VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 237.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

(1) (a) The fares for the conveyance of members of the Imperial and Commonwealth Naval and Military Forces and Rifle Clubs travelling on duty shall be as follows:—

Description of Forces.	Fares for Single Journey.	Fares for Return Journey.
Cadets up to 14 years of age	One-third of ordinary single fares	One-third of ordinary return fares
Senior Cadets over 14 and under 19 years of age	One-half of ordinary single fares	One-half of ordinary return fares
Adults	Two-thirds of ordinary single fares	Two-thirds of ordinary return fares

The minimum fares shall be as under (ordinary fares to be charged, if cheaper):—

(b) Deserters from the Imperial Naval Forces and their escorts will be charged the fares prescribed in Sub-Clause (a).

(c) The fares prescribed in Sub-Clause (a) will be charged for journeys to Rifle Matches, Military Tournaments, Sports, and Tattoos authorized by the Defence Department.

(d) The fares prescribed in Sub-Clause (a) will not apply in respect of proclaimed holidays when Holiday Excursion Fares are in general operation, except in connexion with the issue of week-end excursion tickets. Full holiday excursion fares will be charged in such conditions.

(2) The rates to be charged for the conveyance of stores, horses, guns, or ammunition by goods trains for the Defence Department will be two-thirds the ordinary rates, and by passenger trains two-thirds ordinary parcels rates, subject to the following exceptions, in respect of which no reduction of the published fares, rates, or charges shall be made, viz:—

- (a) Periodical tickets.
- (b) Coal and other items, such as sand, perishables, &c., which are carried at specially reduced rates.
- (c) Penal charges, such as storage and demurrage.
- (d) Special services, such as shunting, &c., and
- (e) Any other services which are now or may at any future time be performed for the public at specially reduced charges.

(3) In the case of special trains run for the Defence Department, the reduced fares and rates specified in Clauses "(1)" and "(2)" will apply, but the minimum charge in respect of each of such special trains will not be less in the aggregate than the sum represented by a charge of 8s. per mile each way, unless the return trip is commenced within twelve hours, in which event the minimum charge for the return trip will be 4s. per mile, minimum payment £5 per train.

(4) The rates to be charged for the conveyance between Melbourne and Sydney of motor cars, carriages, gigs, dog-carts, and vehicles of a similar description loaded in a four-wheeled truck shall be—

One vehicle	£14 14s. 6d.
Two vehicles belonging to one owner in one truck	£22 1s. 9d.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 1st day of April, 1919.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

1. Any person affixing any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust shall connect such by a lead pipe three (3) feet in length, with proper brass connexions, and before any person in any manner interferes with any service-pipe, cock, or fitting up to the building line connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall give a clear twenty-four (24) hours' written notice of his intention to do so to the secretary of the Trust, and shall before doing such work obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any person offending against this By-law in any way shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the Trust to be incompetent or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply or of this By-law or any By-law of the Trust.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and shall pay in advance a licence fee of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; but the Trust may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

4. No person shall lay down a pipe at a less depth than two (2) feet from the surface of the earth.

5. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

6. The bore of any service-pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed—

(a) One-half of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued at the municipal valuation for rating purposes at Twenty pounds (£20), or under; and

(b) Three-quarters of an inch in diameter where such service is to any premises valued as aforesaid at a sum exceeding Twenty pounds (£20); and this By-law shall be taken as a consent of the Trust to any such service. Before any service-pipe with a bore, the dimensions of which are contrary to this clause, is laid down to any premises, the consent of the Trust must first be obtained.

7. No person shall use, or permit to be used, or allow to run on any premises, any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire-extinguishing purposes before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Nine o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or before the hour of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. or after the hour of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

8. Any person who shall allow water to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

9. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement use, take or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water trough, or private or public water service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

10. Every person upon whose premises a water trough stands shall keep such trough provided with a ball tap, and shall keep such water trough and ball tap at all times in a state of thorough repair. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

11. No person shall use any water on, or allow any water to run on any land, garden, plantation, or vegetation, wherever growing, otherwise than by means of a garden hose, or at any time other than between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Nine (9) o'clock p.m. during the months of November, December, January, and February, or between the hours of Seven (7) o'clock a.m. and Eight (8) o'clock p.m. during the other months of the year. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. Every person supplied with water shall keep the pipe or pipes on the premises occupied by him disconnected and free from any hose pipe or other conduit during the times the use of water is forbidden under clause seven (7) hereof. Any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

13. If any person does, or causes, or permits, allows, or suffers to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, he shall be liable (where no penalty is otherwise herein provided for such offence) to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and a further penalty

not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust; and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipe by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this By-law or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under the Water Acts, or any other Act or Acts relating to water supply.

14. The officer or officers of the Trust, or other person appointed for that purpose, may at all lawful times enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water, or breach of this By-law; and if any person hinders or prevents such entry or examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from any house, tenement, or land to which such entry is refused, or on which such examination is hindered, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

15. The word "person" in this By-law shall include corporation.

16. The By-law made by the Trust on the twentieth day of November, 1917, relating to water supply is hereby repealed.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1919.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1919.

2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the municipal charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1919 of the property so supplied.

6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, public gardens, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of Two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.

10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1919. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

ORDER IN COUNCIL, SEVERING THE HOWQUA, JAMIESON, AND WOODPOINT RIDINGS AND PORTION OF THE LAURAVILLE RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF HOWQUA FROM SUCH SHIRE AND ANNEXING SAME TO THE SHIRE OF MANSFIELD, AND SEVERING THE REMAINING PORTION OF THE LAURAVILLE RIDING OF THE FIRST NAMED SHIRE THEREFROM AND ANNEXING IT TO THE SHIRE OF UPPER YARRA, AND DISSOLVING THE SHIRE OF HOWQUA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of March, 1919.

WHEREAS by notice in writing dated the 31st day of October, 1918, to and duly served upon the councils of the shire of Mansfield and the shire of Upper Yarra respectively, on or about the 23rd day of the same month, and by notice in writing dated the 14th day of November, 1918, to and duly served upon the council of the shire of Howqua, on or about the 16th day of the same month, the Honorable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works in and for the State of Victoria and the Minister of the Crown of the said State for the time being administering the Local Government Acts of the same (hereinafter referred to as the "Minister"), notified such councils that moved by reason (as the case in fact is) that the general and extra rates made and levied by the said shire of Howqua during the twelve months ended the 30th day of September, 1917, did not yield a sum of One thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, he intended to proceed to obtain an Order severing those portions of the shire of Howqua constituted by the Howqua, Jamieson, and Woodpoint Ridings, and portion of the Lauraville Riding (as shown on plan accompanying such notice) of the said shire and annexing such ridings and portion of riding to the shire of Mansfield, the municipal district of which, together with that of the said ridings and portion of riding, forms one continuous area, and severing that portion of the said shire of Howqua constituted by the remaining portion of the Lauraville Riding (as shown on plan accompanying such notice) of the same, and annexing such portion of riding to the shire of Upper Yarra, the municipal district of which, together with that of the said last-named portion of riding, also forms one continuous area, which notices were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of October aforesaid, and respectively in three consecutive issues of the *Age* and the *Argus* newspapers, generally circulating in Melbourne, and the *Mansfield Courier* and *Lilydale Express* newspapers, generally circulating in the several municipalities of Howqua, Mansfield, and Upper Yarra (that is to say, in the *Age* and the *Argus* on the 25th, 26th, and 28th October, 1918, and in the *Mansfield Courier* on the 26th October, 1918, and 2nd and 9th November, 1918, and the *Lilydale Express* on the 1st, 8th, and 15th November, 1918). And whereas the said Minister has given to the councils of the municipalities of Howqua, Mansfield, and Upper Yarra (no creditor of any of them within the period of three months from the 15th day of November now last past or at all having notified the Minister of his or its desire so to do), full opportunity of showing cause why an Order in Council severing the four ridings aforesaid of the shire of Howqua from the said shire and annexing three of such ridings and portion of another riding, namely, the Howqua Riding, the Jamieson Riding, and the Woodpoint Riding, and portion of the Lauraville Riding to the shire of Mansfield, and the remaining portion of the Lauraville Riding to the shire of Upper Yarra, should not be made and passed,

And whereas the Minister, having entertained, inquired into and decided upon all the representations made by or on behalf of such councils respectively, has recommended that the Howqua, the Jamieson, the Lauraville, and the Woodpoint Ridings should as on and from the thirty-first day of May, 1919, be severed from the shire of Howqua, and that as on and from the said date that the said Howqua, Jamieson, and Woodpoint Ridings, and portion of the Lauraville Riding should be annexed to and become part and form portion of the shire of Mansfield as a separate riding under the name of the "Howqua Riding," and the said remaining portion of the Lauraville Riding be annexed to and become part and form portion of the East Riding of the shire of Upper Yarra. And whereas such recommendations have been duly considered and approved: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, being satisfied that all conditions precedent to the making hereof have been fulfilled and observed, and acting under the authority conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and under all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby order and direct as follows (that is to say):—

1. That on and from the thirty-first day of May, 1919, the date upon which this Order shall come into operation, the

Howqua, the Jamieson, the Lauraville, and the Woodpoint Ridings respectively of the shire of Howqua, incorporated as the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Howqua, shall be severed therefrom and annexed as herein-after provided.

2. That with regard to the Howqua, Jamieson, and Woodpoint Ridings, and the portion of the Lauraville Riding aforesaid, as on and from the date last aforesaid, the said ridings and portion of riding and the territories therein comprised shall be annexed to and form part of the shire of Mansfield, incorporated under the name of "The President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Mansfield," as a separate riding to be called the "Howqua Riding," with the boundaries as set out and defined in the First Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of the said shire of Mansfield shall be as set out and defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. The existing subdivision of the said shire of Mansfield being hereby retained, such shire, after the annexation thereto of the territory in the First Schedule referred to as aforesaid as a new riding under the name of the "Howqua Riding" shall be taken as subdivided into five divisions, namely, the existing ridings of North, South, West, and Central, and the said new riding of Howqua, which several ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Third Schedule hereto under the respective names.

4. At the next annual election following the annexation to the shire of Mansfield of the territory constituting the new Howqua Riding, and thereafter the ratepayers of such new riding shall return three councillors, and the number of the councillors of the council of the shire of Mansfield shall be increased from twelve to fifteen accordingly.

5. That with regard to the said remaining portion of the Lauraville Riding aforesaid, as on and from the thirty-first day of May, 1919, the said portion of such riding of the shire of Howqua and the territories therein comprised shall be annexed to and form part of the East Riding of the shire of Upper Yarra, incorporated under the name of the "President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Upper Yarra," with the boundaries set out and defined in the Fourth Schedule hereto, and that the boundaries of the said shire of Upper Yarra shall be as set out and defined in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

6. The existing subdivision of the said shire of Upper Yarra being hereby retained in such shire after the annexation thereto of the territory in the Fourth Schedule referred to and constituted as aforesaid to form part of the East Riding shall be taken as subdivided into three ridings, namely, the existing ridings of West, Central, and East, which several ridings shall have the boundaries set forth and described in the Sixth Schedule hereto under the respective names.

7. That all councillors of the present shire of Howqua shall go out of office at midnight on the thirtieth day of May, 1919, and that thereafter the corporation of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Howqua shall be dissolved and cease to exist.

8. That failing an amicable settlement of any differences and the apportionment, settlement, adjustment or determination of any property, income, assets, rights, liabilities, expenses or matters requiring to be apportioned, settled, adjusted or determined between the municipalities hereinbefore referred to in this Order, the Governor in Council shall, under the powers conferred by the said *Local Government Act 1915*, by Order, apportion, settle, adjust or determine such matters.

And the Honorable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The weight of the vehicle shall in all cases be reckoned as part of the weight which may be so carried.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF QUEEN VICTORIA GARDENS.

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favour of the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Melbourne, and their successors in respect of the land described therein, and known as Queen Victoria Gardens, it is provided and declared that the lands thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a site for a Memorial Statue of Her Late Majesty, Queen Victoria, and for a Public Garden, and offices, and conveniences connected therewith, and for no other purposes whatsoever. Regulations.

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the gardens, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the gardens, or throw stones or other missiles or light fires therein, or leave in the gardens any bottles, fruit peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or other structures, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

4. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog, unless held by a chain or cord, and all goats or poultry found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

5. No person, except workmen employed in the gardens, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

6. No assemblies for fetes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the gardens, without the permission in writing of the council first obtained.

7. No person, unless authorized by the council in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the gardens any article, fruit, or merchandise.

8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the gardens any horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls or other animals.

9. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the council in writing, shall bring into or use in the gardens any cart, truck, bicycle, motor car, motor cycle, wheelbarrow, or other vehicle of any description whatsoever.

10. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing or harangue in the gardens.

11. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the gardens, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

12. No person shall play at or engage in any game, athletic sport, or gymnastic exercises in the gardens.

13. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the gardens unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

14. No person shall without the consent in writing of the council carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the gardens.

15. No person shall in any part of the gardens wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the gardens or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any parkkeeper or other servant of the council.

SHIRE OF DIMBOOLA.

By-LAW No. 22.

Local Government Act 1915.

A By-law of the Shire of Dimboola, made under sub-section 20 of section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915, for preventing the keeping of bees within certain areas, and numbered 22.
