## REGULATIONS.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS, CHAPTER XIII.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Part II. of Chapter XIII. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

25. *Applications of Officers, How to be Made.*—The application or communication of any officer upon any matter relating to himself individually or in common with others or in any way affecting his position in the Service shall be made by the officer himself, through the head of his branch, to the Permanent Head of the Department; and if it be made through any other person, it will be treated as irregular. Provided, however, that officers may communicate as herein prescribed with the Commissioner, in which case the communication shall be forwarded by the Permanent Head to the Commissioner with any remarks considered necessary.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

The petition of the undersigned being contributors of an institution known as The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men

Showeth:—

1. That the institution then known as "The Melbourne Convalescents' Aid Society for Men" was founded in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

2. That subsequent thereto Sir Arthur Nicholson then of St. Kilda Baronet the Reverend Charles Strong of Melbourne Doctor of Divinity and the late Sir Matthew Henry Davies then of Melbourne Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Victoria having in their hands certain moneys for that purpose acquired a block of land in Centre-road Cheltenham on behalf of the said institution and became registered proprietors thereof.

3. That subsequent thereto the said Sir Arthur Nicholson the Reverend Charles Strong and Sir Matthew Henry Davies executed a deed poll or declaration of trust bearing date the tenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and ninety by which they declared that they purchased the said land out of moneys belonging to the aforesaid institution and that they held the land upon trust for the said institution and for no other trust intent or purpose whatsoever.

4. That the said Sir Arthur Nicholson many years ago left the State of Victoria and retired from the trusts declared by the said deed poll and the said Sir Matthew Henry Davies died on the twenty-sixth day of November One thousand nine hundred and twelve.

5. That the present trustees of the said institution are the said Reverend Charles Strong and Cecil Harwood Locke Davies of Melbourne barrister and solicitor (a son of the said Sir Matthew Henry Davies) now on active service abroad.

6. That subsequent to the execution of the said deed poll further property adjoining the last-mentioned property was acquired for the purposes of the institution.

7. That the whole of the freehold property of the institution together with buildings and erections thereon is now of the value of not less than Three thousand pounds.

8. That the furniture and fittings stock plant and appliances in and about the property of the institution at Cheltenham aforesaid are of the value of not less than Six hundred pounds.

9. The freehold property of the institution is unencumbered save for an overdraft at the Commercial Bank of Australia Limited amounting to about Five hundred pounds.

10. That two hundred and twenty-six convalescents have been received and accommodated at the home of the institution during the past year and for many years it has received and accommodated on an average twelve convalescents per diem.

11. That male convalescents only are received at the said Home.

12. That by a resolution of the contributors duly passed at a general meeting held on the twenty-second day of August One thousand nine hundred and seventeen the name of the institution was changed to "The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men."

13. That the institution is a philanthropic institution within the meaning of Division 2 of Part I. of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* its objects being to assist male convalescents from public hospitals or elsewhere by affording them the benefits of country residence to restore their strength and fit them for work.

14. That the institution is supported in part by voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons each of whom has paid not less than One pound per annum.

15. That annexed to this petition is a copy of the last report and balance-sheet of the institution submitted to the contributors at the general meeting held on the twenty-second day of August One thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

16. That the contributors of the said institution are desirous that the same be incorporated under the provisions of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915*.

Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the said institution may be incorporated under the said *Hospitals and Charities Act 1915* by the style of "The Melbourne Convalescents' Home for Men."

And your petitioners will ever pray, &c.

## AMENDMENT OF PROVISION OF PILOT REGULATIONS WITH RESPECT TO ISSUE OF PILOTAGE EXEMPTION CERTIFICATES.

UNDER the power in that behalf vested in it, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of the said State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. Sub-clause (4) of the clause numbered 116 of the Regulation made by the Board on the fifth day of September, in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and approved by the Governor in Council on the sixteenth day of the same month (which principal clause is one passed in substitution for a clause bearing the same number in "The Pilot Regulations 1911"), is hereby revoked, and for such sub-clause so revoked there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

"(4) No candidate not being the actual master of a ship, passing the examination for any port, shall be entitled to receive a Pilotage Exemption Certificate until such time as he shall give satisfactory proof that he has in good faith actually become to all intents and for all purposes the master of the ship in respect of which the Exemption Certificate is to issue and has been duly registered as such master."

2. This Regulation shall take effect on and from the date of the passing thereof.

## CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

## BY-LAW No 28.

THE Municipal Council of the city of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has for the purpose of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay in advance in one instalment for the period from the first day of October, 1918, to the 30th day of September, 1919, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelvence (1s.) for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of October, or the first day of April, shall be charged two-thirds rate.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses and wholesale stores, not being dwellings, nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons, and ratepayers shall be charged for quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Council, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per centum for wooden buildings lined with plaster, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Council, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Council shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall

be the quantity which at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons, is equal to the amount of the assessed rate, for the period which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (o) For water supplied to public parks and showgrounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens and the Manifold-street Reserve, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (q) The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable on the first day of March of the said year.
- (r) Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

(b) a mechanical engineer, including—

- (1) a patternmaker,
- (2) an iron and brass turner,
- (3) a fitter,
- (4) a blacksmith,
- (5) a coppersmith,
- (6) a planer,
- (7) a slotter,
- (8) a borer,
- (9) a milling machiner.

Also that such Special Board may, in any regulation, determination, order, or instrument, or legal proceedings, be described for all purposes as the Engineers and Brassworkers (Skilled) Board.

- (II.) That a Special Board, consisting of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any unskilled persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR WATER SUPPLY AND RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF BUNG BONG.**

**T**HE Council of the Shire of Talbot, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Water Supply and Recreation purposes, in the parish of Bung Bong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding one shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any game or sports within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such building, stand, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
