WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915 (No. 2635)* has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Brandy Creek-road in the shire of Warragul (declared to be a main road under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th December, 1913, on page 5155) should be made by the said Board. And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. And whereas on an inspection of the said map plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation. ## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR ROAD AND OTHER PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF BOROKA KNOWN AS THE "PICNIC RESERVE, GRAMPIANS."

WE, Marshall Hunter White, George Mitchell, Charles Henry Akins, George Frederick Greenwood, John Dalziel, Albert Barnes, and Angus H. Clarke, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves for Roads and other Public purposes in the parish of Boroka (hereinafter called the Reserves) having framed the following regulations for the care, protection and management thereof and for the preservation of good order and decency therein and also for the collection and receipt of tolls entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

## REGULATIONS.

(1) No person shall enter or remain in the reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

(2) No person shall put in the reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

(3) No person shall erect any dwelling nor any booth nor other structure in the reserves for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

(4) No person shall camp in the reserves except on such conditions, and on payment of such fee as shall be determined by the Committee of Management.

(5) No person shall stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees, or cut or paint names, letters, or marks on the trees, rocks, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon, or destroy, break, cut, dig up, damage, or injure in any way, or take away any trees, shrubs, scrub, undergrowth, ferns, flowers, or any vegetation or soil in or from the reserves.

(6) No person shall light fires in the reserves except in fire-places provided for the purposes by the Committee of Management.

(7) No person shall shoot, trap, or destroy any bird or native game within the reserves.

Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five Pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some justice and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each tender.
3. Offers must be AT A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge and at the expense of the licensee. 6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any water-course, or to obstruct any road or track, and, where required by the Conservator of Forests or his authorized deputy, all trees felled and stripped must be felled clear of the stump, and not left hanging on the stump.
7. No tree of less than 5 inches diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

The violation of any of the above or following conditions will render the licence null and void, and the Minister of Forests shall have power to absolutely forfeit the whole or part of the deposit to the Crown, and to confiscate to the Crown all bark stripped to date of voidance. The officer in charge, in his discretion, shall have power to instantly suspend operations pending the decision of the Minister of Forests being made known.

#### TOWN OF KEW.

##### BY-LAW No. 53.

A By-law of the town of Kew made under sections 198 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 53 for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings or erections within the town; requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings or erections; authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings or erections erected or constructed contrary to such By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such building or erections and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and notwithstanding anything contained in any By-law or Regulation now in force in the town of Kew the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the town of Kew order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

“Building” means any structure capable of affording protection or shelter either roofed or intended or adapted to be roofed and whether enclosed by walls or not but does not include any fence or other similar erection.

“Ground level” means the level of the ground as determined by the surveyor.

“Municipality” means the municipal district of the town of Kew.

“Surveyor” means the building surveyor or other proper officer for the time being of the municipality.

2. No building except it be a warehouse, shop, shop and dwelling, workshop, public building, or public motor garage, shall be erected so that the front or any part thereof is within twelve feet of the alignment of any street except in the case of an allotment of land at the intersection of two streets and to which of such streets the provisions of this clause shall apply shall be determined by the surveyor.

3. Every building used or intended to be used exclusively as a dwelling-house shall, at the ground level, have an open space exclusively belonging thereto, equal in area to the area of the ground floor including walls and verandahs and such open space shall remain open; provided always that every such building shall, at the rear thereof, have an open space exclusively belonging thereto of not less than seven hundred superficial feet.

4. No building or part of any building which has outside walls of timber framing and no building used or intended to be used exclusively as a dwelling-house, or any part thereof, shall be built within five feet measured horizontally of land not in the same occupation unless the latter be a public way at least ten feet wide.

5. Where any building or erection is partly or wholly erected built or constructed, contrary to the provisions of this By-law:—

- (a) The Council may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building or erection fourteen days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the municipal clerk on behalf of the Council) to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building or erection; and
- (b) if default is made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the Council through its surveyor to enter upon such building or erection and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in their discretion think fit the Council may sell the same in such manner as the Council may determine; and
- (c) in addition to any penalties imposed by this By-law all costs and expenses incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law, or in the execution of work directed by the same, to be executed by any person, and not executed by him, shall be paid by the person committing such breach or failing to execute such work, and may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction, or may be deducted by the Council from any monies received by it under the provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b); and
- (d) the Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.

6. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district but shall not apply to any Government buildings.

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#### BOROUGH OF SANDRINGHAM.

##### BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the borough of Sandringham made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 52 for prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Sandringham order as follows:—

1. No cattle shall be allowed to graze (whether pegged or not) or wander upon any land within the borough of Sandringham not enclosed by a substantial fence.

2. The owner of any cattle which are found so grazing or wandering will be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. Every person under whose care, custody, or control any cattle which are found so grazing or wandering are, or have last been, will also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. In the interpretation of this By-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include the females, and the singular to include the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include "corporation" and the word "cattle" shall include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine, and the word "owner" shall include any person having or being entitled to the possession custody or use of any cattle.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

6. By-law No. 45 of the borough of Sandringham is hereby repealed.
