VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 235.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

(1) Loading and Unloading Charges.

The charge of 6d. per ton prescribed on page 88 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 230) for the loading and unloading, respectively, of certain goods at Melbourne, Geelong, Ballarat, Ballarat East, Bendigo, and Echuca is hereby increased to 1s. per ton for each service, subject to the following exceptions, viz.:—

- (a) That the charge for loading and unloading agricultural produce and fruit at Melbourne shall be 9d. per ton for each service, and
- (b) That goods in Class "C" received at Ballarat from or forwarded from Ballarat to Melbourne or Geelong will be loaded or unloaded, as the case may be, at Ballarat by the Commissioners without charge.

(2) Re-consignment of Goods.

The re-consignment of goods as prescribed in General Condition No. 34, page 18 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 230), shall be allowable only when the truck is in transit, and sub-clause (2) of clause (a) of such General Condition is hereby cancelled.

The full tariff rates shall be charged when the goods are re-consigned after the truck has arrived at the destination station to which it was originally consigned.

(3) City Market and the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding.

Bacon, butter, cheese, honey, meat, and fruit for export sent from country stations to the City Market, or the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding, shall be charged 1s. 6d. per ton in addition to the tariff rate to Melbourne; unloading to be done by owners. This rate shall also apply to rabbits and hares (in truck loads) for export sent from country stations to the City Market, or the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding.

(4) Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding.

(a) Coal forwarded from the Victorian coal-fields to the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding shall be charged 4d. per ton in addition to the tariff rate to Melbourne.

(b) Timber and straw forwarded to the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding shall be charged 1s. 6d. per ton in addition to the tariff rate to Melbourne.

(c) All outwards consignments shall be charged 1s. 6d. per ton in addition to the tariff rate from Melbourne.

(5) Victorian Stevedoring Coy.'s Siding.

Consignments forwarded to or from the Victorian Stevedoring Coy.'s Siding shall be charged 6d. per ton in addition to the tariff rate to or from Melbourne, provided that such charge shall not be applicable to wool, rags, hides and skins consigned to the Victorian Stevedoring Coy.'s Siding to be dumped.

(6) Lysaght Galvanized Iron Coy.'s Siding.

Consignments forwarded to or from the Lysaght Galvanized Iron Coy.'s Siding shall be charged 6d. per ton in addition to the tariff rate to or from Melbourne, as the case may be.

(7) Piggott-street Siding.

Inwards consignments to Piggott-street Siding shall be charged 9d. per ton and outwards consignments 1s. per ton in addition to the tariff rate to or from Melbourne, as the case may be.

(8) Victoria Dock and Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding.

(a) Coal in truck loads forwarded from the Victoria Dock to the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding, and also coke and grain in truck loads despatched from the Victoria Dock to Melbourne, shall be charged 1s. 6d. per ton.

(b) Empty cases, new, forwarded from the Victorian Butter Factories Coy.'s Siding to the Victoria Dock shall be charged 1s. 6d. per ton, minimum 10s. for each special trip.

(9) Victorian Stevedoring Shed and Grain Shed.

Wool or grain forwarded from the Grain Shed to the Victorian Stevedoring Shed shall be charged 1s. 6d. per ton in full truck loads.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 1st day of December, 1918.

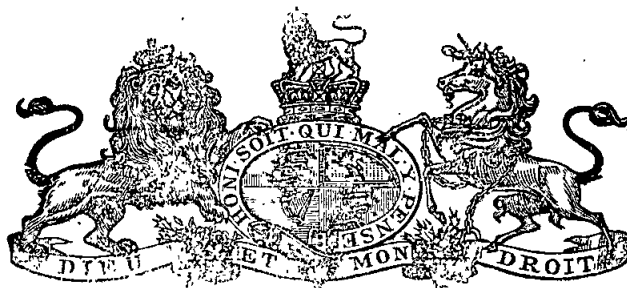

Health Acts.

REGULATION FOR THE PREVENTION OR MITIGATION OF INFLUENZA.

THE Governor in Council of the State of Victoria having by an Order dated the 29th day of February, 1918, directed that the provisions contained in section 173 of the Health Act 1915, as amended by the Health Act 1915 (No. 2), No. 2310, be put into force in Victoria, the Board of Public Health doth hereby make the following Regulations for the prevention or mitigation of the dangerous infectious disease known as Influenza, that is to say:—

(1) Short Title.—These Regulations may be cited as the "Influenza Regulations 1918."

(2) Interpretation.—

"Board" means the Board of Public Health.

"Council" means the council of any municipality, including the cities of Melbourne and Geelong.

"Contact" means any person who has been in any room at the same time as any person suffering from influenza.

"Clerk" means the town clerk of any city, town, or borough, or the secretary of any shire council.

"Patient" means any person who is suffering from influenza.

(3) The occupier of every house wherein any person develops influenza or the symptoms of influenza shall forthwith report the occurrence, in writing, to the clerk of the municipal district in which such house is situate, and such report shall include the name, age, and sex of the person suffering from such symptoms, and the exact location of the house.

(4) On receipt of any such report the council shall forthwith cause inquiries to be made, and if satisfied that the case is one of influenza shall—

(a) Isolate the patient at his residence, or if such residence is unsuitable, in the opinion of the Officer of Health, at any special place provided for the purpose;

(b) Ascertain the names and addresses of all contacts, and shall isolate them at their several places of residence, or if such places are unsuitable, in the opinion of the Officer of Health, at any place of segregation provided for the purpose; and

(c) In the case of any contact not residing in the municipal district, inform the clerk of the municipal district in which such contact resides of the circumstances.

(5) Every person who suffers from symptoms of influenza shall immediately inform the occupier of the house wherein he resides of his condition.

(6) Every medical practitioner who becomes aware of the existence of any person suffering from influenza shall send a report, in writing, to the clerk of the municipal district in which the patient resides, and such report shall include the name, age, sex, and address of such patient, and every such practitioner shall inform the patient of his condition, and if such patient be seen at a house, shall also inform the occupier of such house.

(7) Every person who has been in contact with any patient shall, as soon as he becomes aware of the fact, report the circumstances, in writing, to the clerk of the municipal district in which he resides, and such report shall include his name and address.

(8) No contact and no person suffering from symptoms of influenza shall enter any public building or any place where persons are congregated.

(9) Every person suffering or convalescing from influenza and every contact shall submit to and carry out such treatment as the Officer of Health specifies, and for such period as he directs.

(10) All patients and contacts shall be isolated for such period as the Officer of Health deems necessary for the safety of the public.

(11) The person in charge of any case of influenza shall cause all discharges from the patient to be disinfected immediately.

(12) Every council shall forward daily to the Secretary of the Board the name, age, sex, and address of every person suffering from influenza coming under its notice.

(13) Every council and its officers are hereby authorized, required, and directed to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and to provide for the supply of medicines and other substances for the prevention or cure, and for affording to persons afflicted by or threatened with influenza such medical or other aid as may be required.

(14) Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing Regulations, or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof, is, by section 388 of the Health Act 1915, thereby guilty of an offence against that Act, and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Twenty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued, besides any cost or expenses which may be incurred in remedying his default.

AVOCA TOWNSHIP WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 9.

THE Avoca Township Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Waterworks District has for the purposes of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

1. On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal value thereof; but the minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be ten thousand gallons (10,000).

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per thousand gallons (1,000).

5. Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

6. For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

7. On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the charge shall be Five shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), and the contractor, owner, or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the contractor, owner, or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided; or they may by special agreement with the Trust pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings per annum, and for water at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, payments in either case to be made in advance.

8. Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.

9. In the event of any dispute as to which subsection applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to make a special charge.

10. For water supplied to public gardens, parks, and show grounds, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

11. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the assessed rate payable for the premises on which such hose is used.

12. For all tenements in the said District situated otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, the rate shall be one-half, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof, shall be one quarter the amount which would be payable if such tenement were supplied with water from the service pipes.

13. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1919.

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover such rates and charges.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1919, No. 14.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 14.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

(1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid.

(3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings be charged.

(4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.

(5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1919, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1919.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

THE UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

Rating By-law No. 31 for 1918-19, making a rate for water supply purposes, fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and regulating the times of payment.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Beechworth, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of (£15) Fifteen pounds and under, a rate of £1 per annum.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of (£15) Fifteen pounds, a rate of Six pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence per centum per annum on the amount of such annual valuation,

The above rates shall be paid in advance by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of October, 1918, and on the first day of April, 1919.

Water supplied by measure to any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, or to any other person (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) shall be supplied, charged and paid for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged and paid for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for quarterly, on the first day of October, the first day of January, the first day of April, and the first day of July.

This By-law shall be deemed to have come into operation and shall take effect from the first day of October, 1918.

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet; and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

NOTICE is hereby given that By-law No. 81 of the City of Richmond, made and passed by the Council of the City of Richmond, and sealed, has been approved by the Governor in Council.

The By-law is made under sections 197, 198, and 217 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings or fences.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings erections or hoardings or fences erected or constructed contrary to this or any by-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this or any By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair or renewal of buildings roofs or chimneys, flues, smoke vents or stove pipes.
- (e) For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- (f) For regulating the height, thickness, construction or materials of the party walls and the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.
- (g) For regulating the construction materials and enclosing by building or otherwise of fireplaces or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam or in any mill, brewery, bakehouse, or gasworks or in any manufactory whatsoever although a steam engine be not used therein respectively.
- (h) Regulating, controlling, restricting and preventing the exhibition of advertisements.
- (i) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may be erected.
- (j) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings and providing for means of escape from buildings in case of fire and the prevention of fires in buildings, the ventilation and lighting of buildings, exits from stairways in buildings other than private dwelling-houses, and the minimum size of any dwelling rooms.
- (k) Requiring certain work or things to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved of in any particular case by the Council or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.
- (l) Leaving certain matters or things to be from time to time determined applied dispensed with or regulated by the Council by resolution or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council.
- (m) For the suppression of nuisances.
- (n) The abatement of nuisances caused by stables.
- (o) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council and for the repealing of By-law 73 and all other By-laws inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions of this By-law.
