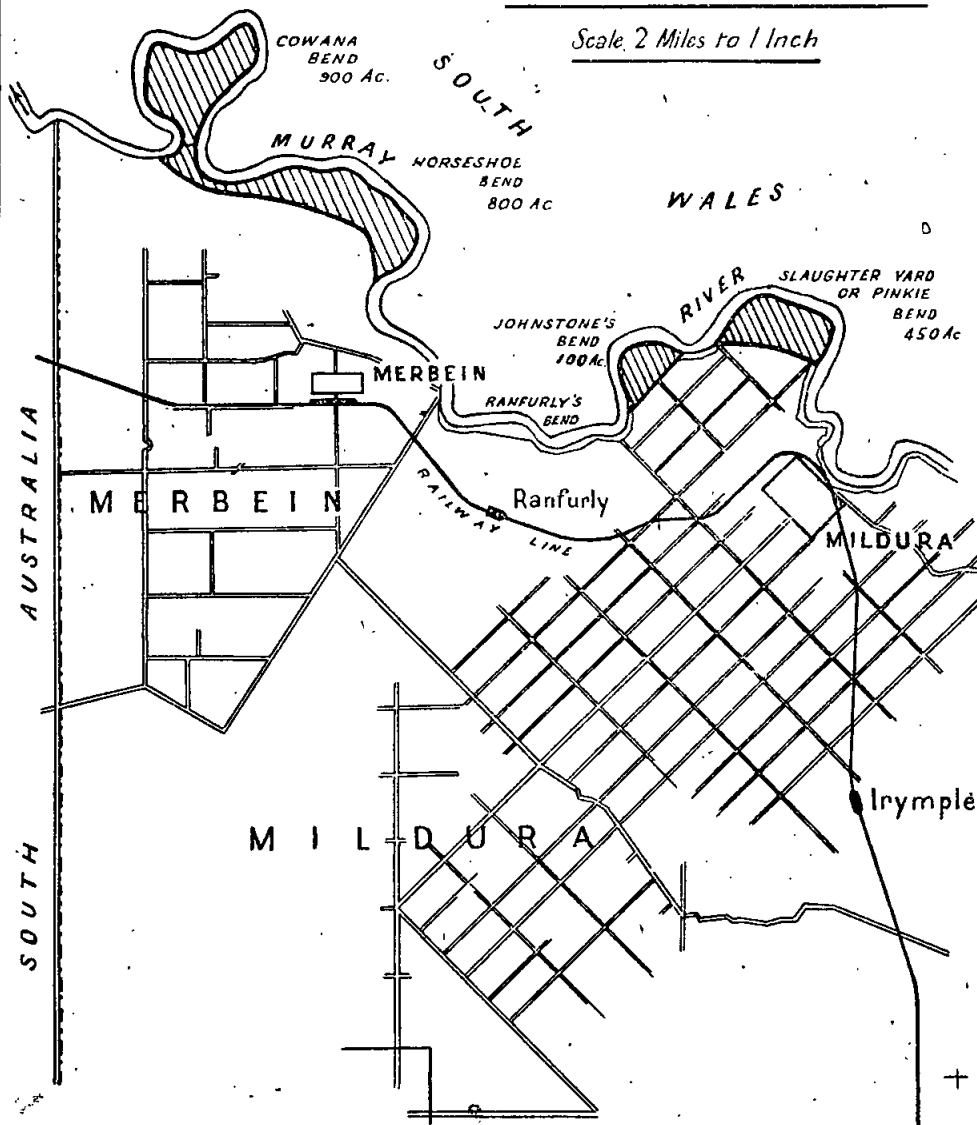

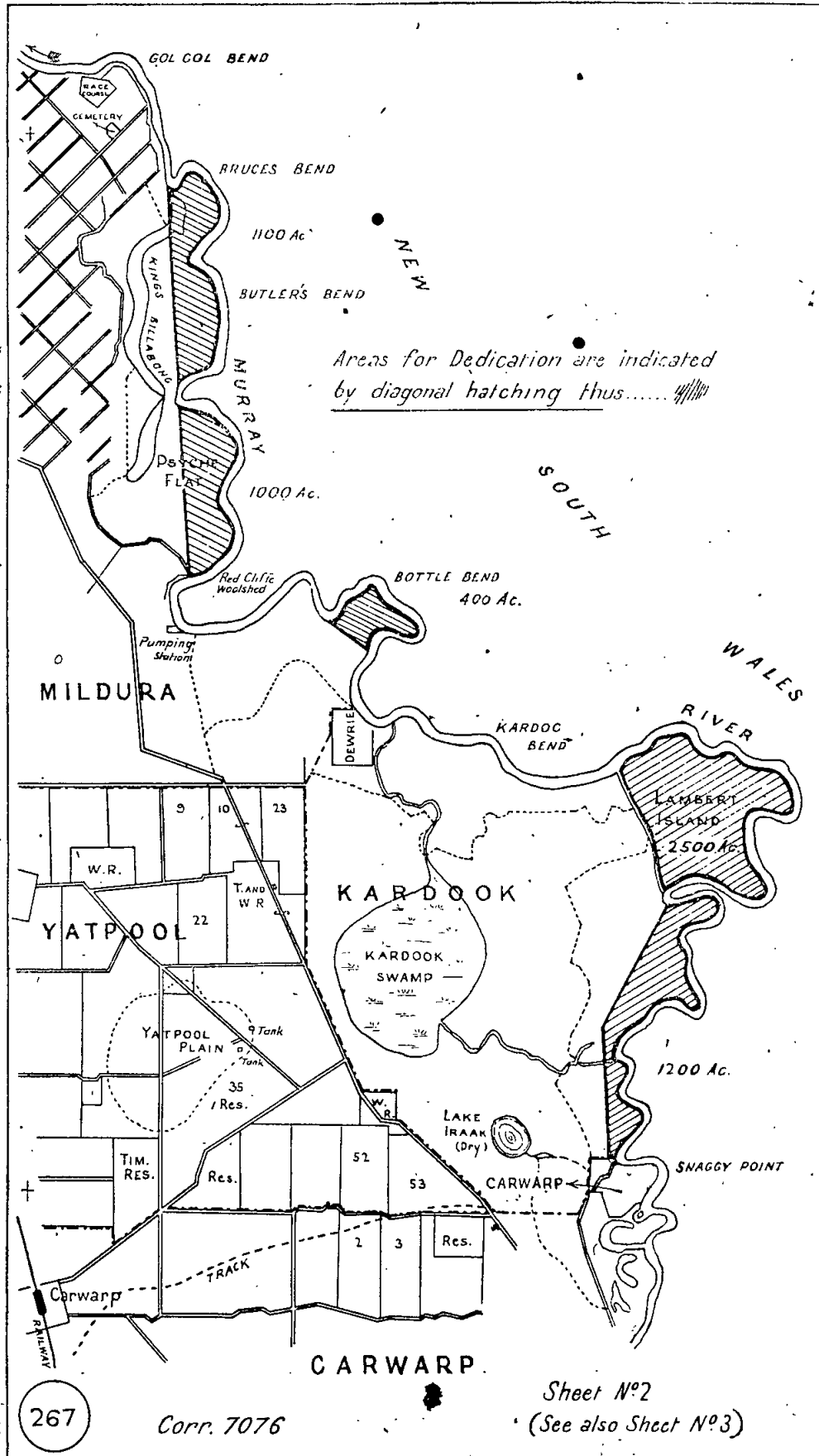

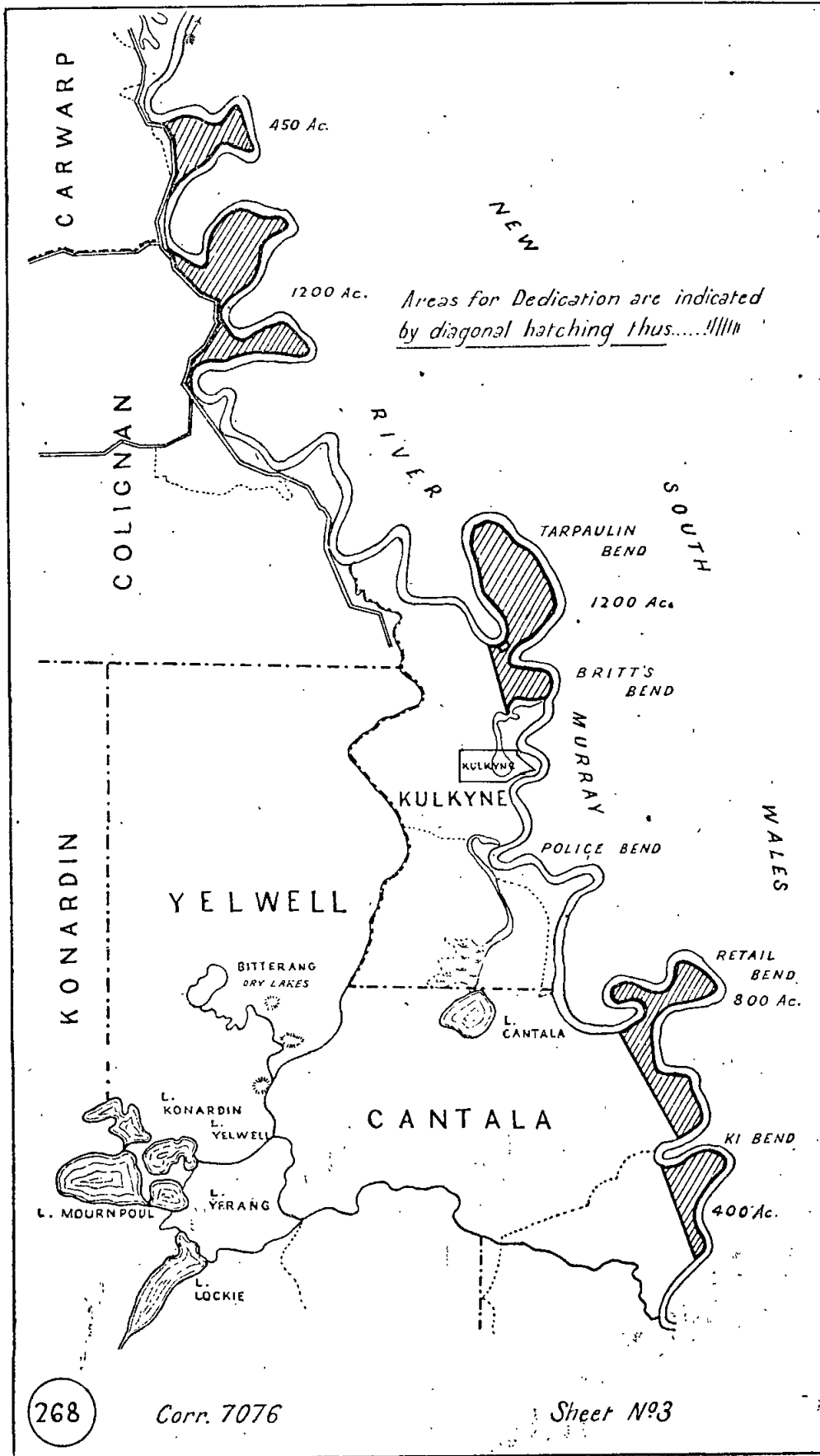

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISHES OF NORONG AND CARLYLE, KNOWN AS THE "LAKE MOODEMERE RECREATION RESERVE."

WE, John Hiskins, Joseph Louis Jackson, Albert Edward Parry, Arthur John Francis, and Robert Stanley Bray, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 5th of November, 1888, as a site for Public Recreation in the parishes of Norong and Carlyle, and known as the "Lake Moodemere Recreation Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Lands and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, fetes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling, plus amusement tax, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, conduct, or language.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or any other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

7. No stakes or posts of any kind shall be driven into the bed of the reservoir in the Reserve, except where necessary for pier or jetty purposes without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person under the age of fourteen years shall be permitted to enter or use any boat in the Reserve, unless accompanied by some competent adult person.

9. The Committee of Management may licence boats to be used for hire or private pleasure purposes in the Reserve, and all persons desirous of obtaining a licence for a boat shall, before making application therefor, submit such boat for the inspection of the officer of the Committee of Management appointed for that purpose.

10. All boat houses shall be erected between the carriage drive in the Reserve and the reservoir therein.

11. All applications for boat-house sites, and also for permission to erect a pier or jetty within the Reserve, shall be accompanied with plans and particulars for the inspection and approval of the Committee of Management, and when any boat house, pier, or jetty shall have been erected within the Reserve it shall be kept in a proper and efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall shoot, trap, poison, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with any animal or bird of any kind in the Reserve, or take therefrom any animal, eggs, skins, or feathers of any description, or carry any firearm, poison, trap, snare, or gin within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

**CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.**

1. As the exact quantity of firewood or charcoal which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department. Charcoal must be of the very best description for the purpose for which it is required, and subject to approval of the officer ordering it.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood or charcoal shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood or charcoal at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

4. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office. The Williamstown District will include the Borough.

5. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. Firewood for the Yarra Bend need not be stacked, but must be weighed on the Asylum weighbridge.

6. The acceptance of the firewood or charcoal shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood or charcoal has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood or charcoal may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the article so rejected or returned.

7. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood or charcoal as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

9. If the board shall decide that the firewood or charcoal is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 3.

10. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood or charcoal as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood or charcoal, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by any purchase of firewood or charcoal by the Commonwealth Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in

that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

15. ## BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.

BY-LAW No. 31.

By-law of the borough of Eaglehawk, made under Part XXVII. of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for the purpose of affording the use of Public Baths to the inhabitants of the borough of Eaglehawk and for the management of such baths.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the borough of Eaglehawk order as follows:—

1. In the construction and for the purpose of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "Baths" mean and include, the public baths situated at Lake Neangar, in the borough of Eaglehawk. "Council" means and includes the Councillors of the borough of Eaglehawk. "Caretaker" means and includes the person appointed by the borough of Eaglehawk to manage and supervise the public baths and any person appointed by such Council or by him as his assistant.
2. The baths shall be opened for the use of the public on week days from 6 o'clock a.m. until 10 o'clock p.m., and on Sundays from 6 o'clock a.m. until 10 o'clock a.m., at which hour they shall be closed.
3. No person shall smoke in any part of the baths or buildings appurtenant thereto.
4. No person shall use soap in the swimming baths or any part of the baths, other than the cleansing shower bath.
5. No person shall use the swimming baths or shower baths whilst in an uncleanly condition, or while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the baths immediately upon being requested to do so by the caretaker or any of the attendants on duty.
6. No person using the baths shall at any time introduce into the baths any spirituous or intoxicating liquor.
7. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to use the baths.
8. No person shall at any time while in the baths use any substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming baths shall be discoloured or rendered unfit for proper use of bathers.
9. No person shall deface the walls in any portion of the baths or buildings appurtenant thereto by writing or drawing thereon.
10. No person shall use obscene language within the baths.
11. No person shall spit in the swimming baths or on the floor or walls of buildings appurtenant thereto.
12. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the swimming baths or showers or improperly defile or soil any part of the baths or any furniture or article therein.
13. No person shall at any time wilfully, carefully or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap, electric light, or fitting in connexion with the baths, or carelessly, negligently, or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fittings supplied for use in the baths.
14. All persons using the baths must use proper Canadian bathing costume—neck to knee.
15. Any constable or officer of police, or any officer of the council, may require any person who in his opinion is not sufficiently or decently dressed or in any way offends against this By-law to resume his or her ordinary dress, and he or she shall forthwith do so. Separate dressing rooms will be provided for males and females respectively, and no male shall enter or use the dressing room and vicinity appropriated for the use of females, and no female shall enter or use the dressing room and vicinity appropriated for the use of males.
16. No person shall use the shower baths for an unreasonable time.
17. No person shall bring any dog or any other animal into the baths.
18. The council is not liable or responsible for any article stolen or lost by any person while in the baths.
19. No person shall take or carry with him into the baths or throw or put into the baths, any stone, bottle, wood, fruit, or other article of any nature or description whatsoever.
20. The council shall have power to allot times when the baths may be set apart for the use of females only, and on such occasions no males shall enter the baths.
21. The council shall have power to set apart times when the baths may be used by males only, and on such occasions no females shall enter the baths.
22. On occasions when the baths shall be set apart for the use of females only, no boy above six years of age shall enter the baths.
23. Until the council shall determine otherwise the baths shall be open for the use of both males and females within the times prescribed.
24. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with the caretaker, assistant, or attendant in the performance of any duty connected with the baths management.
25. All persons using the baths shall behave discreetly and shall not call out or make any undue noise or interfere with the use of the baths by any other person.
26. No person in bathing costume shall loiter upon the banks of the baths.
27. The council shall have power to charge fees for the use of the baths, but until such charges are fixed the baths shall be opened for free use.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council, the fifth day of December, 1918, and confirmed the sixteenth day of January, 1919.

The area is bounded on the north-east and east by the Lerderderg River. On the south along portion of the Werribee River to a point 70 chains from its junction with the Lerderderg. Thence due south along road 35 chains, south-west 25 chains, north-west 28 chains, and west 58 chains, south 4 chains, west 60 chains, along a dividing fence in the property of Mr. Callanan and J. Cuthbertson, north 2 chains, west 50 chains, to road, north along road 25 chains, north to the Werribee River 52 chains, along the river 9 chains; thence (and forming the western boundary) north, along Korkuperimul Creek to road.

The northern boundary is formed by roads running from Korkuperimul Creek, east 60 chains, then north 49 chains, then east 100 chains meeting the Lerderderg River.

(e) The time within which such electric line or lines are to be erected cannot be specified except as to the lines in the streets or roads specified in Clause D as aforesaid, which applicant undertakes to lay or erect within two years from the date of the grant of the now proposed Order.

## SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the shire of Heidelberg, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 65, for prohibiting and regulating cattle being allowed to graze or wander upon land not enclosed by a substantial fence and repealing By-laws numbered 18 and 33.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1.
