SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

### BY-LAW No. 42.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under the Health Act 1915, and numbered 42.

N pursuance of all or any of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1915 and by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows, that is to say:—

1. That By-laws Nos. 11 and 21 shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the shire of Dandenong, that is to say:—

Dandenong.—Commencing at the south-west corner of Crown allotment 29, parish of Dandenong; thence north by the western boundaries of Crown allotments 29 and 35 in the said parish to the Gippsland-road; thence north-east across that road to David-street; thence respectively by David-street, James-street, Herbert-street, George-street, Ross-street, and Kidds-road to the Dandenong Creek; thence along that creek and the eastern and southern boundaries of the township of Dandenong to the intersection of the latter boundary with the Frankston-road; thence along that road to its intersection with the south boundary of Crown allotment 14, section XXIV., parish of Eummemering; thence westerly along that boundary and the south boundary of the Cemetery reserve; thence north to its intersection with the Kirkham-road; thence westerly along the said road to the intersection with the western boundary of Crown allotment 21A, parish of Eummemering; thence north along that boundary to its intersection with the Dandenong Creek to its intersection with the western boundary of Crown allotment 50, parish of Dandenong; thence north-westerly across that allotment to the point of commencement.

Every occupier and every person having the management

point of commencement.

2. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any house or premises within the aforesaid area or portions of the said shire, and to which house or premises this By-law is applicable, shall construct or cause to be constructed thereon a proper privy in the form of an earth closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor of which is at no point less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground surface, and shall have requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, licensed public-house, hotel, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house shall be paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination from the rise of the seat towards the back of the building of half an inch to the foot.

All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of venilation, and shall be prepared and permitted to be used for the double-pan service provided and have a supplied and between the content and privy to be supplied and between the content and privy to be

provided for.

3. The Council shall cause every closet and privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or the other of such pans to be kept under the seat

4. The Council shall at least once a week cause the pan in use to be closed with a close-fitting lid, and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place, and the night-soil removed, rendered inoffensive.

rendered inoffensive.

5. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy, the Council shall cause the same to be cleansed by superheated steam, and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

6. The occupier or person as aforesaid shall not contract for the providing of pans for or removal of night-soil from such premises, except such supply and removal be in accordance with this By-law.

ance with this By-law.

7. No occupier or such person as aforesaid shall use a closet pan for depositing any vard or house rubbish, or any other material in (except for deodorizing), other than night-soil, or shall damage such pan or lids in any manner whatsoever.

8. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in closet a proper supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectually deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may

be deposited in the pan placed in such closet to be immediately on such deposit covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly disinfect the contents of

material summers.

9. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make an annual charge on each occupier or other person as aforesaid for the pans supplied and for the removal of night-soil, and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

Sessions.

10. This By-law shall not apply or be deemed applicable to any holding within the said area which, according to the rate-book of the shire of Dandenong exceeds 5 acres in area, and as to which the health officer or sanitary inspector of the said shire shall in writing have certified in manner herein-after appearing that in his opinion such holding need not be included in the operation of the said By-law. The owner or occupier of such a holding may at any time, at his or her own expense, apply for and obtain (if thought fit) such a certificate, and shall pay all expenses caused to the shire or the Council thereby, and such certificate shall be directed, and sent, to the secretary of the said shire by the health officer or sanitary inspector, and shall not have any effect until so sent.

officer or sanitary inspector, and shall not have any effect until so sent.

11. Every person who shall, by any wilful act or default, be guilty of any breach of this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty at the discretion of the Court of Justices, either of Five pounds for every such breach, or Two pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the Justices before whom the penalty is sought'to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as a foresaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

7. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds fifteen shillings (£3 15s.) per annum.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

17. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice, in writing, to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

18. If any person who has provided any meter fail to give the notice required of any repairs required for such meter he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£6).

19. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

20. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

21. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose t

occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the

occupier or owner refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permis-

with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permis-sion shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission. 24. (3) For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One pound maximum.

(4) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic

and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.
