ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million and nineteen thousand one hundred and seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and nineteen and One thousand nine hundred and twenty.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the tenth year of His Majesty's reign:

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 239.

The Victorian Railways Commissioners, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Railways Act 1915*, do hereby make the By-law following:—

No person shall, without the written authority of the Commissioners, send by railway any motor vehicle:—

- (a) carrying or accompanied by any petrol or volatile oil or other volatile inflammable substance; nor
- (b) unless all petrol, volatile oil, and other volatile inflammable substance aforesaid be removed from any tanks, piping, carburettors, or other receptacles on the vehicle; nor
- (c) unless the connecting cables and wires of all batteries have been disconnected from the battery terminals and the said terminals have themselves been so protected that they cannot be connected inadvertently whilst the vehicle is in the care of the Commissioners.

Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 11th day of December, 1919.

CITY OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW NO. 75.

A By-law of the city of Brighton, made under section 652 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 75, for regulating the conduct of persons using, or being upon or in, land purchased or rented or otherwise provided by the Council of the municipality of Brighton, or which has been granted or given to the municipality by any person for pleasure grounds, or places of public resort or public recreation.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Brighton order as follows:—

1. In this By-law "Park" shall include park, recreation ground, garden, or reserve.
2. The Park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, or as the Council shall from time to time direct.
3. No person shall enter or remain in any Park at any time at which it is not open to the public.
4. No person shall enter or remain in any Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
5. No person shall climb upon or get over, injure, cut down, destroy, damage, or in any way interfere with the fences in or around any Park, or in any manner disturb, damage, or destroy any property, chattels, effects, or things in any Park.
6. No person shall damage in any way any wall or fence in or enclosing any Park, or any building, barrier, railing, seat, notice board, or any tree, plant, shrub or flower, or any improvement in a Park, or kindle or make any fire in any Park.
7. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, rubbish, or refuse, or cause any filth, rubbish, or refuse to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon any Park.
8. No unauthorized person shall at any time in any Park—
 - (a) enter any plots which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or plants; or
 - (b) remove or disturb any soil, or flower bed, or tree, or plant; or
 - (c) walk or run over, or stand or lie upon any flower bed, or tree, or plant, or any ground in the course of preparation or cultivation; or
 - (d) pluck any bud, blossom, flower, or leaf of any tree or plant; or
 - (e) turn on water or interfere with the water supply; or
 - (f) interfere in any way with any birds or animals.
9. No person shall put in any Park any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals, and no conveyance or vehicle shall enter or remain in any Park, except in such portion thereof prescribed or set apart by the Council.
10. No person shall camp in any Park, nor erect in any Park any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure.
11. No person shall in any Park hawk, sell, offer, or expose for sale, or let to hire, or offer, or expose for letting to hire, any commodity or article.
12. No person shall bring into any Park any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.
13. No dog shall be allowed in any Park, except as provided in clause 12, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in any Park shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.
14. No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place, or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon any footpath in a Park, or to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing a Park, or to or upon any tree, building, railing, seat, structure, or erection in a Park.
15. No person shall throw or discharge in any Park any missile to the damage, danger, or annoyance of any person.
16. No person shall throw, distribute, deposit, or cause to be thrown, distributed, or deposited in or upon any Park any handbill or other printed matter.
17. Persons using a Park for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, scraps, or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

18. No person shall assemble in any Park for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character.

19. No person shall play any musical instrument, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in any Park.

20. Betting in any part of any Park shall not be permitted, and any person found betting therein shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.

21. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker in any Park.

22. No motor, or any delivery cart, tradesmen's cart, dray, lorry, waggon, van, barrow, or truck shall enter or pass over or through any Park.

23. No person shall dig or remove from any Park any soil, sand, or other material.

24. No person shall play or practise cricket or football, or any other game, or engage in any sport in any Park.

25. No person shall in any Park wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, or interrupt any servant of, or person acting under authority of the Council, in the proper execution of his duty or work.

26. Whenever the Council shall see fit it may, by a permit under the hand of the town clerk, authorize the doing of such acts and things as are prohibited by clauses numbered respectively 9, 10, 11, 18, 19, 22, and 24, but a permit shall not be given authorizing the playing of any game or sport under clause 24 hereof on a Sunday.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in Landcox Park, Hurlingham Park, the beach reserves and gardens, and the Whyte-street reserve in the municipal district.

Resolution for passing this Regulation agreed to by the Council of the city of Brighton on the 6th day of October, 1919, and confirmed on the 3rd day of November, 1919.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920, No. 35.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be One pound two shillings and sixpence.
 2. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust). Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence.
 3. For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District the charge shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust. Such minimum charge shall be computed at the charge of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling according to the municipal valuation of the properties so supplied, and for all water supplied in excess of such quantity the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. Provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than One pound two shillings and sixpence.
 5. Such rates and charges other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1920, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1920.
 6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within its Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. Minimum.—Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Nine pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. Minimum.—For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Nine pounds sterling annual value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. On Valuation Above Minimum.—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Nine pounds sterling, or more than Nine pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings (2s.) in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

4. Special Rates.—For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. Notice to Install Meter within Seven Days.—The Trust may by notice intimate to the occupier or owner of any premises within its Waterworks District using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes that the water supply is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such occupier or owner to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days from the date of such notice, and thereupon such occupier or owner shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter, and if any person neglects to comply with such notice such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 sterling. The Trust may, in the event of failure to comply with such notice, cut off the supply of water to such house or premises either by cutting off the pipes by or through which the supply is taken from the main or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as such notice is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trust or its officers, and neither such cutting off of pipes nor the cessation of such water supply as aforesaid shall relieve any person of his liability to pay water rates during such period of cessation.

6. Minimum Meter Charge—Excess Meter Charge.—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

7. Meters to be Tested and Approved.—The Trust may cause a meter to be affixed in any case where it considers necessary, such meter to be provided by the consumer and fixed at his expense. No meter shall be fixed unless approved of by the Trust, nor unless it shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. Syphons.—Syphon pipes will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

9. Public Institutions and Others.—Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.

10. Irrigation.—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

11. Where Meter Ceases Registering, &c., Average may be Charged.—If the meter shall cease registering the Trust shall, during the time it is out of order or undergoing repairs, estimate and charge the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

12. Unlicensed Person not to Interfere with Pipes or Services.—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

13. Licences to Plumbers to be during Pleasure of the Trust.—Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such licence. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

14. Notice of Work proposed to be Given.—Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

15. Notice to Lay Services, &c., to be Given.—No service-pipe shall be laid for the purpose of connecting with pipes of the Trust unless two (2) days' prior notice thereof be given to the Trust, and no service-pipe shall be laid at a depth of less than 12 inches below the surface of the ground in streets. The day for connecting private services to the Trust's pipes shall be Thursday in each week.

Special Size Service.—No service of a larger pipe than half (½) inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

16. Service-pipes to be Repaired by Owner or Occupier—Penalty for Refusal or Neglect to Repair Service.—If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may deem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the occupier or owner of the tenement supplied by such service-pipes the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

17. Waste of Water.—Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds per day for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. Special Provision for Steam Boilers.—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. Overflow to Baths.—Overflow pipes to baths or basins will not be permitted.

20. Sale of Meter.—The Trust will upon the application of an intending consumer supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery.

21. Meter Reading.—The meter reading shall be *prima facie* evidence of the quantity of water consumed.

22. Testing Meters—Owner or Occupier to give Notice of Removal from Premises.—In the event of the owner or occupier being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice shall forward the sum of One pound which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced or another meter will be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust, and the amount deposited by the owner or occupier shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Trust who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Trust of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. Water Rate Outside Trust's Area.—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

24. Water Troughs.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

25. Interpretation Clause.—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Nhill Waterworks Trust, and "he" shall also mean "she."

26. Excess Payments—Where water meters are affixed the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

Period of Rate.—That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1920, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1920, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1920.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW, 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law for the year 1920.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of land or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Twelve pounds or under, municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Twelve pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and eightpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said District situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water shall, if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such occupiers or owners are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920. Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by such Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 40.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, the amount of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of Eight pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of more than Eight pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Two shillings and threepence in the pound upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every water-trough, Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied by measurement by the Trust, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum 50,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum 100,000 gallons; for every additional acre and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre. In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purpose, each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

7. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Ninepence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens) equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate charged for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

10. For water supplied to market gardens, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 100,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply is to be by meter only.

11. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

13. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

14. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

15. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920, excepting the charge for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 15.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

- (1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per annum.
- (2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid.
- (3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings be charged.
- (4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.
- (5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1920, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1920.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

1. For every house or tenement above Fourteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound, according to such value.

2. For every house or tenement of above Twenty pounds and not more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two pounds ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-six pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Thirteen pounds municipal value or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of Four shillings per thousand gallons shall be made; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

That the above-named rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the first day of January, 1920, and the second payment on the first day of July, 1920.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be employed by the Trust for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the rates hereby made.

YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW, 1920.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following by-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. The rate of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-five pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of meters and special arrangements with the Trust) situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1920.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling, and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be payable.

3. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds sterling and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties; provided that in no case shall a less rate than 20s. per annum be payable.

4. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

5. For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, for domestic and garden purposes, will be charged for at One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand gallons up to the amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

8. For water supplied for other than domestic purposes, a rate not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons may be charged by the Trust, or the Trust may make special agreement as required.

9. Ratepayers supplied with meters by the Trust shall pay an annual rental for such meters at Nine shillings (9s.) per annum.

10. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure, provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangement with the Trust.

11. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata*, on above scale.

12. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, according to clause 8 of this By-law.

13. A minimum rate of Five shillings, and a maximum rate of Forty shillings, shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes, and any owner or occupier using more water than, in the opinion of the Trust or its officers they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use except between the hours of seven o'clock a.m. and nine o'clock p.m.

14. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses or other like purpose, the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this By-law, provided such spray shall only be used between the hours of seven o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock p.m.

15. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

16. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1920, and are payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on 1st day of January and 1st day of July in the year, or in one payment in full on or before 1st day of July, excepting those by measure and special arrangement, which shall be paid quarterly or as the Trust may direct.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920 WITHIN THE TONGALA URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Tongala Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been duly proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1920, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes; such rates and charges to be paid half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1920. Amounts under Two pounds are to be paid in one sum, in advance, on 1st January, 1920:—

1. On every house or tenement, vacant or unoccupied land, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement or vacant or unoccupied land during the said year, the sum of Three shillings and sixpence in the pound of such valuation, with a minimum of Twenty shillings.

2. Water supplied to Government Departments, police station, churches, Court-house, post office, State school, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged by measurement or special arrangement.

3. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, the charge for every one thousand (1,000) gallons, or portion of same, to be at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, with minimum of Sixpence for any one tank or load.

*4. Supplies of water for any purposes not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

5. Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not provide a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be re-connected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of eight (8) o'clock p.m. and six (6) o'clock a.m. For the purposes of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Tongala Waterworks Trust on the twentieth day of November, 1919.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, viz.:-

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1920. Such rates and charges shall be deemed to be due and payable, in advance, on the first day of January, 1920, but the Trust may accept payment of the same by four quarterly instalments, payable on the first January, first April, first July, and first October of the said year, without prejudice to its right to recover the whole year's rate. That is to say:-

2. On every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

3. On every shop or place of business not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum under this clause to be Thirty shillings.

4. On every livery stable, saw-mill, cordial or aerated water factory, or other factory using water in connexion with its machinery or treatment, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings, and on every flour mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds.

5. On every steam engine (not including any steam engine in a factory or mill rated under clause 4), a sum of One pound.

6. On every horse trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

7. The area of land allowed for each house or tenement paying the ordinary rate herein imposed shall not exceed one rood. Should any larger area of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Five shillings shall be paid for every rood or part of a rood. Only one service-pipe connexion with the Trust's mains will be allowed to each house or tenement rated herein, and such service-pipe shall not exceed $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch in diameter.

8. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, a sum of Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering shall be made; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value or on amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering. All persons about to build must notify the Trust of their intention so to do.

Cases where Water is not Laid On.

9. On every house, tenement, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Fifteen shillings.

10. On every rood or part of a rood of land rated separately from any above-mentioned tenement, and facing a street or land in which a water main is laid contiguous thereto, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Five shillings.

11. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided in clause 9, must give notice, in writing, to the Trust's Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the current quarterly period. No allowance in the rate will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter; nor in any case where the water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water Supplied by Measure.

12. The charge for water supplied to market and other gardens and nurseries over one-quarter of an acre in area shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the customer after being approved by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be (20,000) Twenty thousand gallons. The service pipe for the supply of such water shall not exceed 1 inch in diameter.

13. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains lucerne, sorghum, or other fodder crop without a permit from the Secretary of the Trust, who shall, subject to the approval of the Trust, issue the same. The fee for such permit shall be £1 10s. for each one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) or part of one-eighth ($\frac{1}{8}$) of an acre to be irrigated. No person shall be allowed to irrigate from the Trust's water mains more than one-quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of an acre of any land unless a meter be attached to the service-pipe supplying such land. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

14. The charge for water supplied to any "bowling club" shall be £10 per annum, such supply to be by or through a meter, which shall be provided and affixed by the consumer after being approved by the Trust.

15. The Trust may require a meter to be used in connexion with the supplying of water to any house or tenement in any case where it deem the same necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 12 shall apply to such house or tenement.

16. The Trust will not in any case be held liable to supply water under the provisions of clauses 12, 13, or 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

17. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be One shilling for each (100) One hundred gallons.

18. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

19. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is or are hereby authorized to collect and recover the above-mentioned rates and charges.

20. In the construction of this By-law the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force on the 1st January, 1920, the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust; and the word "tenement," as used herein, shall be deemed to include the whole of the land held or used by or on behalf of one person, as one contiguous property, whether divided into two or more parts by fences or not.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW NO. 29.

THE Municipal Council of the city of Warrnambool doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has for the purpose of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District), make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay in advance in one instalment for the period from the first day of October, 1919, to the thirtieth day of September, 1920, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelvepence (1s.) for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of October, or the first day of April, shall be charged two-thirds rate.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvepence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons, and the ratepayers shall be charged for quantity of water which at Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same,

otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Council, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per centum for wooden buildings lined with plaster, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Council, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Council shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteen pence per 1,000 gallons is equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the period which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public parks and show grounds the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens and the Manifold-street Reserve, the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.
- (q) The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable on the first day of March of the said year.
- (r) Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

1. (a) For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation and under, the sum of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence.

(b) For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds annual municipal valuation, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of such valuation.

2. For each vacant allotment or piece of land facing a street wherein a main pipe has been laid, rated for the ordinary municipal rate separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual municipal valuation of same.

3. Such rates shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, due and payable respectively on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1920.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trentham Waterworks Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand and receive and recover the said rate.

MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 13.

THE Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupier or owners of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said district:—

1. For any house or tenement fronting any street wherein a pipe for the supply of water shall have been laid or where houses or tenements if not fronting such street are supplied with water by reticulation, and being of an annual valuation of Ten pounds (£10) or under, the sum of One pound five shillings (25s.).

2. For every house or tenement so situated of an annual value of above Ten pounds (£10) the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) or under situated in streets with no pipes and if not supplied with water, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.).

4. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10) in streets with no pipes and if not supplied with water, the sum of One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) in the pound on the annual value of such property.

5. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

6. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1920, and shall be payable on the 1st January, 1920.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

8. Water supplied to Government Departments, religious denominations, and to persons outside the Trust area, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of water supplied by special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. In cases of large consumers of water by meter the Trust by special agreement may make

a reduction to not less than Ninepence (9d.) per 1,000 gallons. A charge of 7½d. per 1,000 gallons will be made to the Wimmera Inland Freezing Co. Ltd. for pumping water.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the previous clauses the minimum charge for water supplied by measurement or under special agreement must not be less than the charge would be if the property was rated in the usual way according to the shire valuation. This By-law also applies to the Freezing Works.

11. On properties where the officers consider it necessary a meter will be ordered to be put on, and in case of non-compliance the water will be cut off, according to the powers conferred by the Water Acts.

The foregoing By-law No. 13 was made by the Commissioners of the Murtoa Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Acts this 22nd day of August, 1919.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust.

(1) For every house, including not more than one acre of land and of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the minimum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

(2) For every house, &c., of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate of One shilling in the £1 for every £1 over and above £60 annual valuation.

(3) All shops or places of business with a municipal value below £20, shall be rated at Two shillings in the £1. The stationmaster's residence, to be charged for only if connected, at the same rate as house and quarter acre below £20 valuation.

(4) Land adjoining the properties, the annual value of the property not exceeding £20, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for each quarter acre over and above the quarter acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of 10s.

(5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding ½ acre, Five shillings, not exceeding ¾ acre, Seven shillings and sixpence, not exceeding one acre, Ten shillings, not exceeding 1½ acres, Twelve shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 2 acres, Fifteen shillings, and if more than 2 acres, Twenty shillings.

(6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(7) For water supplied to public buildings, gardens, &c., and other similar properties, the charge shall be by measurement or by special charges. If by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less in each case than the following:—Botanic Gardens and railway station, 35,000 gallons. The following are the special charges:—Police Station, State School, and Post Office, £2 per annum. Mechanics' Institute, Recreation Reserve, and Sale Yards, £1 10s. per annum. Masonic Hall, and Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.

(8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.

(9) The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter.

(10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special agreement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

(11) For a supply of water during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Five shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, cement or plastering, or if there be no contract, then upon the value, or upon the amount charged or paid for such work.

(12) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

(13) In the event of any dispute which may arise, regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special charge.

(14) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1920, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annually and shall be payable on the 30th day of November in each year.

(15) For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of One shilling for every two hundred gallons or under.

(16) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Mortlake Waterworks Trust on the twelfth day of November, 1919.

BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law of the shire of Flinders made under section 197, sub-section (22), of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 20, for regulating traffic.
