PETITION FOR INCORPORATION.

THE substance and prayer of a petition to His Excellency the Governor in Council, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors within the meaning of Part I. of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2666), section 3, to The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men, praying that such institution may be incorporated under the style and title of

THE MELBOURNE CONVALESCENTS' HOME FOR MEN,
 are published hereunder pursuant to an Order of the Governor in Council made on the 22nd day of October, 1918, under the provisions of section 4 of the Act aforesaid.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

The petition of the undersigned being contributors of an institution known as The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men

Showeth:—

1. That the institution then known as "The Melbourne Convalescents' Aid Society for Men" was founded in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

2. That subsequent thereto Sir Arthur Nicholson then of St. Kilda Baronet the Reverend Charles Strong of Melbourne Doctor of Divinity and the late Sir Matthew Henry Davies then of Melbourne Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Victoria having in their hands certain moneys for that purpose acquired a block of land in Centre-road Cheltenham on behalf of the said institution and became registered proprietors thereof.

3. That subsequent thereto the said Sir Arthur Nicholson the Reverend Charles Strong and Sir Matthew Henry Davies executed a deed poll or declaration of trust bearing date the tenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and ninety by which they declared that they purchased the said land out of moneys belonging to the aforesaid institution and that they held the land upon trust for the said institution and for no other trust intent or purpose whatsoever.

4. That the said Sir Arthur Nicholson many years ago left the State of Victoria and retired from the trusts declared by the said deed poll and the said Sir Matthew Henry Davies died on the twenty-sixth day of November One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

5. That the present trustees of the said institution are the said Reverend Charles Strong and Cecil Harwood Locke Davies of Melbourne barrister and solicitor (a son of the said Sir Matthew Henry Davies) now on active service abroad.

6. That subsequent to the execution of the said deed poll further property adjoining the last-mentioned property was acquired for the purposes of the institution.

7. That the whole of the freehold property of the institution together with buildings and erections thereon is now of the value of not less than Three thousand pounds.

8. That the furniture and fittings stock plant and appliances in and about the property of the institution at Cheltenham aforesaid are of the value of not less than Six hundred pounds.

9. The freehold property of the institution is unencumbered save for an overdraft at the Commercial Bank of Australia Limited amounting to about Five hundred pounds.

10. That two hundred and twenty-six convalescents have been received and accommodated at the home of the institution during the past year and for many years it has received and accommodated on an average twelve convalescents per diem.

11. That male convalescents only are received at the said Home.

12. That by a resolution of the contributors duly passed at a general meeting held on the twenty-second day of August One thousand nine hundred and seventeen the name of the institution was changed to "The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men."

13. That the institution is a philanthropic institution within the meaning of Division 2 of Part I. of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* its objects being to assist male convalescents from public hospitals or elsewhere by affording them the benefits of country residence to restore their strength and fit them for work.

14. That the institution is supported in part by voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons each of whom has paid not less than One pound per annum.

15. That annexed to this petition is a copy of the last report and balance-sheet of the institution submitted to the contributors at the general meeting held on the twenty-second day of August One thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

16. That the contributors of the said institution are desirous that the same be incorporated under the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915*.

Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the said institution may be incorporated under the said *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* by the style of "The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men."

And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering.
3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.
5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.
6. The acceptance of the firewood or charcoal shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood or charcoal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood or charcoal may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the article so rejected or returned.
7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.
8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.
9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.
10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.
11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of firewood or charcoal by the Commonwealth Government.
14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in

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CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the city of Footscray made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915* and Numbered 42 with reference to street traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the 197th Section of the *Local Government Act 1915* and the 6th section of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the city of Footscray order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires:—

"City" means the city of Footscray.

"Council" means the council of the city of Footscray.

"Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat and swine species respectively.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle or motor car.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare or other public place within the city habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

"Horse" includes mule and donkey.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

"Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare or other public place within the city other than a footway.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal power.

Words importing the masculine gender include females and words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.

2. No person shall feed any horse in a street except by means and out of a nosabag containing the forage and attached to the head of the horse. No person shall remove the blinkers or bridle of any horse in a street. And every driver of a vehicle to which a vicious horse is attached shall keep the horse efficiently muzzled while it is standing upon any stand in the city or standing in a street.

3. No person shall when driving any vehicle or motor car in any street use any brake the application of which to such vehicle or motor car produces a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto. The employer of the driver of any vehicle or motor car on which a brake is used contrary to this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

4. No person shall drive upon any street any vehicle or motor car which is loaded or partly loaded with steel or iron rails or other material of any sort or description unless such rails or other material are or is so packed or stowed by being separated

by sacks or bags or by some other appropriate means as to prevent such rails or other material from producing a noise calculated to cause annoyance to persons in such street or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto. The employer of any person acting in contravention of the foregoing provisions of this section shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

5. No person except between the hours of eight o'clock p.m. and eight o'clock a.m. shall carry in a street upon a vehicle or motor car or otherwise any load or structure exceeding ten feet in height or fifty square feet in area.

6. No person shall upon a vehicle or motor car having less than four wheels carry in any street any material, article, or thing exceeding twenty-five feet in length.

7. No person shall upon any vehicle carry in any street any material, article or thing which, whether forming the whole or part only of the load, projects more than two feet outside the line of the wheels or sides of the vehicle or motor car.

8. No person shall in a street so carry anything upon any vehicle or motor car that any part of the thing carried touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.

9. No person shall in any street at one and the same time act as driver or have the sole charge of more than one vehicle drawn by animal power or more than two vehicles or motor cars fastened together and no person under fifteen years of age shall in any street act as the driver or have sole charge of any vehicle or motor car driven within the city for business or trade purposes.

10. No person upon any street or footway shall, to the obstruction or annoyance of any other person thereon, make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play on any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue.

11. No person upon any street or footway shall sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument or sing or harangue after being required to desist by any member of the police force or any officer of the council or by any inmate of any house within fifty yards of such person.

12. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods in any street or footway in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use thereof.

13. No person selling or offering for sale any goods in any street or footway shall, without special permission in writing from the Town Clerk, occupy any fixed stand or shall loiter in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway and every such person shall move on upon being so required by any officer of the council or any member of the police force.

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC GENERALLY.

14. The driver of a vehicle or motor car upon any street and the rider of a horse or other animal upon any street shall except in so far as shall be necessary for the purpose of avoiding a collision or for other justifiable cause—

(1) Keep the same as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side.

(2) When meeting a vehicle, motor car, horse, tram car or pedestrian keep on left or near side of the street.

(3) When passing by any vehicle, motor car, horse or pedestrian going in the same direction go on the right or off side of such vehicle, motor car, horse or pedestrian.

(4) When passing by a tramcar going in the same direction pass the same on the left or near side thereof.

(5) Before stopping or turning round in any street or turning from one street into another give notice of his intention so to do by holding up his whip or his hand so that the same may be seen by any person immediately following and (in the case of the driver of a vehicle or motor car) upon stopping so place his vehicle or motor car as to cause as little obstruction as possible to the traffic and if his stopping prevents the passing of any other vehicle or motor car he shall upon being required so to do by the driver of such other vehicle or motor car or by any member of the police force or officer of the council remove his vehicle or motor car so as to permit such other vehicle or motor car to pass and if his stopping interrupts or delays traffic he shall remove his vehicle or motor car so as to discontinue such interruption or delay.

(6) Before turning to the right or off side from one street into another drive or ride parallel to the footway upon the left or near side of the street which he is leaving until he is as near as practicable to the left hand side of the street which he is entering.

(7) Not leave the same unattended except for a few minutes only and except it is left in such a position as not to obstruct traffic.

(8) Cause the same to be drawn as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side of the street and parallel thereto and brought to a stand-still on the approach of and during the passing of any fire engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to the scene of any fire.

15. The driver of a vehicle or a motor car on any street shall—

- (1) When stopping for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passengers do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side.
- (2) Not drive the same in competition with or to the annoyance of any other person so as to block or immediately and closely precede or follow or intentionally conform to the progress of any other vehicle or motor car.

16. Every driver of a motor car or bicycle upon any street shall within reasonable distance and before passing any other vehicle or motor car, horse or pedestrian give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell or other instrument.

17. No person shall between sunset and sunrise drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street or permit any vehicle or motor car to be upon any street unless good and serviceable lamps suitable to such vehicle or motor car are securely fixed one at each side of the front of such vehicle or motor car and are lighted and are so placed that the lights therefrom are distinctly visible to persons in front of such vehicle or motor car as white lights and to persons at the rear of such vehicle or motor car as red lights. Provided that in any case where a red tail light is used it shall not be necessary that the lights fixed as aforesaid shall be visible from the rear. Provided also that in a case of a bicycle or motor cycle one front white light and one red tail light shall be sufficient.

18. No person shall drive any vehicle or motor car upon any street or permit any vehicle or motor car to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle or motor car is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle or motor car and no person while driving such vehicle or motor car upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

19. No person shall ride any horse or drive any vehicle or motor car along any street in such manner or in such order that more than two horses vehicles or motor cars are travelling side by side in the same direction. The foregoing provisions of this section shall not apply to horses vehicles or motor cars which form part of a duly authorized parade or procession.

20. No person shall ride any horse or other animal or drive or impel any vehicle or motor car upon any footway. Provided however that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC.

21. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his right hand side of the footway and shall when meeting or overtaking any person pass on the left hand side of such person.

22. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon.

STREET PROCESSIONS.

23. No procession of persons or vehicles or motor cars or of any combination of persons vehicles or motor cars shall except for military or funeral purposes parade or pass through any street unless with the previous consent in writing of the Mayor or the Town Clerk and by the route specified in such consent and unless and until the recipient of such consent has given at least twenty-four hours' notice with particulars of such consent and route to the officer in charge of the city police.

LAWFUL DIRECTIONS TO BE COMPLIED WITH.

24. Every person in the city shall:—

- (1) In respect of all or any of the following matters, that is to say—
 - (a) Approaching or departing from any footway or street,
 - (b) The manner of taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods in any footway or street, or
 - (c) The regulation of traffic in any footway or street,

at all times obey and conform to any notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the Mayor or in his absence or in the case of sudden emergency under the hand of the Town Clerk or the officer in charge of the city police and shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order or direction of any member of the police force or officer of the council.

- (2) Upon any member of the police force or officer of the council in order to enforce the due observance of any law, by-law, regulation, or lawful notice, holding up his hand or giving an order or direction, stop for so long or proceed in such manner and direction as such member of the police force or officer of the council deems necessary to allow free space between any persons, procession or vehicles, or for cross traffic or for any other like purpose.

- (3) If any horse or vehicle or motor car in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by any member of the police force or officer of the council to remove such horse, vehicle or motor car, remove the same either from the vicinity or to some such adjacent part of that or some such adjacent part of that or some neighbouring street as is indicated by the member of the police force or officer of the council.
- (4) On the request of any member of the police force or officer of the council produce to him for inspection any order, leave, licence or other written authority relating to traffic in the city held by such person.

Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or wilfully disobeys any direction or order or request given or made as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

25. Any person offending against this By-law shall for each offence upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds.

26. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Footscray.

Signatures (in particular) and proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.

THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE is published on WEDNESDAY EVENING in each week, and Notices for insertion must be received by the Government Printer on or before Two o'clock of the day preceding the day of publication.

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
