BY-LAW NO. 22, MAKING AND LEVYING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law follow-ing for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:--

PART I.

I. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning

of the Local Government Acti 1915 within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council according to the valuation for the time being of such land and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district of the said shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

PART II. THE BEAUFORT WATER SUPPLY.

- 2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that
 - (a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter provided, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement.

 (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon.
 - usually watered on such tenement.

 (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water-pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.
- 3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of retaculation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Gold-fields Reservoir situate to the north and south respectively of the township of Beaufort and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

PART III .- THE JOINT WATER SUPPLY.

- 4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say-
 - On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and which is supplied by the Council with water from the joint water supply, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.
- 5. "The joint water supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

PART IV .- THE WATERLOO SUPPLY.

- 6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say-
 - On every house or tenement being rateable property within the municipal district of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of One pound per annum.
- 7. "The Waterloo supply" means "The Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about 5 miles in a northerly direction from the township of Beaufort.

PART V.

- 8. Such rate as aforesaid is made, and shall be levied for the year beginning on the 1st day of October, 1918, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1919, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the Victoria Government Gazette of the notice required by in the Victoria (

- I. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—
 - (a) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £20 or under (except in the case of land on which there is no buildings), the sum of One pound sterling

 (b) On lands and tenements above the annual value of £20 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), the sum of Five pounds (£5) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

 (c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per centum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

 (d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Five shillings per annum.

 (e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

- pence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

 (f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

 (g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

 (h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.

 (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (is.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

 (j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1919, and the first day of July, 1919, respectively.

Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to de-mand, receive, and recover the said rates and charges.

- Any member of an agricultural society subscribing not less than Ten shillings per annum to any such society, and resident within any of the parts into which Victoria is divided for the purpose of the Agricultural Colleges Act 1915 being desirous of nominating any person as a candidate for election by such part as a member of the Council of Agricultural Education, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form in the Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulturs required by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four other persons who are also members of an agricultural society subscribing not less than Ten shillings to any such society and resident within any of the parts into which Victoria is divided for the purpose of the Agricultural Colleges Act 1915, and also by the person named therein as a candidate accepting such nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post at the place appointed not later than Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day fixed as the day of nomination. 3.
