HEALTH ACTS.

INFLUENZA REGULATIONS.—CLOSING PLACES OF ENTERTAINMENT.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by Section 19 of the *Health Act 1915* on the Minister of Health to exercise the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the Board of Public Health, I, the undersigned, the Honorable John Bowser, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, do make the regulations following, under the authority exercisable by the said Board by Section 173 of the said Act in consequence of an order in that behalf made under Section 172 by the Governor in Council such Board so enabling :—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Influenza Regulations (Closing Places of Entertainment) 1919, and shall come into force forthwith upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. The several classes or kinds of places mentioned in the schedule hereto, being or situated within a radius of 15 miles from the Post Office, corner of Elizabeth and Bourke streets, Melbourne, shall be closed and not used until notice permitting such use is published in the *Government Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

All Theatres, Picture theatres, Music or Concert Halls, and all Public Buildings where persons assemble for the purposes of entertainment or instruction.
