**(3) AVAILABILITY OF TICKETS BETWEEN STATIONS IN VICTORIA AND STATIONS IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA, ALSO BROKEN HILL.**

**(A) Single Tickets.**—Ordinary single tickets will be available only by the through train on which the journey is commenced, or by the first connecting train when a change of train is necessary to reach the passenger's destination, and the journey cannot be broken except in the case of a journey which involves passing through a capital city, in which case the journey must be recommenced not later than seven days from the date of issue of the ticket.

**(B) Holiday Excursion Tickets.**—Holiday Excursion tickets will be available on the forward journey, and the journey may be broken, as prescribed in Clause (A) in respect of Ordinary Single tickets.

The Coupon attached to the Holiday Excursion Ticket issued on the forward journey must be exchanged for a single ticket on the date the return journey is commenced, which shall be within two months from the date of issue of the original ticket, and the single ticket issued in exchange for the coupon ticket will have the same availability as an Ordinary Single Ticket.

**(C) Tickets Issued from Victorian Stations to Mount Gambier and Intermediate Stations via Mount Gambier Border and to Pinnaroo via Pinnaroo Border.**—Tickets issued from Victorian stations to Mount Gambier and intermediate stations *via* Mount Gambier Border and to Pinnaroo *via* Pinnaroo Border are excepted from the conditions shown in Clauses (A) and (B) above, and shall have the same availability as tickets issued between stations in Victoria.

**(4) CONCESSION FARES BETWEEN STATIONS IN VICTORIA AND STATIONS IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA OTHER THAN BETWEEN STATIONS IN VICTORIA AND MOUNT GAMBIER AND INTERMEDIATE STATIONS VIA MOUNT GAMBIER BORDER AND TO PINNAROO VIA PINNAROO BORDER.**

**(A)** The concession fares granted to Athletic Bodies, &c., Delegates to Conferences, Competitors at Educational Competitions, Judges attending recognised Shows, Representatives of the Press, Oversea Pilots, Attendants on Racehorses, and Examiners of the Melbourne University shall be two-thirds of the ordinary single fare on either the forward or return journeys.

**(B)** The concession fares granted to Students on Vacation or enrolling at or leaving School shall be as under:—

Under 16 years of age.—Single tickets at one-third single fare.  
16 years and not exceeding 25 years.—Single tickets at one-half single fare.

**(5) ORDINARY RETURN TICKETS BETWEEN STATIONS IN VICTORIA AND STATIONS IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA.**

The issue of Ordinary Return Tickets between stations in Victoria and stations in South Australia other than between stations in Victoria and Mount Gambier and intermediate stations *via* Mount Gambier Border and to Pinnaroo *via* Pinnaroo Border is hereby abolished.

**(6) TRANSFER OF INTER-STATE PERIODICAL TICKETS.**

An additional charge of 5s. shall be imposed for arranging the transfer of an Inter-State Periodical Ticket at a point other than that of application, or when the periodical ticket is not available at the point of application, which necessitates advice being sent before such transfer can be effected.

**(7) SPECIAL THEATRICAL FARES.**

Special Theatrical Fares, Melbourne and Sydney and Melbourne and Adelaide.—A fare of 40s. first class single will be charged between Melbourne and Sydney, and a fare of 35s. first class single will be charged between Melbourne and Adelaide, to members of theatrical companies proceeding to fill theatrical engagements under the management of persons or firms who have entered into agreements with the Commissioners, embodying the following conditions:—

1. That each and every *bond fide* member of any, and all of the companies who are required to travel between Melbourne and Sydney or Melbourne and Adelaide, as the case may be, under engagement to them will travel by rail.
2. That the fare be applied to only *bond fide* members of companies proceeding to fill a theatrical engagement advertised under their management at either Melbourne, Sydney, or Adelaide, as the case may be.
3. That in the event of an equivalent to 200 tickets not having been purchased for the purpose aforesaid during the twelve months to be covered by the agreement, or during a shorter period should the agreement be terminated for any reasons as provided in Clause 4 hereunder, he or they will pay to the Commissioners a sum representing the difference between the said special fare and the ordinary theatrical fare in respect of the whole of the tickets issued at the said special fare.

4. That in the event of any breach of the conditions of the agreement, the Commissioners shall have the right to forthwith terminate the agreement, and to collect any moneys that may be due on account of any tickets that may have been issued otherwise than in accordance with the agreement, or in the circumstances prescribed in Clause 3.
5. That an approved bank guarantee for the sum of £100 be deposited with the Commissioners, to be held as security for the payment of any moneys that may be due to the Commissioners in respect of any tickets issued under the agreement and the due performance and the fulfilment of the conditions.
6. That certificates in the form prescribed shall be used for the purpose of obtaining tickets at the said reduced fare, and shall be signed only by them, or by some designated responsible member of their staff.

**(8) PARCELS RATES.**

**W**HEREAS by the *Education Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2644) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend Regulation XXI., as follows, that is to say:—

**REGULATION XXI.—SCHOLARSHIPS.**

Clause 2 is rescinded and the following substituted:—

2. (a) The eighty junior scholarships under clause 1 (a) above shall be divided proportionately between pupils of State Schools grouped for the purpose of the competitive examination as may be determined from time to time by the Director and approved by the Minister;

(b) Except in special cases determined by the Director and approved by the Minister, pupils attending State elementary schools situated within five miles of a central school or of a higher elementary class or of a higher elementary school or of a district high school shall, if they desire to compete for a junior scholarship under clause 1 above, be required to be examined in the subjects mentioned in clause 4 (b) below, of the second year of the common course in district high schools. The provisions of this sub-clause shall not, however, apply to pupils residing in the metropolitan or suburban area of Melbourne.

To clause 14 is added:—

(e) Except in special cases determined by the Director and approved by the Minister, pupils attending State elementary schools situated within five miles of a central school or of a higher elementary class or of a higher elementary school or of a district high school shall, if they desire to compete for a teaching scholarship under clause 12 above, be required to be examined in the subjects mentioned in clause 4 (b) above of the second year of the common course in district high schools. The provisions of this sub-clause shall not, however, apply to pupils residing in the metropolitan or suburban area of Melbourne.

The following clause is added:—

44. The Minister may remit the tuition fees in the cases of pupils of district high schools and technical schools who are holders of approved scholarships provided by individuals, firms, or public bodies.

The provisions of clauses 2 (b) and 14 (e) are not to take effect until the examination in December, 1921.

And the Honorable W. Hutchinson, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**H**IS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the city of Brighton, doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*

## COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

## (Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
  - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
  - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.*

## (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
- (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.
- (13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*\* Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.*

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
- (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.
- (2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

*REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.*

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of Brighton of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Railways Classification Board Act 1919*, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

INTERPRETATION.

1. In these Regulations—

"Act" shall mean the *Railways Classification Board Act 1919*.

"Board" shall mean the Railways Classification Board.  
"Officer" or "Employee" shall mean officer or employee as defined in the Act.

ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS.

2. The Minister of Railways shall be Returning Officer for the purpose of any election under the Act, and he may in writing under his hand appoint a substitute to act for him.

3. (a) Within fourteen days of the passing of the Act, the Returning Officer shall invite nominations for any member or members of the Board who in accordance with the provisions of the Act are to be elected, and shall appoint a day, not later than a further fourteen days, for the reception of such nominations.

(b) Within seven days of any vacancy occurring for a member of the Board, the Returning Officer shall invite nominations, for such vacancy, and shall appoint a day, not later than a further seven days, for the reception of such nominations.

4. Every nomination shall be made in writing, and shall be signed by at least 25 officers or employees eligible to vote.

Every nomination shall be indorsed with the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and shall be delivered or forwarded to the Returning Officer so as to reach him before noon on the day appointed for the receipt of nominations.

5. If the number of nominations do not exceed the number of members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall report accordingly to the Governor in Council.

6. If the number of nominations exceed the number of members to be elected, the Returning Officer shall cause the names of the candidates to be published in the next issue of the *Government Gazette*, and of the Weekly Notice issued by the Victorian Railways Commissioners, and shall appoint an hour and day, which shall not be later than ten days from the date appointed for the receipt of the nominations, by which all voting papers referred to hereinafter shall be returned to him.

7. For the purposes of the election of members the Victorian Railways Commissioners shall, on request, furnish the Returning Officer with a roll (hereinafter referred to as the roll of electors) containing the name, grade, and official address of every officer and employee eligible to vote.

8. Immediately after the nominations have closed, the Returning Officer shall cause a voting paper, showing the number of members who are to be elected, and, in alphabetical order, the name of each of the persons nominated for election, to be forwarded to every officer and employee whose name is included on the roll of electors.

9. Each elector shall strike out on the voting paper forwarded to him all the names except those of the person or persons for whom he desires to vote, and shall deliver or forward such voting paper to the Returning Officer. No vote shall be valid if more or fewer names are left uncanceled on the voting paper than the number of persons to be elected, or if received by the Returning Officer after the day and hour fixed in accordance with clause 6 of these Regulations.

10. The Returning Officer shall, as soon as practicable after the hour fixed for receiving the voting papers, count the votes received, and report to the Governor in Council the name of the person or persons elected.

11. In the event of two or more candidates receiving an equal number of votes, the Returning Officer shall have a casting vote.

12. In all matters not herein provided for, the rules and usages at parliamentary elections shall be followed so far as they may be applicable in the election of members of the Board.

FEES OF MEMBERS.

13. The fees payable to members of the Board shall be as follows:—

(a) To any officer appointed on the nomination of the Commissioners and approval of the Minister, such payment as may be granted him under the provisions of the *Railways Act 1915*;

(b) To any officer elected as a member, his ordinary salary, or £1 5s. for every day or portion of a day on which the chairman of the Board may arrange a meeting of the Board or of the members of the Board at

which such officer is present, whichever is the greater. To any employee elected as a member, his ordinary rate of wage, or £1 5s. (whichever is the greater) for every day or portion of a day on which the chairman of the Board may arrange a meeting of the Board or of the members of the Board at which such employee is present;

- (c) To any member who is not an officer or employee, £2 2s. for every day or portion of a day on which the chairman of the Board may arrange a meeting of the Board or of the members of the Board at which such member is present.

#### EXPENSES OF WITNESSES.

14. The expenses payable to witnesses, whether called by the Board, the Commissioners, or any accredited representative, shall be as follows:—

- (a) To any officer or employee, such expenses as may be payable under the Regulation or Award in force for the time being governing the payment of travelling and incidental expenses to officers or employees;
- (b) To any witness who is not an officer or employee, such expenses as the Board deems reasonable.
