns, and by the transferee.

(c) Where a proposed transferee of a licence is approved of by the Council, the licence and transfer, duly signed and executed, shall be lodged with the Town Clerk, who shall note upon the licence the name of the transferee and the particulars of the transfer, and retain the transfer, and, after the payment of the transfer fee herein provided, deliver the licence so noted to the transferee. Such transferee shall thereafter be the only person authorized to use or occupy the stand named in such licence.

(d) A transfer fee of One shilling shall be charged upon every such transfer, and shall be paid when such licence and transfer are lodged with the Town Clerk as aforesaid.

13. No person other than the licensee of a stand shall sell or take any part in selling any goods at such stand, or assist such licensee in selling at such stand unless and until he has been approved of and licensed in that behalf by the Town Clerk.

(b) Every such licence shall be for a period not exceeding one month, and shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk, and any such licence may be revoked by the Council through the Town Clerk at any time.

(c) No fee shall be payable in respect of such licence. 14. All applications for licences under this By-law shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, and signed by the applicant.

15. No boy under the age of 14 years shall manage or occupy any stand (or assist or be employed or take any part in selling at such stand).

16. No licence to use or occupy any stand shall be granted, and no transfer of any such licence shall be made to any person other than a natural born or naturalized subject of His Majesty the King.

17. No licence to use or occupy any stand shall be granted, and no transfer of any such licence shall be made to a corporation or to a female.

18. No person shall, either personally or by his nominee, or any other person on his behalf, use or occupy more than one stand.

19. Every person desiring to use or occupy any stand, whether an applicant for a licence so to do or a proposed transferee of such licence, must be and be certified by at least two ratepayers of the City of Richmond to be of good character, but the Council may in its absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor, refuse to issue such licence and to approve of such transfer.
