Marine Act 1915.

AMENDMENT OF "THE PASSENGER (SAILING AND MOTOR) BOAT REGULATIONS 1915."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1915*, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

1. This Regulation shall form portion of *The Passenger (Sailing and Motor) Boat Regulations 1915*, made by the Board on the 27th day of August, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of September, 1915 (hereinafter called the "Principal Regulations"), and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. After clause 42 of the Principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following additional clause:—

"43. *Persons on Boat Awnings Prohibited*—No owner or person in charge of any licensed boat shall when such boat has on board any passenger or passengers allow any person whomsoever to resort or ascend to or be carried on the top of any awning or other like superstructure not passed as a place to be used as a resort for passengers when the boat was licensed with which any such boat may be furnished or fitted."

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this twenty-eighth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

By-LAW No. 150.

A By-law for preventing the deposit of offensive substances upon the streets or lanes of the city and for requiring the occupiers of houses or premises within the city to provide proper receptacles for the temporary deposit of house scraps and refuse.

WHEREAS By-laws have from time to time been made by the Council of the said city for preventing the deposit of offensive substances and refuse upon the footways and streets of the said city and for requiring the occupiers of houses to provide receptacles for the temporary deposit of such substances And whereas it is desirable to add to amend and consolidate such By-laws Now the said Council doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1915* (and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf) order as follows:—

1. By-laws Nos. 73 and 117 of the Council of the said city are hereby repealed Provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any Act or omission in contravention of such By-laws or either of them prior to the commencement of this By-law.

2. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires "city" means the city of Melbourne.

"Officer of Health" means the Officer of Health of the city. "House" includes any portion of a house or building.

"Footway" includes every footpath lane thoroughfare or other public place within the city habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicular traffic.

"Street" includes every highway road carriage-way lane thoroughfare or other public place within the city other than a footway.

3. No foul or offensive smelling water or other fluid and no garbage house sweepings or other refuse matter or thing shall be pumped emptied swept thrown or otherwise discharged into or upon any water channel footway or street whether public or private.

4. No garbage house sweepings or other refuse shall be scattered upon or within the yard or curtilage of any house or heaped or otherwise deposited therein save in one or more receptacle or receptacles of the kind hereinafter specified.

5. The occupier of every house shall provide and keep in such house or in the part occupied by him a receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified or so many of such receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house scraps and house and yard refuse from such premises and shall cause all such house scraps and house and yard refuse to be placed in such receptacle or receptacles with the least possible delay but no sand or stone shall be placed in such receptacles.

6. The said receptacles shall be kept on the premises so as to be conveniently accessible to the persons employed by the Council for the cleansing of streets and the removal of refuse therefrom and from the houses in or adjacent to such streets.

7. The occupier of every hotel restaurant eating or other house where food is consumed shall cause all refuse and scraps of foodstuffs intended to be sold or used as pigs' or fowls' food or otherwise and all other refuse subject to putrefaction to be placed with the least possible delay in a separate receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified or in so many of such receptacles as may be necessary for the purpose and such receptacle or receptacles shall be kept on the premises or in such other place as the Officer of Health may from time to time direct in writing and shall be removed at the expense in all things of such occupier each day before the hour of 8 o'clock in the forenoon to a place outside the city or to such place or places within the city as the Officer of Health shall approve of in writing.

8. Every such receptacle whether for the deposit of house refuse or foodstuffs shall be of a size not exceeding three cubic feet in content and shall be constructed of galvanized iron properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight and shall be maintained in good order and condition and each receptacle shall be fitted with handles for convenience of moving and emptying same and also with a close-fitting metal cover of a construction approved of by the City Engineer.

9. Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than 5s.

This By-law was made and passed by the Council of the City at the meeting of the said Council held on the 16th day of June, 1919.

DIVISION 14 OF PART V. WITH REGARD TO COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING MADE APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS OF COUNCILLORS OF THE SHIRE OF NUMURKAH UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 148 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1915 (No. 2686) AS AMENDED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1918 (No. 2881).

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality shire of Numurkah, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2881), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the Riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each Riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole shire the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers

as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

(12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (6) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4; and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the shire of Numurkah of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating

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to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 6 of the *Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act 1917* (8 Geo. V. No. 2916) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, set apart any area of Crown land for the purpose of being disposed of under the said Act to discharged soldiers in the manner set out in the said Act, and may amend or revoke any such Order: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Order set apart for discharged soldiers the lands comprised in the Schedules hereunder:—

1. SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the shire of Nunawading, made under the provisions of section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 31, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the shire of Nunawading.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. No person shall remove or transport or cause to be removed or transported into any part of the shire of Nunawading or from any one part of the shire to another part of the same, any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

2. No building or erection shall be removed into the shire or from any one part of the shire to another unless the owner or person carrying out the removal shall first obtain written permission from the Council so to do and shall in applying for such permission give to the Council, its secretary or building surveyor, not less than ten clear days' notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building and shall accompanying such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.
- (b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.
- (c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building any alterations or additions thereto (and a tracing copy of such plan to be retained by the Council).
- (d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of the existing building and of the alterations and additions (if any) which it is intended to make when the building is re-erected.
- (e) Satisfactory evidence that such house has not been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation.
- (f) Such further particulars in writing regarding the same as shall be sufficient to enable the Council or its building surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law and the Building By-laws and Regulations of the shire applicable thereto are complied with.

3. No building or erection that has been condemned as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation, shall be removed or re-erected within the shire.

4. No building or erection which is intended to be used as a dwelling-house in which any case of infectious or contagious disease has occurred during the preceding three months shall be removed into or re-erected within the shire, unless the same has been thoroughly fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of some duly qualified medical practitioner or of the health inspector of any municipal council.

5. Every building or erection intended or adapted to be used as a dwelling-house which shall be removed and re-erected within the shire, shall when completed comply with all the provisions of By-law No. 28, or other Building By-laws or Regulations of the shire for the time being, in the same manner as if it were a building or erection originally built, constructed or erected in the part of the shire to which it is removed and re-erected. Such building shall be properly framed, and shall comply with the following conditions as to spacing and scantlings of timbers, &c.:—

- (a) Stumps to be not less than 4 in. x 4 in. redgum or jarrah spaced to 4 ft. centres and fixed on 8 in. x 8 in. x 2 in. sole plates.
- (b) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 in. x 1½ in. spaced not more than 18 in. apart centre to centre and properly braced.
- (c) Rafters not less than 4 in. x 1½ in. spaced 3 ft. centre to centre in the case of iron roofs, and 18 in. centre to centre in the case of slate, tile or other similar roofs, securely braced with purlins and collar ties.
 Floor joists to be not less than 4 in. x 2 in. spaced 18 in. apart centre to centre on 4 in. x 3 in. bearers spaced 6 ft. apart.
- (d) Vermin plates to be provided to all walls.
- (e) Floors to be fixed level and to be in no part less than 12 in. above the surface of the ground.
- (f) Part of all windows to be made to open and sufficient ventilation to be provided in each room.
- (g) All timber and material which in the opinion of the building surveyor is unsound or defective shall be removed and replaced with sound material.

6. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the alteration of the position of any building within the boundaries of the land on which the same stands provided that in the progress of such removal the building be not taken on to any street, road or public place.

7. If the building surveyor shall certify in writing that any building or erection has been removed into or erected within the shire contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, or that any removed building, erection, or structure is in such a dilapidated, ruinous, or unsafe condition as to be dangerous to the public safety, the owners of such building, erection, or

structure, upon receiving from the Council, its secretary, or building surveyor a notice in writing requiring him to alter, repair, or remove or pull down such building, erection, or structure shall alter, repair, remove, or pull down such building, erection, or structure within the time limited by such notice. And if default shall be made in complying with such notice the Council may on the expiration of the time therein limited pull down or remove such building, erection, or structure, and may sell any of the materials thereof and apply the proceeds of such sale in reimbursing the costs and expenses of pulling down, removing, and selling such building, erection, or structure, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

8. The following fees shall be payable by the owner or person removing any building upon giving the notice mentioned in section 2 of this By-law:—

- (a) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove into the shire of Nunawading, whether the same is approved of or not but including the issue of a permit when the building is approved, £2.
- (b) For examining any building which it is proposed to remove from any one part of the shire to another whether the same is approved or not, 10s.; and for the issue of a permit for the removal when the building is approved, 10s. in addition.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the shire of Nunawading.

10. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

And if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty of not less than One pound per day and not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.

By-law No. 25 of the shire of Nunawading, for regulating and restraining the erection of removed wooden buildings in the said shire, shall be, and the same is hereby, repealed.
