<sup>(4)</sup> SPECIAL RATES FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—That payment for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be at the rate of time and a half; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
