ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

THE subjoined despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies and the enclosure referred to therein, relating to the wearing of the Insignia and Riband of the Order of the British Empire, are published by direction of His Excellency the Governor for the information of those interested.

Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you copies of a memorandum which has been issued by the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood with regard to wearing the Insignia and Riband of the Order of the British Empire with morning dress. This being optional as regards both the Insignia and the Riband, the memorandum should not be considered as a Regulation, but only as a guide to those interested.

2. Certain other points with regard to the wearing of Decorations in the Dominions, Colonies, and Protectorates have recently been raised, and I think it desirable to communicate to you the decisions which have been reached:—

(a) It is His Majesty's pleasure that the full-sized Badge of Orders and Decorations below that of Commander of the Order of the British Empire may be worn with plain clothes (morning dress) on ceremonial occasions by civilians who are not in possession of Civil Uniform or Court Dress. In plain clothes (evening dress), on occasions when Orders, Decorations, and Medals are worn, the miniature-sized Badge should be worn.

(b) In cases where Military full dress is field service dress, with open collar, the Badge of a Companion or a Commander of an Order should be worn round the neck with the Riband under the shirt collar and the Badge over the tie, hanging just below the knot. In the case of more than one Badge, the second should be worn with the Riband emerging from the top button-hole of the coat, and showing very slightly, certainly not more than an inch. Additional Badges should be worn below the second, but without any interval between the bottom of the second Badge and the Riband of the third.

(c) In morning dress the Riband from which the Badge of Companion or Commander of an Order is suspended is worn under the tie, which should be a bow, the Badge hanging about three-quarters of an inch below the bow.

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(d) Ladies may wear their Insignia in day dress on all Official occasions.

(e) Both in day dress and evening dress, ladies should wear full-size Insignia. Miniatures should not be worn by ladies.

ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

Ladies and gentlemen who have been appointed to the Order of the British Empire may, should they wish to do so, wear the Insignia of the Order with morning dress on Official Occasions and at Public Functions.

The Ribbon of the Order may be worn on all occasions, at the discretion of the holder.

The method of wearing the Insignia with morning dress is as follows:—

Knights Grand Cross, Dames Grand Cross, Knights Commanders, and Dames Commanders should wear the Star only on the left breast of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress as the case may be.

In the case of gentlemen who are Commanders, the Ribbon from which the Badge is suspended is worn under the tie, which should be a bow, the Badge hanging about three-quarters of an inch below the bow.

Ladies who are Commanders, and Officers and Members, both ladies and gentlemen, should wear the Badge on the left breast of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress as the case may be.

The method of wearing the Ribbon of the Order, which will be the same for all five classes, both for ladies and gentlemen, is as follows:—

A piece of the Ribbon of the Order one-and-a-half inches wide and half-an-inch in depth, mounted on a bar of metal in the form of a brooch, to be worn on the left lapel of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress as the case may be.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2688) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make orders amongst other things to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof estimated under the provisions of the said Act a sum of £1,500 a shire: And it is further enacted that every Order constituting any new shire shall assign a name to such shire, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the Council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided name and describe the subdivisions; and it is further enacted that every order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district may abolish all the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or re-subdivide the same, and that every Order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of portions of the shires of Colac, Heytesbury, and Winchelsea, praying that a certain area described in such petition, being part of the Beac and Corangamite Ridings of the shire of Colac, part of the South Riding of the shire of Heytesbury, and part of the Coast Riding of the shire of Winchelsea, be severed from the said shires and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the shire of Cape Otway: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a new shire to be named the shire of Cape Otway, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said shires of Colac, Heytesbury, and Winchelsea, and of the Beac and Corangamite Ridings of the shire of Colac, the South Riding of the shire of Heytesbury; and the Coast Riding of the shire of Winchelsea as reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth further order that the said new shire of Cape Otway be subdivided into three ridings, to be named the East Riding, the Central Riding, and the West Riding, the boundaries of which shall be those hereunder set forth and described, and doth further order that the Council of the said shire shall consist of nine members.

SHIRE OF CAPE OTWAY.

Commencing at a point on the sea coast being the north-east angle of the parish of Wongarra; thence westerly by the north boundary of that parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Barramunga; thence north by the east boundary of that parish and the parish of Yaughar to the north-east angle of the latter parish; thence west by the north boundary of that parish and the parish of Natte Murrang to the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence south by the west boundary of the said parish of Natte Murrang and portion of west boundary of the parish of Newlingrook to the north-east angle of the parish of Wiridjil; thence westerly by the north and southerly by the west boundaries of that parish to the north boundary of the parish of Latrobe; thence following the north and west boundaries of that parish to the sea coast; thence easterly and north-easterly by the sea coast to the point of commencement.

SHIRE OF FERNTREE GULLY.

A Regulation of the shire of Ferntree Gully numbered Two, made under section 48 of Part X. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the shire by virtue of a By-law of the above shire numbered Eleven for the better government of the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the shire of Ferntree Gully made the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district:—

1. For the licence for every hackney or stage carriage and the renewal thereof there shall be charged and be received by the Council for carriages having a seating capacity up to 6 persons Five shillings per annum, from 6 to 10 persons Ten shillings per annum, from 10 to 15 persons Fifteen shillings per annum; over 15 persons, Twenty shillings per annum.

2. No person shall keep use employ or let for hire for the carriage of passengers any hackney or stage carriage or act as the driver or conductor thereof unless he shall have a licence granted and in force under the provisions of this Regulation so to do and no licence shall be granted to a hackney or stage carriage owner or driver unless he shall satisfy the Council that he is a fit person to be intrusted with the same and if of good fame and character and above the age of eighteen years.

3. There shall be paid the sum of One shilling to the Council for the owner's or driver's licence.

4. The following letters words and figures in white paint or other durable material on a dark ground shall be painted or placed in plain block letters and figures of not less than one and a half inches in height and of proportionate breadth on the front of each side of the carriage immediately below the driver's seat or by a plate affixed in such position or in such other manner or places as the Council or its Inspector may direct and the same shall be kept conspicuous legible and undefaced during all the time such hackney or stage carriage shall ply or be used for hire and shall apply to and be painted or affixed upon no other carriage other than the one for which the licence to which it corresponds shall have been granted:—

FERNTREE GULLY SHIRE No. TO CARRY PERSONS.

5. No licensed carriage shall ply for hire or carry passengers unless at the time such plying or such carriage in the case of a horse-drawn vehicle be drawn in the case of a carriage licensed to carry 4 or any less number of persons by one horse, if licensed to carry more than 4 and no more than 10 persons two horses. The size and bodily condition of every horse employed in drawing any licensed carriage shall be such as to render it capable of efficiently performing its share of the work of drawing such carriage in accordance with this clause. If, in the opinion of the Council's Inspector, any horse so employed is under-sized or ill-conditioned as to make it incapable of properly performing its allotted task, such Inspector may forthwith order the removal of such horse from the licensed carriage to which it is attached.

6. The driver of every licensed carriage shall be in constant attendance upon the same when plying or standing in public streets or otherwise or engaged for hire and no driver shall when standing or plying for hire be at any such distance from his carriage so as to prevent his having full control over the same nor loiter nor remain upon any footway or roadway at any such stand but shall when not actually employed in or about his carriage or in looking after his vehicle remain upon the driving seat or box of such carriage or within twenty feet of such vehicle.

7. At railway stations no driver shall depart from his vehicle further than twenty feet within ten minutes prior to and after the arrival of each train.

8. No hackney carriage shall be licensed to carry at any one time a greater number of passengers than the same will contain at one time upon fit and proper seats provided therein for that purpose allowing for each passenger an average on each and every seat convenient for sitting upon of not less than fourteen inches and such seats will be 12 inches apart, unless such seats face each other when they shall be 20 inches apart provided that no child sitting in the lap under three years of age shall be deemed to be a passenger within the meaning of these Regulations.

9. A table of fares and distances will be supplied by the Council printed on cardboard. Such list suitably framed and glazed and kept clean and legible must be displayed in a prominent position within the vehicle and the driver shall also himself keep a table of fares and shall produce the same at once to any passenger or other person applying to him for an inspection thereof.

10. The fares to be charged to each passenger for journeys in licensed stage carriages shall be such as are fixed by resolution of the Council from time to time.

11. Any driver or proprietor of a licensed motor vehicle or other licensed conveyance collecting or receiving a fare in advance for any journey or return journey and issuing a coupon or ticket entitling the holder to travel such journey or return journey, shall on presentation of such coupon or ticket, if the holder does not desire to travel, pay or repay to such holder the amount of the fare represented by such coupon or ticket.

12. The places of standing for stage carriages shall be as follows:—

Upper Ferntree Gully Railway Station yard. On the main Olinda-road, at Dunstan's corner, opposite approach road to Ferny Creek Post Office, at Breen's corner, near junction with Sherbrooke-road, at Crescent-road junction, at Sassafras Mechanics' Institute, at Olinda Post Office. On the Main Fern-tree Gully to Belgrave road, at Upwey Railway Station; in Belgrave township, between railway station entrance and the Temperance Hall. On Belgrave-Monbulk road, at Gilmour's corner at junction with Sherbrooke-road; at South Sassafras Post Office; at junction of Boundary-road, near Nathania Springs; at Monbulk Post Office. At Bayswater Railway Station yard. At Emerald Railway Station yard. At Avonsleigh corner. At Macclesfield Post Office.

13. Hackney and stage carriages shall take their stations on the standing in the order of their arrival and when any such carriage is driven off any such stand the driver of the carriage immediately behind shall cause his carriage to move forward to the place vacated by the carriage so driven on and the drivers of the other carriages behind shall cause them to move forward each up to the place vacated by that immediately before it and every driver offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings.

14. A licensed stage carriage shall leave the place of standing immediately such carriage is filled with passengers to its licensed capacity and no driver, owner, or any person on behalf of the driver or owner shall book seats or by any means engage or propose to carry any person remaining at or adjacent to such standing as a passenger on a later journey therefrom by the same or another stage carriage unless there are no seats available in any other licensed stage carriage plying for hire simultaneously at such place of standing.

15. Regulation numbered One of By-law No. 11 of the shire of Ferntree Gully is hereby repealed.
