4. Water supplied for other than domestic purposes shall be by measure or by special agreement, and shall be charged for at the rate of Ninopence per one thousand gallons, or such price as may be fixed by the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 20,000 (twenty thousand) gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at the price named, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the occupier or owner would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The foregoing rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first days of January and July, 1919, respectively, and such person or persons as the

Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and receive such rates and charges.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1919.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Seventeen pounds sterling annual valuation, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound five shillings sterling per annum.

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For all tenements in the said district in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation by such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the first day of January, 1919, shall be as follows:—

(a) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

(b) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes solely, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government Departments, police stations, churches, court-house, post-office, State school, show ground, cricket ground, bowling-green, shire hall, sale-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement or special agreement.

For water supplied to carriers and livery stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose-box.

In open sheds used for stabling, each space of five feet shall be used as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1919. Such rates shall be paid by equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July of such year, and such charges shall be payable half-yearly, on the first day of July and the thirty-first day of December of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

All water troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball taps to prevent overflow.

PORTS IN VICTORIA.—ADDITION TO PORT RULES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Arthur Lyulph Stanley, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act* 1915 (6 Geo. V. No. 2688) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make the following addition to the Port Rules respecting the navigation

of outward-bound deep-draught vessels through the fairway at Port Phillip Heads, that is to say:—

12A. The owner, agent, or master of any steam-ship which it is intended to be sent to sea drawing over twenty-nine (29) feet shall, in writing, give notice of such intention and of the time of her anticipated arrival at Port Phillip Heads, such notice to be lodged at the office of the Marine Board, Melbourne, not less than three (3) hours before the time of departure from her berth.

On the arrival of a deep-draught steam-ship off Portsea there shall be exhibited from such steam-ship, in a position whence it can best be seen, a black ball or shape two (2) feet in diameter as a signal to the Point Lonsdale station that the entrance fairway is required to be kept clear of inward traffic.

Upon such signal being observed by the officer on duty at Point Lonsdale he will immediately cause a similar signal to be hoisted at that station, whereupon a like signal will be exhibited from the pilot steam-ship on duty on the outside station as an indication that the entrance to Port Phillip is temporarily closed to inward traffic, and the pilot or exempt master in charge of any vessel shall not attempt to enter the port until the outward-bound deep-draught steam-ship has cleared the channel, which shall be indicated by the signal ball or shape exhibited thereon being hauled down; the closed channel signal on the pilot steam-ship and at Point Lonsdale will then be hauled down, whereupon the channel will be opened to inward traffic.

The pilot or exempt master of any steam-ship drawing more than twenty-nine (29) feet shall not proceed past Portsea except during daylight and under favorable weather and tidal conditions, and not until he has definitely ascertained that the prescribed signal is exhibited from the Point Lonsdale Signal Station.
