AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1919.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1919 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Trust District:—

I. For each vacant allotment of land of an area not exceeding one acre in extent, and on which no service-pipe has been laid, but which abuts on a street or road on which a main is laid, a rate of Five shillings shall be paid for the year; and for each such allotment of land of an area exceeding one acre in extent, a rate of Threepence for each additional acre shall be paid. Vacant allotments on which a service-pipe is laid shall be charged double the above rate.

II. For all lands and tenements within the Trust District of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

III. For all lands and tenements of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Seymour.

IV. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1919.

V. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:— For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

VI. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for the year 1919 shall be 10,000 gallons.

VII. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for the year 1919 shall be 15,000 gallons.

VIII. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1919, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1919, and such rate shall be payable on the first day of July, 1919.

The charge for water shall be payable quarterly or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR 1919.

I. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the rate shall be of such percentage on the valuation in each case as shall produce the sum of Twenty-seven shillings and sixpence.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds according to the municipal valuation for the time being the sum of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

III. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated separately from any building, Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of the municipal valuation thereof.

IV. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe and not supplied with a service-pipe from the main shall be charged one half the assessed rate.

V. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile but within half-a-mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one quarter of the assessed rate.

VI. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates.

2. For every house or tenement of more than Twelve pounds annual municipal valuation a rate of Two shillings and sixpence on municipal valuation shall be paid.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land fronting a street in which a main shall have been laid shall be Ten shillings.

4. For all lands and tenements, situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water and being within a quarter of a mile of a main, one half of the beforementioned rate, and where tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a main one quarter the beforementioned rate to be paid.

5. Water supplied by meter shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and shall be paid for at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1919.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1919, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charge for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2684), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the shire of Moorabbin which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the shire of Moorabbin, and constituted a new municipality under the name and title of "The Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc."

Area described in petition:—

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay in a line with the centre of Cromer-road; thence north along Cromer-road to Balcombe-road; thence east along Balcombe-road to Charman-road; thence north along Charman-road to Latrobe-street; thence east along Latrobe-street to Point Nepean-road; thence in a north-westerly direction along Point Nepean-road to Oak-grove; thence east along Oak-grove and Voltri-street and the northern boundary of Crown allotment 3, section 17, parish of Mordialloc, to the north-eastern corner of said allotment; thence south along the eastern boundary of said allotment to Lower Dandenong-road; thence east along Lower Dandenong-road to Warren-road; thence south along Warren-road to Warren-street; thence east along Warren-street to Boundary-road; thence south along Boundary-road to the centre of the Mordialloc Creek; thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the Mordialloc Creek to its entrance to Port Phillip Bay; thence in a westerly direction along the shore of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point in line with the centre of Cromer-road.

The petitioners state that owing to the popularity of the proposed new borough as a watering-place the population is largely increased during the summer months rendering it necessary, in the interests of public health, that the drainage should be carefully attended to and proper channelling formed, and that by the constitution of the proposed new borough a better supervision could be exercised over the area in question as to expenditure for maintenance, drainage, lighting, and other works, particularly in regard to health matters and the large seaside public reserves situated therein.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of "The Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc," such municipality to be subdivided into three wards.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Resolution of the Country Roads Board declaring a Road on a Site taken for a Deviation of a Main Road fit for use.

WHEREAS the land the site of the road the course of which is below set out was taken by the Board under the provisions of the *Country Roads Act 1915* for the purpose of constructing such road deviation which road deviation has now been laid out and formed on the same.
