ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two hundred and forty-four thousand eight hundred and twenty-three pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and seventeen and One thousand nine hundred and eighteen."

WHEREAS by the resolution set out below and dated the twelfth day of August One thousand nine hundred and eighteen the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act (No. 2635)* being of opinion that the highway in the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be a main road and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such resolution should be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the road mentioned in the schedule to such resolution of the Country Roads Board a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1915*.
