ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is herein-after set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two millions four hundred and fifteen thousand eight hundred and twenty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and eighteen and One thousand nine hundred and nineteen."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

Income Tax Act 1915.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the State Income Tax Acts and the regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months, 1st July 1917, to the 30th June, 1918, consisted of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, or annuity, and whose income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts earned in or derived from Victoria amounted to Two hundred and one pounds or upwards, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Acts or regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of August, 1918.

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, Railway Buildings, Flinders-street, Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Act liable to be prosecuted and to pay a penalty of not less than £2 or more than £100, and will be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

WE, Horace Frank Richardson, George Stanley Armytage, William Allin Mountjoy, Charles Walter Cunningham Farran, Edward Leslie Seymour, William Coulton Smith, and Albert Ellingworth Jarratt, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserves specified hereunder (hereinafter called the "Reserves"), having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall light fires in the Reserves, except in those places provided by the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, marram grass, or other vegetation in the Reserves, or remove therefrom any live or dead timber, gravel, stone, shell, sand, loam, or other material.

5. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, destroy, or remove the said fences, trees, seats or any other improvements, or any survey pegs or permanent marks therein.

6. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, sheep, or other animals, and no horses or vehicles shall be allowed in the Reserves except on such portions as may be set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

7. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or marram grass.

8. No person shall deposit waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserves except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

9. No person shall erect any booth or other structure, or offer for sale any article in the Reserves, without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing.

10. No person shall break glass of any kind or allow the pieces to remain in the Reserves, or leave therein on the beach anything which would injure bathers.

11. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in any part of the Reserves.

12. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boatshed in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall bathe from the Reserves unless decently attired from the neck to the knee.

14. No person shall use any bathing-box or any boathouse for residential purposes.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

THE Council of the City of Warrnambool, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves specified hereunder (hereinafter called the "Reserves"), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

The land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation, known as "Flagstaff Hill," in the city of Warrnambool.

The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 3rd September, 1883, as a site for a Public Park, known as "Albert Park," in the municipal district of Warrnambool.

The land temporarily reserved as a site for a Public Park, known as "Victoria Park," in the city of Warrnambool.

The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 11th January, 1910, as a site for Public Recreation, known as "Booval Gardens," in the city of Warrnambool.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, seats, gates, or erections in any of the Reserves, or put offensive matter in the water troughs or reservoirs therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in any of the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the consent of the Committee of Management in writing.

5. No person shall put in any of the Reserves any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the Committee of Management in writing.

6. No person shall engage in any game or sports in any of the Reserves on Sundays.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in any of the Reserves or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein, which may be enclosed for plantations of trees and shrubs.

9. No person or persons shall conduct, hold, or cause to be held or conducted, any political, religious, or other gathering or meeting of persons in any of the Reserves, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall speak, lecture, address, or harangue upon any political, religious, or other subject, nor shall any person play upon any instrument or make any unseemly noise in any of the Reserves, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES, KNOWN AS THE "BEACH RESERVE," IN THE CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

THE Council of the Town of Warrnambool (now City of Warrnambool), the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public purposes, in the city of Warrnambool, known as the "Beach Reserve," having framed the following additional Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance with the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person or persons shall conduct, hold, or cause to be held or conducted any political, religious, or other gathering or meeting of persons in the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

2. No person shall speak, lecture, address, or harangue upon any political, religious, or other subject, nor shall any person play upon any instrument or make any unseemly noise in the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

Every person offending against either of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not

more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR A BOTANIC GARDEN IN THE BOROUGH OF PORT FAIRY.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915 it is enacted that in the case of any land which, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale, permanently, for any public purpose whatsoever, or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the said Act, and has vested such land in trustees, or jointly in the Board and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any of such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section one (1) of the first-mentioned section. And whereas under and by virtue of a Crown grant dated the 18th October, 1875, the reserve for a Botanic Garden, in the borough of Port Fairy, became vested in the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Port Fairy. Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Port Fairy do hereby make the Regulations following in respect of the said reserve (hereinafter called the Garden):—

REGULATIONS.

The Garden shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Garden may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Garden.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Garden who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Garden, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in fire-places provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Garden, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Garden; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Garden any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Garden, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Garden any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, with the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Garden, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

8. No person shall perform in any band of music, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Garden without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Garden.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Garden, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Garden.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Garden on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the

Trustees may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Trustees in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Garden, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK, KNOWN AS "STUDLEY PARK," IN THE TOWN OF KEW.

WHEREAS by section 182 of the *Land Act* 1915, it is enacted that in the case of any land which, under the provisions of any Act relating to Crown lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section 10 of the said Act or the corresponding section of any repealed Act, and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section one (1) of the first-mentioned section. And whereas under and by virtue of a Crown Grant dated 17th May, 1876, the land known as Studley Park, in the town of Kew, became vested in the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough (now Town) of Kew. And whereas under the powers conferred by section 183 of the *Land Act* 1915, the Governor in Council has duly appointed a Committee of Management for Studley Park. Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Kew, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the said Act, do hereby make the regulations following for the regulation of Studley Park.

1. In the construction of these regulations the expression "the Park" means and includes any part of Studley Park.

The expression "the Committee of Management" means the said Committee of Management so appointed by the Governor in Council.

The expression "unauthorized person" means any person other than a person for the time being authorized in writing by, or an officer of, or a person or a servant of a person employed by the Committee of Management of the said Park in or about any work in connexion with laying out, planting, or maintaining the said Park.

2. No unauthorized person shall do any of the following acts in the said Park, that is to say:—

1. Cut, pluck, injure, take away, or destroy any tree, bush, or flower growing therein.
2. Dig, cut, or remove any sod, turf, loam, sand, gravel, or other substance thereon or therefrom.
3. Light any fire without the permission of the Committee of Management or carelessly or negligently do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.
4. Wilfully or negligently deposit or leave therein on any part thereof any rubbish, bricks, manure, timber, or other substance or material whatsoever.
5. Bleach or place out to dry any article or thing.
6. Beat carpets.
7. Catch or trap any bird, or lay or place any trap for the taking of birds or take any bird's egg or nest, or shoot or chase or disturb any game or other animal.

8. Cause or suffer any horse, pony, mule, ass, bull, ox, cow, calf, heifer, steer, sheep, lamb, goat, hog, or sow belonging to him or in his charge, to enter or go therein unless thereunto authorized by the said Committee of Management.
9. Encamp thereon or erect or place therein any booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, chair, or seat (other than a camp stool or other portable chair or seat), or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or make any enclosure of any part thereof.
10. Negligently or wilfully injure, deface, or remove any seat, notice, or notice board, chair, railing, fence, barrier, or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed therein by or by the authority of the Committee of Management.
11. Post or paint any bill, placards, or notice therein or on any fence, erection, or tree therein.
12. Paint, write, cut, carve, or in any manner inscribe letter, figures, or marks upon or otherwise disfigure any rock, tree, or any wall or fence or other structure in the said Park.
13. Drive any vehicle save along any stoned, metalled, gravelled, or otherwise defined road.
14. Break in any horse or exercise any horse or ride any horse, pony, donkey, or other animal in races, or in a manner likely to endanger the safety or comfort of persons lawfully using the Park.
15. Brawl, fight, use indecent language, or act in an indecent, disorderly, or offensive manner, or sell, distribute, or exhibit any indecent or infamous book, picture, or representation to the obstruction, annoyance, or danger or persons resorting to the Park.
16. Fire or discharge any firearm or throw or discharge any missile.
17. Climb any tree therein.
18. Sell or let for hire any article or distribute any bill or like thing, or place any chair or seat for hire without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
19. Solicit or gather money or other thing except within the limits of any site upon which public meetings are allowed to be held, or solicit or gather money on any such site, except when such soliciting or gathering is made in connexion with any special lecture or sermon at a public meeting held in good faith in furtherance of some public object, not being for the personal benefit of any individual.
20. Deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon, or address of any kind, or sing any sacred song or enter into any public discussion or hold or cause to take part in any public assemblage, except between morning and sunset, and on the site or sites (if any) approved by the Committee of Management and defined by notice boards.
21. Play or make sounds on any musical instrument without the consent of the Committee of Management under the hand of its secretary.
22. Throw or place in any pond or water in the Park any earth, wood, glass, crockery, metal, paper, or other rubbish or refuse or any deleterious, noxious, offensive or disfiguring substance or thing, or do anything to destroy or injure any fish in any such pond or water.
23. Bathe or wash or wash clothes or other articles or fish in, any pond or water in the Park except under such conditions, in such places, at such times and in such manner as the Committee of Management may from time to time prescribe.
24. Wilfully interfere with or obstruct the authorized user of the Park or wilfully obstruct any officer of the Committee of Management in the execution of his duty or in the proper execution of any work, in connexion with the laying out, planting, improvement or maintenance of the Park.
25. Do, aid in, or abet any act or thing which may not in these regulations be specifically mentioned and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Park, or to interfere with the use thereof by the public for the purposes of exercise and recreation.
3. Whereby a notice or notices which shall be conspicuously exhibited in the Park, the Committee of Management shall from time to time set apart any portion of the Park for any game or athletic sport or generally for the assemblage of persons for any purpose, no person shall on any portion of the Park so set apart as aforesaid:—
- (a) Drive, ride, or pass over the ground with any vehicle or upon horseback.
 - (b) Drive or ride among or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled for any of the purposes aforesaid.
 - (c) Take part in such game or assemblage as aforesaid except at such times and under such regulations as the Committee of Management may from time to time prescribe.
 - (d) Obstruct, interfere with, or annoy any person who is taking part or has made preparation to take part in, or is lawfully present at any gathering for any of the purposes aforesaid.
 - (e) Place any chair, seat, bandstand, or other movable erection in such portion of the Park without the consent of the Committee of Management under the hand of its secretary.
 - (f) Deliver or take part in the delivery of any address whatsoever, or remain with any assemblage of persons after having been informed by a magistrate and an officer of the Committee of Management that they anticipate that the continuance of such an address or assemblage should lead to scenes of disorder, and having been requested by them to desist and to leave the assemblage.
4. Every person who shall infringe any regulations for the management of the Park may be removed therefrom by any officer of the Committee of Management or by any constable in any one of the several cases hereinafter specified, that is to say:—
- (a) Where the infraction of the regulations is committed within the view of such officer or constable, and the name and residence of the person infringing the regulations is unknown to and cannot be readily ascertained by such officer or constable.
 - (b) Where the infraction of the regulations is committed within the view of such officer or constable and from the nature of such infraction or from any other fact of which such officer or constable may have knowledge, or of which he may be credibly informed, there may be reasonable grounds for belief that the continuance in the Park of the person infringing the regulations may result in another infraction of a regulation, or that the removal of such person from the Park is otherwise necessary as a security for the proper use and management thereof.
