Factories and Shops Act 1915.

DETERMINATION OF THE BOOT BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 1st day of January, 1920 applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrpambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

TN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory or work-room, boots, shoes, and slippers of every description, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of January, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (4) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (5) INSIDE WORKERS.—Employers shall supply all grindery, colours, and materials, and also find workshop room and light for inside workers, free of charge.
- (6) Outside Workers.—Employers shall supply all grindery, colours, and materials (except for wax-thread work) for outside workers, free of charge.

Making shall include stiffener or any toe éxcept a stub toe. Finishing shall mean white to heel and top piece, square or bevel waists, including fudging.

CLASSIFICATION OF LEATHERS-TO BE DETERMINED BY LEATHER IN VAMPS.

Class 1.—Buck skin, imitation buck skin, crup, glace kid, glace goat, glace wallaby, glove kid, white kid, patent, imported calf all kinds (black or coloured), Levant seal.

Class 2.—Coloural calf, and all other leathers not specified in either 1st or 3rd Class.

The Board determines, under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at making cripple corks, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
