WEARING OF BADGES.

THE subjoined despatch, dated the 17th October, 1917, and its enclosures, relating to the manner in which various badges shall be worn in future, and how the cost of certain necessary alterations may be defrayed, have been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and are published for general information. Victoria. Honours. SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you copies of a notification, dated 1st June last, issued from the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood, prescribing the manner in which the badge of the Third Class or Companions of the Orders of the Bath, the Star of India, Saint Michael and Saint George, and the Indian Empire shall in the future be worn, and of a further notification, dated 10th August, with regard to the manner in which the cost of the necessary alterations in the Badges of Companions may be defrayed.

- Badges of Companions may be defrayed.

 2. I have to explain that, as indicated in the first of these notices, the change is due to His Majesty's decision that henceforward the grade of Companion in these four Orders should rank as senior to that of Commander in other Orders which are later in date. The effect is to place the rank of Commander of the Royal Victorian Order lower than that of the Companionships in question. His Majesty's commands, so far as they affect Companions of the Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, which may be of more particular interest in the majority of the oversea Dominions, have been embodied in a new statute of the Order, dated 1st June, 1917.
- 3. I think it may be useful to explain certain points arising out of His Majesty's recent decision for the guidance of those who hold the dignities affected by it—
- who hold the dignities affected by it—

 (a) The new rule will apply to all Companions of the Orders and a period of grace will enable Companions residing in distant parts of the Empire to have the necessary alterations of their badges made. The length of the period will not be prescribed.

 (b) The new riband to be worn will be of the breadth prescribed by the existing statutes of the Order (one inch and a half).

 (c) (i) The Knight Commander of an Order who is also a Companion of a Senior Order, will, of course, treat the badge of the Order of which he is a Knight Commander as senior for all purposes.

 (ii) A Companion or Commander of more than one of the Orders affected will wear the badge of the senior Order just below the collar of the tunic or uniform No 2—Landars 4, 1918—17362.—1.

coat, the other badges being worn one below the other, suspended on riband which emerges from between the buttons of the coat.

(iii) With evening dress the badge of the senior Order will be worn under the white tie, the others, in miniature, on the lapel of the coat.

(d) When a Companion is in service dress the riband of the Order will be worn on the left breast, as heretofore.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OR EXPOSURE FOR SALE OF FEMALE CRAYFISH (WHETHER TAKEN IN VICTORIA OR ELSEWHERE) DURING THE CLOSE SEASON.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a proclamation providing that as regards Female Crayfish a person who sells or exposes for sale any such fish during the "close season" for the same shall be liable to the penalty mentioned in section twenty-nine (29) of the Fisheries Act 1915, namely, not less than Two nor more than Fifty pounds, whether such fish were taken in Victoria or elsewhere.
