ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say :—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and twelve thousand eight hundred and thirty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and eighteen and One thousand nine hundred and nineteen.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the tenth year of His Majesty's reign.

ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE AS TO THE TRUTH OR OTHERWISE OF A GENERAL COMPLAINT OF EXCESSIVE CHARGES FOR COMMODITIES.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order made on the 12th day of August, 1919, appointed—

Major-General the Honorable Sir JAMES WHITESIDE McCAY;
Brigadier-General ROBERT ERNEST WILLIAMS; and
Captain RICHARD CHARLES MILLS

to be a Royal Commission to inquire into and report—(a) as to the truth or otherwise of a general complaint that certain persons, firms, or bodies (whether corporate or unincorporate) concerned in or with the production, distribution, or sale of food, apparel, furniture and material used in connexion with or incidental to the feeding, clothing and housing of residents of Victoria, and the building and furnishing of their homes and business structures (imposing on their necessities or moved thereto by a greed of gain), charge customers for the commodities supplied or dealt in by them a price far in excess of the amount which might reasonably be claimed (after due allowance for abnormal conditions) having regard to the ratio of profit customarily asked or expected by fair traders or dealers in the case of a like article or commodity prior to the 31st day of July, 1914; and further (b) as to the increases in the prices of commodities, more particularly articles of food, clothing and other necessities of life, since the commencement of the recent war now happily ended, and if so; (c) the causes of any substantial increases generally, or in any particular case, or cases, and particularly whether the same are wholly, or in part, the product of factors operating generally throughout the world, or of factors of a local or special character; also (d) whether the rise in price of the necessities of life in Victoria has been compensated wholly or partially, by increased wages or remuneration; further (e) whether the standard or ratio of profit obtained by primary producers, manufacturers, merchants distributors, and retailers respectively has increased since the commencement of the war aforesaid, and what are the causes of any such increases, and whether any of such increases are justified or justifiable, and whether any such increases have been detrimental to the State as a whole; and, lastly (f) whether the increase in the price of primary products and of the raw materials of food, clothing and other necessities of life has been of advantage to the State of Victoria as a debtor country and an exporter of primary products, and whether decreases in the prices of such products would result favorably to the State in its present position.

And, further, His Excellency, with the advice aforesaid, has directed that Major-General the Honorable Sir James Whiteside McCay shall be the Chairman of the said Commission.

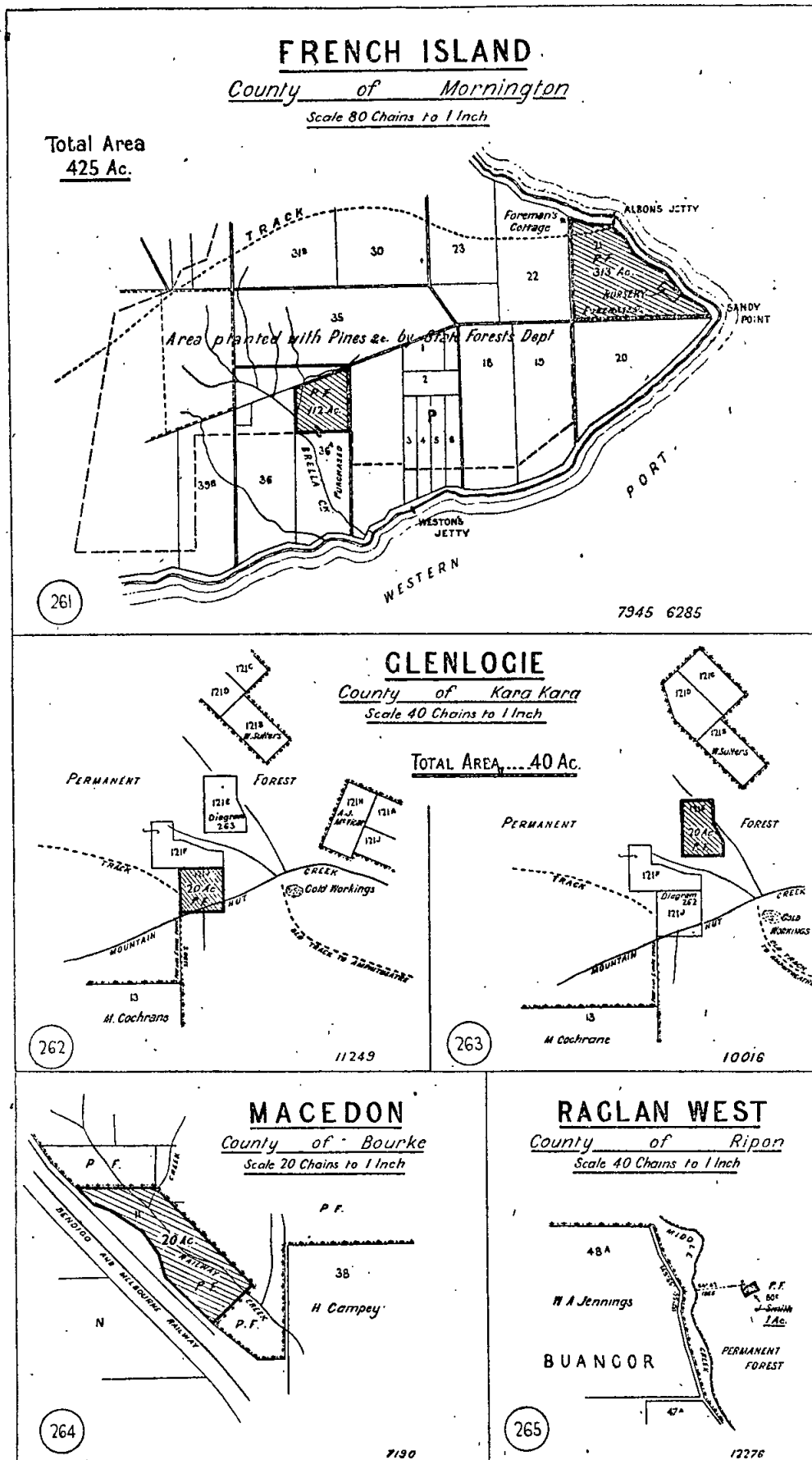

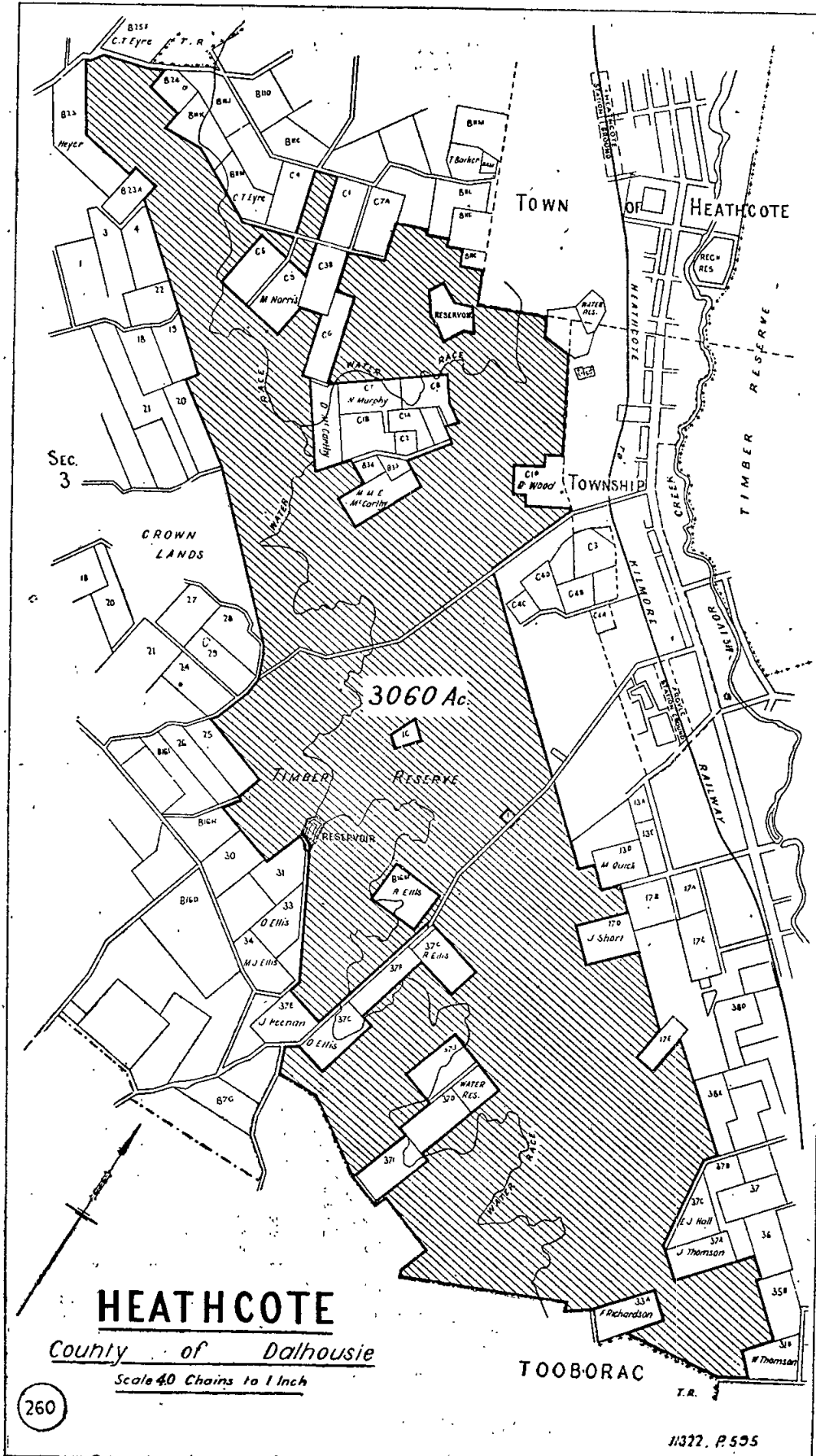

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

REGULATIONS FOR EXAMINATIONS FOR LAND SURVEYORS AND ISSUE OF LICENCES TO SURVEY.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 8th November, 1910, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—Applies only to candidates whose articles or other similar agreements were entered into prior to 1st March, 1910.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed under articles or other similar agreement in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

(d) Or shall have passed the examination for the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at the Melbourne University on examination in which a representative of the Surveyors Board acted as co-examiner, and shall have been at some time professionally employed in the field for a period of eighteen months on work satisfactory to the Board.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys:—

Form of Certificate for Presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as , in the practice of land surveying, for the period of , viz., from to , or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of years (of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

[Here describe the survey work on which C.D. was engaged.]

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Regulations.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and also a plan, field notes, and description of a survey of a town lot built upon, as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Act or Land Transfer Act.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

9. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

(c) Detail of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, and underground surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting by co-ordinates and from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Act, writing descriptions of boundaries.

Candidates may be required to effect surveys under supervision.

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling and contouring; grading; setting-out, and measurement of earthworks, including practical tests.

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

(f) Determination (including practical tests) of time, latitude, and azimuth; the use of ephemerides; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

(g) Plan-drawing, drawing of sections and contours, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Elementary physics, elementary geology, elementary forestry.

[The scope of the examination in elementary physics will be that covered by "Balfour Stewart's Elementary Physics," Fourth Edition, omitting chapters 8, 10, and 11, and the scope of the examination in elementary geology will be that covered by "Geikie's Class-book of Geology," Fourth Edition.]

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having passed the matriculation or senior examination at a University, or of having completed a course of the degree of Bachelor in Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers. Candidates holding satisfactory certificates or diplomas from any University recognised by an Australasian University or from recognised public technical schools may be exempted from working out papers in physics and geology, and will be credited with 60 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates admitted under clause 5(d) may be exempted from working out papers other than those prescribed in clause 10(c), and from such portion of the practical examination as the Board may determine.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate qualifying and passing the examination held under these regulations shall be entitled to a certificate that he is qualified for the position of a land surveyor in Victoria.

13. A surveyor applying to the Board for a certificate of competency without examination on the grounds of his holding a licence and certificate entitling him to practise in any of the

other Australian States or in the Dominion of New Zealand, shall produce such licence or certificate of competency from the Board of the State or Dominion in which he is licensed or authorized to survey, together with satisfactory evidence as to character; provided that, should such licence or certificate have been issued upon examination held prior to September, 1895, or in virtue of a certificate issued prior to September, 1895, he shall further produce a written recommendation or a certificate, dated not more than twelve months previously, from such Board; provided also, that any surveyor prevented by absence from the State or Dominion in which he obtained his licence or certificate from obtaining the recommendation of the Board of that State or Dominion, may be granted a certificate on passing such examination under these regulations as the Board may require. Each application shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

14. The Board may grant a certificate of competency or a letter of recommendation to any surveyor holding a Victorian certificate dated prior to September, 1895, and desiring to be registered in another State or the Dominion of New Zealand, either without examination or on such *visa voce* examination as in the opinion of the Board may be necessary. Application for such certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s.

REGISTRATION OF ARTICLES OF INDENTURE.

15. Articles of indenture or other similar agreement for the tuition of surveying by a qualified surveyor shall be forwarded to the secretary for registration within three months of the date of commencement of service thereunder. Applications for registration shall be accompanied by evidence of the pupil having passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto. The fee for each registration shall be Five shillings. Transfers of articles or agreements shall be registered within three months of such transfers.

16. On and after March, 1913 (except as hereinafter provided), no candidate shall be eligible for examination unless he shall have passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause; provided that, subject to his passing a special examination prescribed by the Board which shall include English, arithmetic, geometry, and algebra, a candidate who has not passed the University or other examination as set forth in the preceding clause may be admitted to examination if—

- (a) He failed at an examination held prior to March, 1913; or
- (b) He produces certificates of six years' satisfactory field service.

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

17. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality shire of Yarrawonga doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall

mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

(a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and

(b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

(a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and

(b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and

(c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and

(d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and

(e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

(a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

(a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

(a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole shire the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

(a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and

(b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

(a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and

(b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

(a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and

(b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the shire of Yarrawonga of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

DEFINITION OF MOUTH OF SAWTELL'S OR TOORADIN CREEK, TOORADIN, AND PROHIBITION OF NETTING NEAR SUCH MOUTH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation—

(1) Define what shall be deemed the mouth of Sawtell's or Tooradin Creek as a line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such creek enter Western Port Bay.

(2) Prohibit during the whole year the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the waters of Western Port Bay within a quarter of a mile of the mouth of Sawtell's or Tooradin Creek, as herein defined.

(NOTE.—As a guide to fishermen and others, boundary posts will be erected on the shore a quarter of a mile from the mouth of the creek.)

In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Acts* may think fit.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act* 1915 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognised.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the *Thistle Act* 1890 in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

Meat Supervision Act 1915.

CITY OF RICHMOND.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Meat Supervision Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Richmond make the following Regulations:—

1. All waggons, carts, trollies, baskets, trays, and containers of every kind used in the transport or carriage of meat shall be cleansed daily.

2. No person shall place or allow to stand upon any public footpath or pavement any meat or any package or other vessel or utensil used for the carriage of meat.

3. No person shall use for the carriage of meat any cart used for the carting of manure or any substance likely to cause injury to meat.

4. No butcher shall convey, deliver, or dispense, or cause to be conveyed, delivered, or dispensed, any meat unless such meat whilst being conveyed, delivered, or dispensed is kept covered and enclosed so as to protect the same from dust, flies, and other impurities.

5. No vessel, the substance, construction, or condition of which is likely to contaminate meat or depreciate its nutritive value, shall be used for the storing of meat.

6. All utensils used in connexion with the sale of meat shall be of such construction, substance, and in such condition as will preclude any contamination of the meat.

7. Every vehicle used for the transport of any meat shall be so constructed or so covered as to prevent access of flies and dust to the meat therein carried.

8. All meat for transit by rail shall be consigned in vehicles or in packages so constructed as to exclude dust and protect meat from flies.

9. Every vehicle used for delivering meat to retail customers shall be so constructed with due regard to ventilation as to prevent access of flies and dust to the interior, and shall at all times be kept closed except when in use for loading and unloading.

10. These Regulations shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

TOWN OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

By-Law No. 82.

A By-law of the town of Williamstown, made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 82, for Prohibiting the Keeping of Goats within the Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the town of Williamstown order as follows:—

The following portion of By-law No. 56, adopting Part VIII, Nuisances, &c. (a), Goats, is hereby repealed.

1. Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall once in every year register with the Municipal Clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of sixpence for every goat owned or kept by him within such municipal district, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person, without lawful excuse, offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

1. No person shall be permitted within the town of Williamstown to keep, or have in his care, control, or custody any goat.

2. Any person who shall by any act or default commit a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BOROUGH OF GEELONG WEST.

By-Law No. 35.

A By-law of the borough of Geelong West, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915* and numbered 35, for—

(a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections or hoardings;

(b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings;

(c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by, or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;

(d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done, or to be done, by any of the officers under such by-law and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Geelong West, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the Municipality.

3. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

4. No builder shall commence any building erection or structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without first delivering at the office of the

Surveyor a written notice of such intention before so commencing, and producing to the Surveyor properly prepared plans and a specification of such building erection structure addition or alteration including a block plan of the land showing the location of the proposed building together with a tracing or copy of the floor plans of such building erection structure addition or alteration and also details of dimensions sizes and qualities of all materials enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in the construction of same.

5. The original plans and specifications when approved shall be returned to the owner or his agent, but the tracing or copy of the plans and details of material shall be retained by the Surveyor.

6. No builder shall commence any building erection structure or any addition or alteration to any building erection or structure without having first obtained from the Surveyor a written permit for the commencement of same and for the carrying out of the necessary work appertaining to such building erection or structure or without first having paid to the Treasurer such sum as shall be demanded by him on account of fees in respect thereof.

7. The Surveyor and Inspector at all reasonable times during the progress and during the thirty days next after completion of any building structure erection or work affected by any of the provisions of this By-law may enter and inspect such building structure or work.

8. Every wooden building erection or structure shall be distant at least four feet six inches in the case of new subdivisions of land, and the case of blocks subdivided at the time of passing this By-law at least three feet distant from the side boundaries of the allotment on which it is built, except where such boundary is a public street and unless a parapet wall is erected in accordance with the provisions of the succeeding section.

9. Where the external wall on any building is erected on the boundary of the land, except where such boundary is a public street, on which the same stands or within three feet of such boundary then the external wall of such building shall be of brick or stone or concrete and shall be carried up to form a parapet twelve inches at least in height or such greater height not exceeding two feet as may be determined by the Surveyor above the roof or above the highest part of any flat or gutter as the case may be, and shall be of a thickness of eight and a half inches at the least.

10. Every party wall shall be of brick or stone or concrete and shall be carried up for a height of fifteen inches above the roof measured at right angles to the slope thereof or fifteen inches above the highest part of any flat or gutter as the case may be and of a thickness of eight and a half inches at the least.

11. Every building erection or structure transported or removed either in whole or in part into the municipal district or from one part of the municipal district to another part shall when completed comply with all the provisions of this By-law in regard to the erection of new buildings and such buildings either whole or in section shall not be brought into the municipal district until the same have been inspected and approved by the Surveyor.

12. In the construction of all wooden buildings except sheds vermin plates shall be used.

13. Stables of not more than two stalls and workshops and sheds of not more than 2½ squares may be erected abutting on right-of-ways, provided the external walls thereof are covered with good sound weatherboards or good galvanized iron. But, if the external walls of such stables, workshops or sheds are covered with palings, they shall be built at least 4 feet distant from any right-of-way. In all other respects such stables and workshops shall be subject to the limitations and provisions contained in this regulation as to wooden buildings generally.

- (a) Any such stable shall be 10 feet distant from the frontage of any road or street; and
- (b) Any such stable shall be 10 feet distant from the frontage of any other road or street.
- (c) Any such stable shall be 20 feet distant from any building used as a dwelling house on the same allotment or on any allotment adjoining.
- (d) Manure pits shall be suitably covered to the satisfaction of the Surveyor and comply with conditions (a) (b) and (c).
- (e) The Surveyor reserves to himself the right to restrict the erection and facing any stable shed or out-building at a distance from any road or street which in their opinion is calculated to depreciate the frontages as residential or business sites.

14. No closet or urinal shall be erected or remain in front of any dwelling or building facing a public highway or at a less distance than 10 feet from any street or from the door or window of any dwelling or at a less distance than two feet from the boundary of land not in the same occupation unless the wall on the boundary be built of brick or stone but such closets or urinals may be built abutting on any lane of a less width than sixteen feet. This clause shall not apply to any closet or urinal connected to an underground sewerage system.

15. Except with the consent of the Surveyor no alteration shall be made in any building in such manner that when so altered it will by reason of such alteration not be in conformity with the provisions of this By-law relating to new buildings.

16. Every addition to or alteration of a building and any other work made or done for any purpose in to or upon a building (except that of necessary repairs not affecting the construction of any external cross or party wall) shall so far as regards such additions or alteration of other work be subject to the determination of the Council.

17. Every person who builds or erects a new building shall so construct every room in the lowest story having a boarded floor that there shall be for the purpose of ventilation between the under-side of every floor bearer on which such floor is laid and the upper surface of the asphalt or concrete with which the ground surface or site of the building is covered a clear space of 2 inches at the least in every part and not less than 4 inches when the site is not concreted or asphalted and shall cause such space to be thoroughly ventilated by means of suitable and sufficient airbricks or by some other effectual method so arranged as to cause thorough current of air to pass beneath the flooring.

18. No person shall erect build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only except in conformity with the following:—

- (a) The site or curtilage of such dwelling house shall have a superficial area of at least 4,800 feet and have a frontage of not less than 40 lineal feet to a street or road and that except in the case of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than two-fifths of the superficial area of such site.
- (b) The dwelling house and other buildings to be erected built or constructed upon any site or curtilage included in any subdivision of land made with the approval of the Council prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and not provided for in sub-clause (a) shall except in the cases of corner-sites cover not more than one-half of the superficial area of such site or curtilage fronting a street or road.
- (c) The dwelling house and other buildings to be erected built or constructed upon any corner site or curtilage fronting to two streets or roads shall cover not more than one-half of the superficial area of such site or curtilage.

19. In every building used or intended to be used as a dwelling-house the minimum size of any living room shall be 100 square feet in plan and no such room shall be less than eight feet in width. No building intended to be used as a dwelling-house will be registered or permitted to be built unless it contains at least two rooms each containing 100 square feet and unless the design and construction of same be approved by the Council. Always provided that the Council shall not arbitrarily withhold its approval of such design and construction where same in their opinion conforms with the average type of modern built dwelling in the immediate vicinity of such tenement.

20. Every habitable room except rooms wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least ten feet in height from the floor to the ceiling except where the floor space of the room is 200 square feet or more when the height shall be not less than nine feet. Or in cases where the roof is an inclined one the average height from the floor to ceiling shall be not less than nine feet. Every habitable room wholly or partly in the roof shall be at least eight feet in height throughout not less than one-half the area of the floor.

21. Every habitable room shall have one or more windows opening directly into the external air with a total superficies clear of the sash frames free from any obstruction to light equal to at least one-tenth of the floor area of the room and so constructed that a portion equal to at least one-twentieth of such floor area can be opened, but in no case shall a window be less than 5 feet 2 inches x 2 feet 10 inches. But a room having no external wall or a room constructed wholly or partly in the roof may be lighted through the roof by a doormer window with a total superficies clear of such frames free from any obstruction to the light equal to at least one-twelfth of the floor area of the room, and so constructed that a portion of such window equal to at least one-thirtieth of such floor area can be opened.

22. Every habitable room shall have at least 2 vents 9 inches by 3 inches of approved design.

23. In all new houses and in houses which are being sewered provision shall be made for a suitable bath-room.

24. When it is made known to the Council that any building or structure is in a ruinous or dangerous state the Council may require a survey of such building or structure to be made by the Surveyor who shall have power to enter any premises for the purpose of making such survey, and if the Surveyor reports that such building or structure is in a ruinous or dangerous state the Council may cause the same to be shored up or otherwise secured to the satisfaction of the Surveyor and shall cause a notice in writing to be served on the owner of such building or structure requiring such owner forthwith

to take down secure or repair such building or structure as the case in the opinion of the Borough Surveyor may require.

25. If such owner does not begin to take down repair or secure such building or structure within seven days after service of such notice and complete such taking down repairs or securing as speedily as the nature of the case will admit the Council may with all convenient speed cause all or so much of the building or structure as is in a ruinous or dangerous condition to be taken down repaired or otherwise secured in such manner as may be requisite, and may recover from the owner in any court of competent jurisdiction the cost incurred in so doing.

26. No person shall erect or cause to be erected any portico or verandah over the footpath of any street without first obtaining the consent of the Council and such portico or verandah shall be of the shape figure dimensions and material adopted by the Council but the lowest part of the frieze or rail of such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than nine feet above the level of the outer edge of the footway.

27. No person shall erect build or construct or alter or add to or cause to be erected built or constructed or altered or added to any hoarding signboard or erection for advertising purposes without first obtaining the consent of the Council or Surveyor and unless such hoarding signboard or erection is erected built or constructed altered or added to in accordance with a plan and specification prepared by such person and previously approved of by the Surveyor. The Surveyor shall have power to determine the distance from the building line at which any hoarding shall be built but such distance shall not be greater than the height of such hoarding.

28. *Brick Area.* No shop residence tenement stable shed privy or other structure except in cases of additions at the rear of existing wooden buildings shall be erected in wood nor other inflammable material, nor in corrugated or plain iron within the area herein specified which shall be known as the brick area and which is bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point in the south side of Waratah-street at a point 50 feet distant west of Pakington-street and bounded on the north by Waratah-street being a line bearing east 50 feet to Pakington-street; thence by a line approximately 66 feet bearing north-easterly across Pakington-street; thence bounded on the north by Wellington-street being a line bearing east 50 feet; thence on the east by a line parallel to and distant 50 feet from Pakington-street, bearing south to Autumn-street; thence on the south by Autumn-street being a line bearing west 50 feet to Pakington street; thence by a line bearing further north-westerly approximately 66 feet across Pakington-street; thence on the south by Upper Autumn-street being a line bearing westerly 50 feet; thence on the west by a line parallel to and distant 50 feet from Pakington-street bearing north to Waratah-street home to the commencing point. The walls of all buildings erected within the above-described brick area shall be of brick stone reinforced concrete or other approved fire-resisting material or composition, and shall not be less than 8½ inches in thickness. Where such walls are intended to carry a second story wall above such lower wall shall be not less than 13½ inches in thickness.

29. Where subsequent to the coming into force of this By-law any building or erection has been partly or wholly erected built or constructed contrary to and in violation of the provisions of this By-law—

- (a) The Council may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building or erection fourteen days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the Municipal Clerk on behalf of the Council) to bring such building or erection into conformity with the said provisions or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building or erection; and
- (b) if default is made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty it shall be lawful for the Council through its Surveyor to enter upon such building or erection and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen and to demolish and pull down the said building or erection or any part or parts thereof and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purposes and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place; and if the Council in their discretion think fit the Council may sell the same in such manner as the Council think fit; and
- (c) in addition to any penalties imposed by this By-law all costs and expenses incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law or in the execution of work directed by the same to be executed by any person and not executed by him, shall be paid by the person committing such breach or failing to execute such work and may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction; or may be deducted by the Council from any moneys received by it under the provisions of the two next preceding sub-clauses; and

(d) the Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale on application being made by the person entitled thereto.

30. Fees payable for permits under this By-law shall be:—

- (a) For ordinary dwelling houses, 2s. 6d. for each living room;
- (b) For buildings in the nature of shops sheds or ware-houses, 2s. 6d. for each square or part thereof.
- (c) Square shall mean the space of one hundred square feet of floor room.
- (d) In any case the minimum fee shall be not less than Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

31. Any person who is guilty of any wilful or negligent act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council.

SHIRE OF WERRIBEE.

By-LAW No. 12.

A By-law of the shire of Werribee, made under Section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 12, for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of structures, erections, or hoardings.
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, structures, erections, or hoardings.
- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, structures, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, and to sell the material and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expense of pulling down and removing such buildings, structures, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for, or any act done, or to be done, by any of the officers of the Council under such By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Werribee order as follows:—

(1) This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the portion of the shire of Werribee as herein specified:—

- (a) Commencing at the north-west corner of lot 6, section XIII, parish of Cut-Paw-Paw; thence easterly along Sunbury-street to the north-east corner of lot 5, section XIII; thence south to Irving-street; thence along Irving-street to its intersection with the extension of Williamstown-road at a point, being the boundary of the shire of Werribee and the city of Footscray; thence south along Williamstown-road to Stony Creek; thence north-westerly along Stony Creek to the north-east corner of lot C, section 9; thence by a line direct south to Port Phillip Bay; thence westerly along the foreshore to Kororoit Creek; thence along Kororoit Creek to the Geelong-Melbourne railway line; thence easterly along the railway line to the south-west corner of lot B, section 3; thence north by the west boundary of lot B and lot C to the north-west corner of lot C; thence easterly by the north boundary of lot C to the south-east corner of lot B, section 6; thence northerly to the north-east corner of lot B, section 9; thence westerly along Reid-street to the south-west corner of the Cemetery; thence north to the commencing point.
- (b) The whole of sections 8 and 9, parish of Truganina.
- (c) The whole of the Central Riding of the shire of Werribee.

(2) This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

(3) In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Approved" means approved by the Surveyor.

"Surveyor" means the Building Surveyor or other proper official for the time being of the shire of Werribee.

"Secretary" means the Clerk for the time being of the Municipality of Werribee.

"Tent" shall mean any structure or erection composed of canvas, or partly of canvas or wood, or partly of canvas and partly of iron, or partly of canvas and partly of any other material, and, whether floored or not, used for living or sleeping accommodation, or used for temporary living or sleeping accommodation.

(4) No person shall erect or commence to erect any tent or tents upon any vacant allotment or other land within any portion of the shire of Werribee to which this By-law applies without first delivering at the office of the Surveyor, Shire Hall, Werribee, a written notice of such intention, and obtaining from the Surveyor a written permit for the erection of such tent or tents, and without having paid to the Surveyor the fees in respect thereof, and set out in this By-law, and no tent shall be erected except under the following conditions:—

- (a) No tent shall be erected at a distance nearer than 20 feet from any road or street, and whether such road or street is under the control of the Council or not, or at a less distance than 15 feet from the side boundaries of the land upon which such tent or tents is to be erected.
- (b) No tent shall be erected unless and until proper and sufficient provision has been made to the satisfaction of the Surveyor for all garbage removal and sanitary attendance, and such provision as the Surveyor may direct as to temporary brick or stone or iron fireplace or fireplaces for the safe use of fire.
- (c) No fireplace shall be permitted, nor shall such fire be lighted by the owner or occupier of any tent or tents except in such proper fireplace.

(d) No tent or tents shall be allowed to remain upon any land within the areas to which this By-law applies for a period of more than three months without the written consent of the Council.

(e) No tent shall be erected unless and until a proper closet has been provided and approved by the Surveyor. The closet shall be well lighted and ventilated, and the orifice in the closet seat must be at least 3½ inches behind the riser, the space under the seat must not allow of a larger interval than 1½ inches between the pan and the seat, and it must be so fitted with stops or bars that the pan may be easily placed in its proper position. The floor of the closet, including that of the middenstead, must be made of approved material, such as asphalt, concrete, &c., and be at least 3 inches above the adjoining ground level. The space between the seat must be provided with an air grating in the lowermost part of an external wall. The clear airway of the inlets, of the outlets, and of the perforators of the closet must be provided at the rate of 24 inches per closet seat. The closet must be placed in a position approved by the Surveyor.

(5) When it is made known to the Council or the Surveyor that any building, erection, or structure is in an insanitary condition, ruinous, or dangerous state, the Council shall cause an inspection to be made by the Surveyor of such building, structure, or erection, and the Surveyor shall have power to enter any premises for the purpose of making such inspection. If the Surveyor reports that the building, erection, or structure is in an insanitary condition, ruinous, or dangerous state, the Council may cause the same to be put in a proper state of repair, and in a proper sanitary condition, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall cause a notice, in writing, to be served on the owner of such building, erection, or structure, requiring such owner forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such building, erection, or hoarding, or structure as the Council may require.

If such owner does not begin to take down, or repair, or secure such building, erection, or structure within three (3) days after service of such notice, and complete such taking down, repairs, or securing as speedily as the nature of the case will admit, the Council may, with all convenient speed, cause all, or so much of the building, erection, or structure as is in an insanitary condition, ruinous, or dangerous state to be taken down, repaired, or otherwise secured in such manner as may be requisite, and may recover from the owner in any Court of competent jurisdiction the cost incurred in so doing.

(6) In case of any building, erection, or structure, or construction, contrary to this By-law, either in whole or part—

(a) The Council may give to the owner or builder, or leave on the site of such building, erection, or structure fourteen days' notice, in writing (which notice may be signed by the Municipal Clerk on behalf of the Council), to bring the same in conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, erection, or structure; and

(b) If default is made in complying with such notice, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council, through its Surveyor, to, with a sufficient number of men, demolish and pull down the said building, erection, or structure, or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act which may be necessary for the purpose, and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and the Council, in its discretion, may sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit.

(c) All expenses incurred by the Council or its Surveyor in demolishing and pulling down the said buildings, erections, or structures, or any part or parts thereof, or in removing the materials thereof, and selling the same, and in doing such other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the owner or builder thereof, may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale.

(d) The Council shall pay over any surplus arising from such sale, on application being made and approved by the Council, to the person entitled thereto; and

(e) If any owner disagrees with the decision of the Council or Surveyor to any matter or things arising under this By-law, he may, on giving notice in writing thereof to the Council, and paying to the Shire Secretary, or any other officer of the Council, the sum of Three pounds three shillings, have the question referred to an architect of known ability appointed by the Council, and one appointed by the Governor in Council, at the cost of such owner, and the said architects, in case of disagreement, may call in a third architect of known ability, also at the cost of such owner (the fees for the engagement of such architects to be paid by the owner of the building, erection, or structure in dispute to the Municipal Clerk before such architects proceed with their work), and the decision of any two of such architects to be conclusive, final, and binding on all parties.

(f) No award is to be made by the said architects in any way making the Council liable for any costs or charges.

(7) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and, if the offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after written notice of the offence from the Council.

(8) This By-law shall not apply to any building, erection, or structure of the Government of the Commonwealth, the Government of the State of Victoria, or the shire of Werribee.

(9) Fees to be paid.—For each tent, for every month, or part of a month, a fee of 5s.

For inspecting any building, erection, or structure, of which the Council is advised to be in an insanitary condition or ruinous or dangerous state, and preparing necessary notices, as provided by this By-law, to be given, a fee of Forty-two shillings.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 26th day of May, 1919, and confirmed on the 25th day of July, 1919.

QUEEN VICTORIA HOSPITAL.

THE following alterations of By-laws were made by the committee and confirmed at a special meeting of the contributors to the Queen Victoria Hospital, held at the Town Hall, Melbourne, on Wednesday, 30th July, 1919:

By-laws 6 to 19 are struck out, and in lieu thereof the following By-laws are inserted:—

PRIVILEGES OF CONTRIBUTORS AND LIFE GOVERNORS.

6. Every contributor of £1 and upwards in one donation not thereby becoming a life governor shall for the period of twelve months following the date of such donation have the privileges following, that is to say:—In respect of a donation of £1, the right to recommend four out-patients and to have one vote at all meetings of contributors. In respect of a donation of £2, the right to recommend four out-patients and one in-patient, and to have one vote at meetings of contributors. In respect of a donation of £5, the right to recommend seven out-patients and two in-patients and to have two votes at meetings of contributors. In respect of a donation of £10, the right to recommend ten out-patients and three in-patients and to have three votes at meetings of contributors.

7. Every life governor shall during life have the privileges following, that is to say:—Where the contribution of such life governor shall have amounted to £20 the right to recommend four out-patients and one in-patient in each year, and to have one vote at meetings of contributors. Where such contribution shall have amounted to £50, the right to recommend seven out-patients and two in-patients in each year and to have two votes at meetings of contributors; and where such contribution shall have amounted to £100, the right to recommend ten out-patients and three in-patients in each year and to have three votes at meetings of contributors.

8. Every commemoration member nominated by a local committee of the Queen's Shilling Fund shall have for life the right to recommend four out-patients in each year.

9. Any person (not being a paid servant of the hospital) who shall collect and pay to the hospital in any one year in one sum collections to the amount of £20 or upwards, no portion of which shall be annual subscriptions, may be appointed a life governor with all the privileges of contributor of £20 in one donation.

10. Any committee, society, association, or collecting organization not being a body formed to collect and distribute public charitable donations hereafter collecting for or donating to the funds of the hospital £20 or upwards in one sum shall be entitled in each year in which such collections or donations shall be made, to nominate one individual in respect of every £20 so collected or donated who shall be appointed a life governor with all the privileges of a contributor of £20 in one donation.

11. When a public or corporate body is a contributor to any of the amounts hereinbefore specified, it shall be entitled to nominate some one person who shall have and be entitled to all the privileges attached to such contribution. In the absence of any nomination the mayor, or president, or chairman of any public body, or the president, chairman, or any director of any corporate body may exercise any of the said privileges.

12. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through some one member of such firm.

13. Persons who shall have conferred signal benefit on the hospital irrespective of subscription may, on the recommendation of the committee, be elected life governors at any general meeting of contributors, and shall enjoy the same privileges as contributors of £20.

14. Any contributor being absent from the State of Victoria may by power of attorney exercise all the privileges to which he or she would be entitled if personally present, but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the secretary of the hospital for record at least four days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

15. The executor or executrix first named in any will, or the administrator or administratrix, or the trustee, or one of the trustees, of any estate through whom the hospital shall receive any sum exceeding £5, or any person nominated in writing by him or her, may be granted all the privileges of a contributor of one-fourth of the sum contributed.

16. All subscriptions shall be payable in advance. Upon the expiration of the period for which the last subscription shall have been paid the individual shall cease to be a contributor.

17. No contributor shall be entitled to a vote at any general or special meeting within three months from the date of payment of his first contribution.

By-law 22 is struck out, and in lieu thereof the following is to be By-law 22:—

22. Honorary office-bearers shall be appointed annually by the committee from their own number or otherwise at the first meeting of the committee after each annual meeting, when all such office-bearers shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

By-law 25 is amended by inserting in the fifth line after the word "proceedings" the following words:—"and for conducting any ballot under clause 29."

By-law 29 is amended by inserting in the fourth line after the words "shall be by ballot," the following words:—"If the number of candidates is in excess of the number of vacancies to be filled."

By-law 33 is amended by deleting from the second line the words "by two contributors" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "signed by two contributors and by the person nominated." 4046
