#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands adjourned until Tuesday, the sixteenth day of January, 1917: Now, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Tuesday, the twentieth day of February, 1917.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this tenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the seventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

# DETERMINATION OF THE PASTRYCOOKS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a pastrycook has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That previous Determinations of this Board are hereby amended, and such amendments shall -come into force and be operative on and after the 20th January, 1917.

The Determination and amendments are printed hereunder.

#### APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS.

"Apprentice" means any person under 21 years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over 21 years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

Note.—The Pastrycooks Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship agreement. Section 187

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over 21 years of age, or who, being over 21 years of age, holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

#### 5. That-

(a) the lowest rates which may be paid to an apprentice or an improver; and

(b) the proportionate number of apprentices and improvers who may be employed in any factory, shop, or place shall be as shown in the following table:-

.6. That any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a third.

#### SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS

- 7. That all work (except making fermented doughs) done on Sundays before 7 p.m. shall be paid for at double rates, and that time and a third shall be the special rate for all work done on—


New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day;

but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

"Apprentice" means any person under twenty-one years of age bound by indentures of apprenticeship, or any person over twenty-one years of age who, with the sanction of the Minister, is bound by indentures of apprenticeship. (Act 2650, Section 3.)

"Improver" means any person (other than an apprentice) who does not receive a piece-work price or a wages rate fixed by any Special Board for persons other than apprentices or improvers, and who is not over twenty-one years of age, or who being over twenty-one years of age holds a licence from the Minister to be paid as an improver. (Act 2650, Section 3.)
