THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

The fourteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1915* such Council hereby makes the following Rules, that is to say:—

Rule 18A is hereby repealed and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

Where any person has completed a period of ten years' service in the offices of the Supreme Court or of the Registry of the High Court of Australia or of the Attorney-General Solicitor-General or Crown Solicitor for Victoria or the Commonwealth (or partly in one and partly in another) and obtains from the Full Court of the Supreme Court a declaration that such Court is satisfied that during the last four years of the period aforesaid the duties of the applicant and the work performed by him have been such as to require a knowledge of the law and to give a training in the practice of the law which may in lieu of service under article reasonably be accepted service under articles shall be dispensed with.

The following words shall be added to Rule 33 namely:—
“(f) In appropriate cases the declaration required by Rule 18A.”

The following words shall be added to Rule 39 namely:—
“or against any application for the declaration required by Rule 18A.”

The following Rule is inserted after Rule 39 namely:—

39A. PROPOSED ECHUCA (HIGH-STREET) FLOOD PROTECTION DISTRICT

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Acts, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder and shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted a Flood Protection District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:—

- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the following branch or branches of piano or gramophone manufacturing or repairing and in all things incident or relating thereto, viz.:—
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rate following (that is to say):—
During the currency of this indenture—

1st six months at the rate of	per week of 48 hours

- (d) Pay to the said apprentice such rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Determination of the Musical Instruments Board and in force at the date of the signing of this indenture.

- (e) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this indenture with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.

- (f) If at any time during the said term he or his executors administrators or assigns cease to carry on the branch or branches of his business to which this indenture applies and as now carried on by him within a radius of five miles from his present place of business he or they will with the assistance of the parent or guardian within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer, carrying on the business aforesaid within such radius if any there be and transfer this indenture to such employer.

And that the said _____ apprentice and parent or guardian covenant with the said employer that he the said apprentice during the said term (unless the employer shall remove his business to some place beyond the radius of five miles from his present place of business in which case the apprentice may if he so elect claim to have his indenture assigned to some other employer within the radius if any there be or if there be none such to be released from this agreement) will—

- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid.
- (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business.
- (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent in writing of the said employer.
- (d) Not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours.
- (e) Not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience.
- (f) Wherever practicable shall attend some technical school at least once a week;

and that the said _____ parent or guardian shall provide all necessary tools usually provided by the worker to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.

And it is hereby specially agreed by all the parties to this indenture that in case any of the covenants hereof are broken by any party hereto any Police Magistrate of Victoria shall have power to cancel and make an end of this indenture of apprenticeship if he is satisfied that any covenant or covenants have been broken and that it is desirable to do so.

It is hereby further agreed—

- (1) That the said apprentice shall be paid for all days named as public holidays in the Determination of the Musical Instruments Board until he shall be in receipt of a wage in excess of 20s. a week.
- (2) That the said apprentice shall be paid for all working days the employer may close his factory or work-room or shop or place (excepting those working days between Christmas Eve and the third day of January following the factory or work-room or shop or place may be closed by mutual agreement between employer and employees) but should there be no work on which the apprentice could be employed in accordance with the terms of this indenture owing to breakdown of machinery or to any other cause over which the employer has no control the said apprentice shall be employed at any other reasonable occupation within such factory or work-room or shop or place during the time of cessation of work.
- (3) That the said apprentice shall not be paid for any time he shall be absent from his said duties through his own wilful default and neglect or through illness or through absenting himself from his said employer's service without leave or licence.
- (4) That the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has made up time lost through illness (in excess of six days) or through his own wilful default or neglect during the preceding six or twelve months as the case may be.
- (5) That in computing the period of six or twelve months as the case may be all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set-off against any absence during the said period.
- (6) That a copy of this indenture shall be handed to the apprentice within one month after the signing thereof.
- (7) That if within three months from the date hereof the apprentice is in the opinion of the employer unsuitable for the trade or if the said apprentice is unwilling to continue his apprenticeship either party may determine these presents.

Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918 (No. 2959).

REGULATIONS.

At the Law Courts, Melbourne, the third day of November, 1919.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.
Mr. Hutchinson | Mr. Barnes.

WHEREAS by section 29 of the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918* (No. 2959) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918* relating to the Vineyards Protection Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the now recited Act doth for the purpose aforesaid so far as these may relate to the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board duly appointed and created under the *Mildura Vineyards Protection Act 1918*, and known as the Mildura Vineyards Protection Board, make the Regulations following, viz.:—

1. The first petition shall be forwarded to the Governor in Council by the Provisional Board with their recommendation within one month of the receipt of such petition by the Provisional Board.
2. Within three weeks of the publication of any petition in accordance with section 4 of this Act a counter petition signed by not less than one-third of the number of persons qualified to sign a like petition may be presented.
3. Every petition for the constitution of a new district or for any severance, annexation or alteration of boundaries shall describe the boundaries of the proposed new district or of any portion of a previously existing district proposed to be included therein or the proposed alteration of boundaries or the boundaries of the area to be severed or annexed as the case may be.
4. Every petition shall state a name and address at which notices may be served on the promoters of the petition.
5. Every signature to a petition or counter-petition other than the common seal of the Vineyards Protection Board shall be verified by the solemn declaration of some person. Such declaration shall be in the form or to the effect of the Fifth Schedule.
6. Every petition and counter-petition shall be addressed to the Governor in Council and shall be left with or sent by post to the Minister which shall be deemed the presentation thereof.
7. Upon petition coming into operation there shall be elected a Board consisting of nine members and provided the whole of the shire of Mildura shall be subject of the petition the district shall be divided into three divisions numbered 1, 2, 3 which shall return three members each to the Board.
8. Every person liable to be rated in respect of a vineyard within the Mildura Vineyards Protection District shall be eligible for election as a member of the Vineyards Protection Board.
9. The remuneration that may be allowed to the members of the Board shall not exceed in the aggregate the sum of One hundred and fifty pounds in any one year.

10. As soon as convenient after the election of the Board one of the members thereof shall be elected to be Chairman.

11. At the first Board meeting after the first or any subsequent annual election an auditor shall be appointed to audit the accounts of the Board.

12. The Chairman of every Board shall vacate his office of Chairman—

- (a) on the day previous to the first meeting of the Board after the annual election, or
- (b) on ceasing to be a vine-grower, or
- (c) on dying or resigning his office of Chairman.

13. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained for securing the annual retirement of three members the period during which the members of the Board shall hold office shall be three years.

14. Three members of the Board shall retire annually but the retiring members shall subject to the provisions of the Mildura Vineyards Protection Act be eligible for re-election.

15. A member shall cease to hold office if he—

- (a) dies, or
- (b) by notice under his hand delivered to the Chairman resigns, or
- (c) ceases to be qualified under the Act or becomes an uncertificated insolvent, or
- (d) is absent from four consecutive meetings of the Board without leave.

16. A first election of members in any newly constituted district shall be held not less than thirty days after the constitution thereof.

17. In every district an annual election of members shall be held on the fourth Thursday in August in every year. On the day appointed for the annual election every one-third part of the members who shall go out of office shall always be those longest in office.

18. At the first annual election those who shall retire shall be those who received the lowest number of votes at the first election of members in each division or district and those who receive the highest number of votes at the first election in each division or district shall retain office for three years, and provided there is no election for the first Board the order of retirement shall be determined by ballot.

19. In the election of members of a Board every owner of rateable land shall have one vote for every ten acres of vineyard (a portion of a vineyard exceeding one acre counting as ten acres). No person shall be entitled to more than three (3) votes.

20. Two months before each election the Board shall cause to be prepared a voters' list.

21. Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the Christian name or names, surname and address of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the Act and shall indicate with reasonable certainty the locality in respect of which he appears by the assessment book of the Board to be rated and shall state the number of votes to which under the provisions of the Act each person is entitled.

22. In the case of joint owners the person whose name appears first on the assessment book shall subject to the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were occupied or owned solely by him and he alone shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

23. A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection without payment of any fee or charge at all reasonable hours in the day-time at the office of the Board and the post-offices in each division for a period of not less than six clear days and a notice in the form or to the like effect of the Second Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Chairman of the Board within the time mentioned in the said notice.

24. All objections to the said list shall be lodged in writing with the Chairman of the Board within the time mentioned in the said notice and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

25. Within seven days after the date fixed for lodging objections against the said list as provided by the last preceding clause a special meeting of the Board shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been so lodged with the Chairman shall be considered by the members of the Board then present, and the Chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the members of the Board or a majority of the members of the Board present may determine to be just and necessary or such as by these Regulations are required to be made; and the list when so revised altered and amended shall be certified as correct under the hand of the Chairman and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

26. The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll to be used at the election of members of the Board to be held on the fourth Thursday of August in every year then next

ensuing and shall be the voters' roll to be used at any election for the purpose of filling any vacancy in the office of any member of the Board that may arise within twelve months from such day.

27. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing Regulations the Provisional Board shall prepare a voters' roll in accordance with the Regulations (as far as applicable) for the election of the members of the first Board and appoint a returning officer.

28. The mode of voting shall be by ballot at a place or places as appointed by the Board. At every election in any district or division the returning officer for such district or division shall be one of the members thereof who may be appointed by the Board. The returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election and such deputy may do any or all of the things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do and may appoint poll clerks to assist him if necessary.

29. Not less than fourteen or more than twenty-one days before any election of members of the Board under these Regulations the returning officers shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in a newspaper generally circulating in the said districts and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said districts to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Three o'clock in the afternoon on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice and named therein and any persons desirous of nominating a candidate shall before Three o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer or his deputy a nomination paper in the form of the Third Schedule or to the like effect stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections in their respective divisions or districts and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being named.

30. (1) If after the day of nomination any candidate for such election and three of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he retire from such candidature such candidate and the persons aforesaid not later than four clear days before the day of polling may—

(a) sign and deliver to the returning officer between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon a notice in the form in the Sixth Schedule stating that such candidate so retires, and

(b) publish such retirement in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

(2) The returning officer on receipt of such notice and on sufficient proof of such publication as aforesaid shall—

(a) if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election declare on the day appointed for the election the remaining candidates to be duly elected and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly. After such declaration he shall forthwith publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood the names of the members so elected, or

(b) if the said number is not so reduced omit the name of such person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election and if such papers are already printed erase such name therefrom.

(3) No candidate who has so retired shall be capable of being elected at such election.

31. If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of members of the Board to be elected the returning officer shall on the election day, a day appointed declare such candidates to be duly elected and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

32. If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of members of the Board for each division to be elected, then the returning officer shall in respect of the offices for which there is such excess of candidates forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed with the Christian and surnames of the candidates in full in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto and shall cause notices to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and to be posted up at the office of the Board giving the names of the candidates nominated and setting forth the date and place at which the poll shall be taken and the time at which the poll shall commence and be closed and such poll shall take place accordingly and shall commence at One o'clock in the afternoon and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

33. The returning officer or his deputy shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

34. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer to be present in each polling booth and the said returning officer and his deputy and poll clerks and the scrutineer and any persons not exceeding six in number actually engaged in voting shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

35. The returning officer or his deputy shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters and also a locked box to be called the ballot-box with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins and the box shall then be locked and shall stand on a table opposite to the returning officer or deputy returning officer who shall keep the key of such box.

36. The returning officer or his deputy shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter appears entitled to give. Every ballot-paper delivered as aforesaid shall be initiated by the returning officer or his deputy; and every person voting shall without leaving the booth place a cross opposite the name of the candidate or candidates for whom he intends to vote on all or any of such papers. In case any person voting is unable to read or write the returning officer or his deputy if so required shall in view of such one of the scrutineers or in the event of no scrutineers being appointed such other person as the voter may desire, place a cross opposite the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate and after such voter's paper or papers have been so marked the ballot-paper or papers shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. All the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers and voted by the same shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers or exercise and further right of voting.

37. Before delivering any ballot-papers the returning officer or his deputy shall initial the back of each such ballot-paper as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof and shall thereupon upon a copy of such roll check off such person's name as having voted.

38. If any person so mark his ballot-paper or papers as to leave a greater or lesser number of candidates so marked to remain thereon than is to be elected such ballot-paper or papers shall be informal and shall be void and of no effect.

39. The returning officer or his deputy may if he sees fit and shall if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer put to any person claiming to vote in his own right the question following:—

(1) Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the voter's list in use at this election or in this division?

(2) Have you already voted at this election in this division or district?

40. If any question arise as to the due election of any member of the Board by any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) such question shall be determined by the members of the Board at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no member in respect of whose election such question has arisen shall act as a member at such meeting or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof or in any manner or at any time to act as a member until such question shall have been determined, and a majority of the members whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

41. In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Board with reference to any such question as aforesaid he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the members shall have determined the question and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

42. If at any election of members no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the members eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

43. Whenever any vacancy occurs an election to fill such vacancy shall be held on such a day being not less than twenty days and not more than twenty-five clear days after the occurrence of such vacancy as the Chairman may appoint or in default of such appointment on the 30th day after the occurrence of such vacancy. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing clause if any vacancy occur within three months prior to the annual election such vacancy may not be filled until the annual election.

44. The expenses incurred by the returning officer or under his direction in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the Board.

45. Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer or his deputy shall in the presence of as many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present proceed to ascertain the number of votes for such candidates, and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the highest number of votes to have been duly elected members of the Board (as the case may be) and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote in addition to any other vote or votes he may have.

46. The returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers and shall deliver such sealed packet to the secretary of the Board to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing and then by him secretly destroyed in the presence of three members of the Board.

SHIRE OF CHARLTON.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the shire of Charlton, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 9, for preserving good order and decency in any buildings belonging to the municipality, or under the control and management of the council, or preventing damage to such buildings, or to the furniture or fittings thereof, or regulating any meeting or gathering held therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the President, Councillors, and Burgesses of the shire of Charlton, order as follows:—

1. No person shall in any building belonging to the municipality or under the control and management of the council, and whether at any meeting or gathering of any kind and description or not—

- (a) behave in an improper, disorderly, or indecent manner, or
- (b) expectorate, or spit, upon the floors, walls, furniture or fittings of such buildings, or smoke therein, or
- (c) injure or damage the said buildings, or any part or parts thereof, or any of the said furniture or fittings therein.

2. No person shall at any meeting or gathering held in any such building or part thereof—

- (a) stand upon any chair or seat, or place their feet upon the railings of any seat, or stand or sit upon any window sill, corner, balcony railing or staircase railing, or
- (b) disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering, or take part, or in any manner connive or assist in such disturbance or interruption, or
- (c) by standing up obstruct the view of any one seated therein, or
- (d) use any threatening, abusive, obscene, or insulting words, or
- (e) be drunk, or

(f) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches or stairways to the external doors of such buildings, or in the corridors, aisles, landings, gangways, or passages within the same.

3. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Five shillings, for any such breach.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Charlton.

This By-law shall come into operation and commence to have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette* as provided in the *Local Government Act 1915*.
