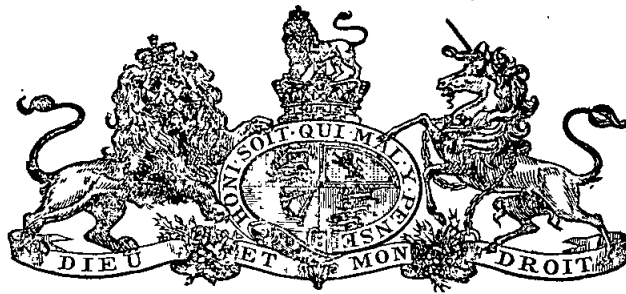

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2618), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.—LAND AT DABYMINGA.—POWER TO DISPOSE.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination known as Roman Catholic, under the provisions of the "Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion," for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the fifth day of June, 1917, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed :—

Description of Land.—1 acre 3 roods 8 perches, county of Dalhousie, township of Dabyminga, being allotments 3, 4, and 5 of section 1: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 3; bounded thence by allotment 2 bearing north 61 degrees west 5 chains 54 links; thence by a road bearing north 29 degrees east 3 chains; thence by a road bearing south 61 degrees east 6 chains 46 links; and thence by the road from Seymour bearing south 46 degrees 7 minutes west 3 chains 12 links to the point of commencement.

Names of Trustees.—The Roman Catholic Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

Power of Disposition.—To sell, transfer, mortgage, charge, lease, exchange, give, grant, or dispose of the whole or any part of the said land.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be Applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church in the Diocese of Melbourne as a Council of such Diocese under the provisions of Act No. 2100 may from time to time by resolution direct.

PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO FOREST RESERVES.—DIAGRAMS TO ACCOMPANY SCHEDULE No. 23.

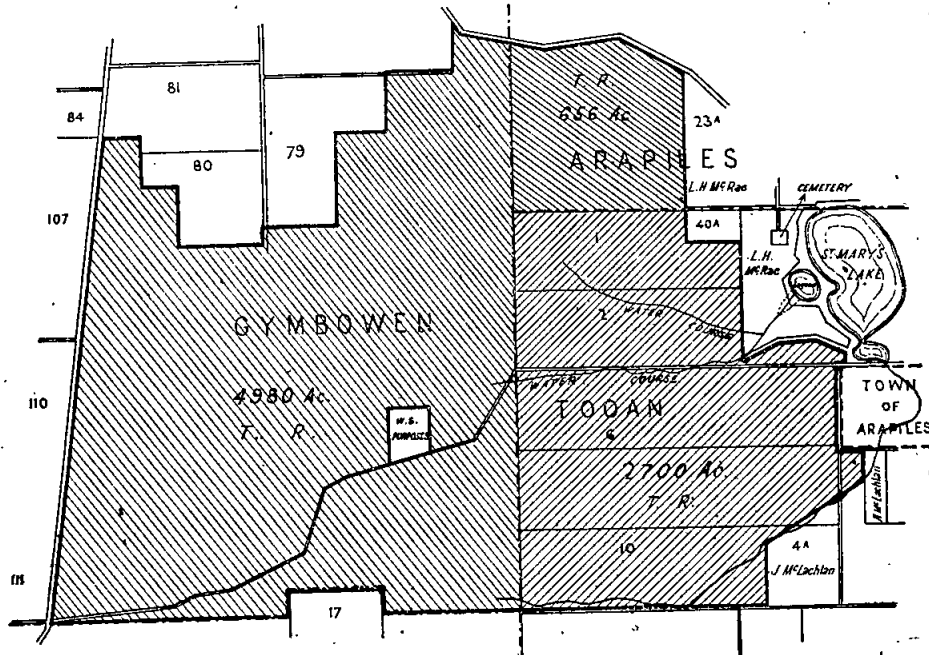

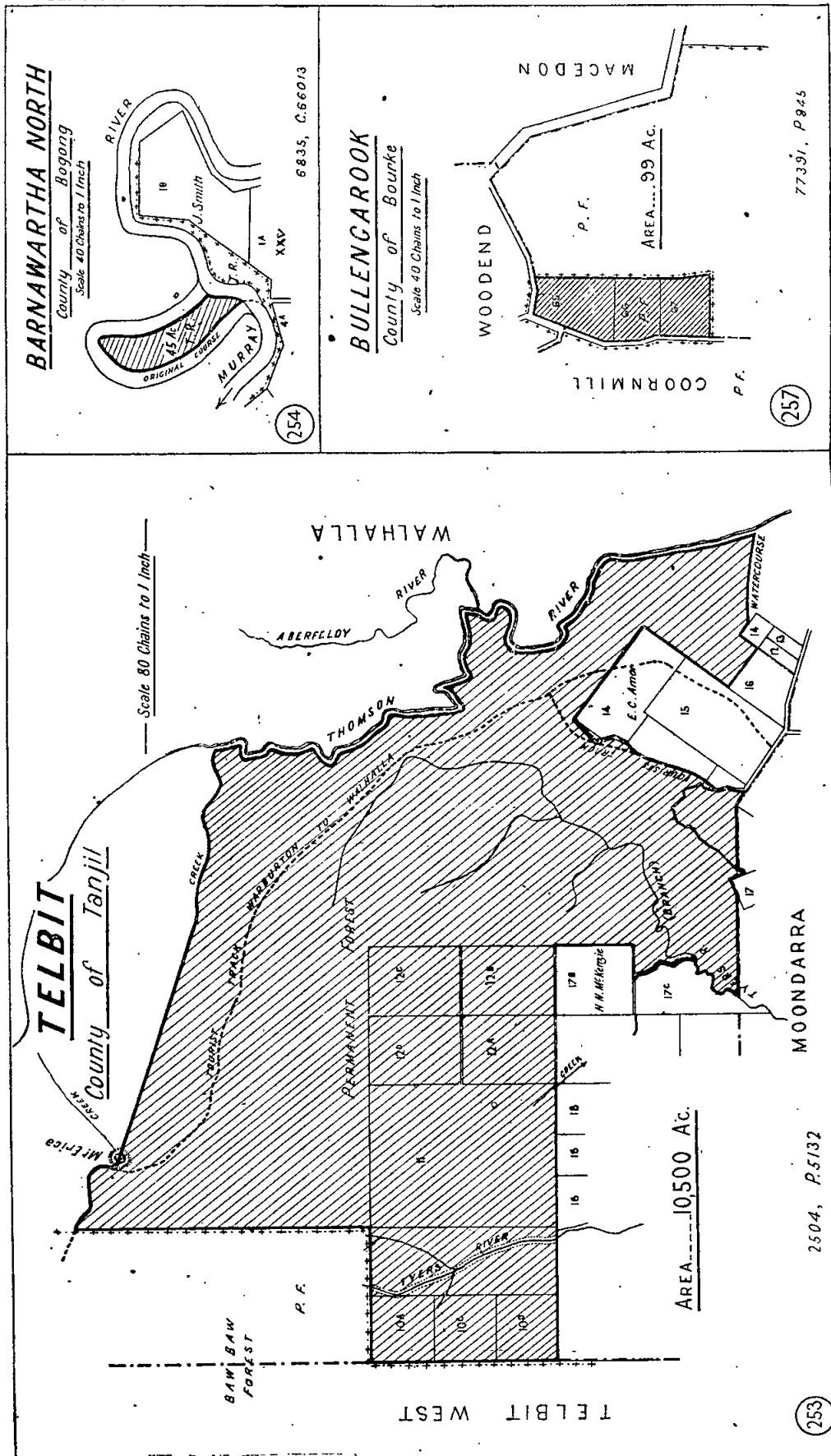

CLOSE SEASON FOR OYSTERS AND RESTRICTIONS ON MARKETING AND STORING OYSTERS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Act 1915, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation of the thirty-first day of August, 1915, relating to the close season for oysters, and order and provide as follows:—

1. That the months of January, February, November, and December shall be substituted for the period fixed by section 17 (2) of the Fisheries Act 1915 as the period during which it shall be unlawful to take, attempt to take, or assist in taking, or sell or offer or expose for sale, or knowingly have in possession any oysters or oyster brood taken in Victorian waters.

2. That no person licensed to take oysters shall in any one week sell, offer for sale, consign or market more than—

- (a) seven three-bushel bags of oysters, or
(b) twenty-one bushels of oysters.

3. That the storing of oysters in bags, either in or out of the water, for more than three days after the day on which such oysters have been taken, shall be prohibited.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE
BALLAN TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor on the 19th day of October, 1915, the council of the shire of Ballan, as managers of the Ballan Town Common, having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof in lieu of the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of August, 1877, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

1. Ratepayers holders of miners' rights, business licences or carriers' licences and farmers may respectively depasture on a common within a distance of 5 miles from their places of residence four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. Bulls or entire horses or steers will not be allowed upon the Common unless the consent, in writing, of the managers be first obtained.

3. All stock depasturing on the Common must be the absolute property of the person making application to register such stock.

4. The fees to be paid for depasturing cattle on the Common shall be—For each cow the sum of 8s. per annum, for each horse 15s. per annum, for each calf or foal up to 12 months old 4s. per annum, payable quarterly in advance on the first Wednesday in January, April, July, and October, and all stock on which fees are not paid within seven days from the commencement of each quarter and found on the Common will be impounded.

5. Application to register cattle must be made at the Shire Hall, Ballan, within the period above stated, and the prescribed fees paid to the person who may from time to time be appointed by the managers to collect and register same.

6. Owners of stock shall at the time of registering same and paying the fees supply the brands and a written description (on forms to be supplied by the Managers) of every animal they desire to have registered, and a copy of description shall be supplied to the herdsman.

7. Cattle will be mustered and checked with the owners' description at such times as may be considered necessary by the Managers, and no notice of such muster will be given to owners, and any stock not registered or not agreeing with the description given will forthwith be impounded.

8. All diseased cattle found upon the Common shall be at once removed by the owner upon receiving written notice from herdsman, and the owner of any stock who neglects to remove any animal shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the herdsman in removing or destroying such animal.

9. All stock placed on the Common will be entirely at the risk of the owner, and the Managers will accept no responsibility therefor.

10. If any animal die upon the Common the owner thereof shall within six hours after notice from the herdsman cause the carcass of such animal to be removed or buried in a spot to be pointed out by the herdsman.

11. If the herdsman shall report any cattle to be a nuisance through straying or damaging fences or otherwise the owners will be held responsible for the payment of any damage incurred, and the Managers may require the owner to remove such cattle and may refuse to register such cattle upon the expiry of the quarter for which they were registered.

12. The herdsman will be required to keep Common cattle from wandering on the streets so far as reasonably may be, and travelling stock remaining on the Common more than twelve hours may be impounded.

13. Geese, turkeys, pigs, or goats found wandering on the Common will be destroyed.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION,
AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR
RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF
PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF
WARRACKNABEAL.

WE, Roderick McKenzie, Baylee Henry Rogers, James George Devereux, Allen Sutcliffe, Daniel Kelly, Thomas Pearce, Stewart Muir, and Charles Quint, the duly appointed committee of management of the Reserve for a race-course and other purposes of public recreation in the town of Warracknabeal having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

1. The Reserve, which is parcelled into the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided :—

1st Division.—The portions set apart for the saddling paddock, carriage paddock, and grandstand.

2nd Division.—The judge's box, stewards' room, weighing room, secretary's office, jockeys' room, and stewards' stand.

3rd Division.—The course proper and the training track.

4th Division.—The remainder of the Reserve.

2. No person shall use the Reserve for the purpose of training or racing horses, or for any other purpose, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

3. No person except the judge and timekeeper and any other person whom the judge may call to his assistance shall enter the judge's box on any day, on which the Reserve is set apart for racing.

4. No person shall, on the days on which the Reserve is set apart for racing, enter the stewards' room or stewards' stand, except the stewards or officials of the Warracknabeal Turf Club and such persons as they may invite.

5. No person shall on any day on which the Reserve is set apart for racing enter the weighing room or weighing yard, or the jockeys' room, except the stewards, the secretary, and the officials of the Warracknabeal Turf Club and those authorized by such stewards and also the jockeys requiring the dress or to be weighed and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

6. Every member of the Warracknabeal Turf Club and every person paying for admission to the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket which he shall, upon demand, produce, or, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person duly authorized by the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of tickets.

7. All persons, including the members of the Warracknabeal Turf Club, renting or hiring for any race meeting the Reserve or any portion thereof, or any booth or other structure upon the Reserve, shall abide by these Regulations and by order given by the committee of management in reference to the Reserve or buildings or other erections thereon.

8. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for racing, shall be as follows :—

For the admission of every adult to the 1st Division, such sum as the committee may determine, not exceeding Ten shillings.

For the admission of every adult to the 4th division, such sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

For admission of every horse to the 3rd division for training purposes, such sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One pound per half year.

9. No person shall carry on any trade, business, or calling whatsoever on any portion of the Reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart for the purpose by the committee of management.

10. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions :—

That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the committee of management of the Reserve on payment of such fee as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two pounds.

That during the time he shall be in or upon the Reserve carrying on his trade, business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied to him by the committee of management of the Reserve, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

11. Any person committing in the Reserve or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences, shall be liable, in addition to any other penalty provided by these Regulations, to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto :—

(a) Assaulting any other person.

(b) Being drunk and disorderly.

(c) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, entering or remaining on the running straight when the horses are in the hands of the starter or are being run for any race.

(d) Using indecent or obscene language.

(e) Wilfully obstructing any officer, agent, or servant of the committee in the execution of their duty.

12. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or cut names on the fences or seats, or in any other way damage the property of the club erected on the said land.

13. No person shall take any dog on the said land during a race meeting unless led or tied up by a chain or cord.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
