UNDER the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1917* (No. 2896), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations providing for the qualification of persons for the supervision of the construction and maintenance of works of municipal Councils authorized under any Order heretofore or hereafter granted under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915* (No. 2645), or any corresponding previous enactment. Such persons are hereafter referred to as Electrical Advisers:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall act as Electrical Adviser to any municipal Council in the State of Victoria duly authorized under any Order heretofore or hereinafter granted under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915* or any corresponding previous enactment to construct and maintain works, unless he shall have obtained a certificate of qualification in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

2. All applications for certificates of qualification to act as Electrical Adviser to a Council shall be made in writing in accordance with the form prescribed in the schedule to these Regulations and shall be addressed to the Minister of Public Works, who is hereby authorized to grant certificates of qualification to any person complying with the requirements of these Regulations, or to refuse any application for such certificate.

3. Any person applying for a certificate of qualification to act as an Electrical Adviser to a municipal Council shall state his name, occupation, and address in his application. Such application shall be indorsed by the municipal clerk, and shall be supported by documentary evidence of the applicant's qualification as to training and experience, for the advising of the Council upon, and affording guidance in regard to the matters hereinafter set out in so far as they pertain to the system operated or to be operated by the Council, that is to say:—

- (a) The question of establishing of an electrical supply undertaking.
- (b) The recommending of an appropriate system of supply and the preparing of estimates of capital cost, and of probable annual expenditure and revenue in connexion therewith.
- (c) The preparing of plans and specifications upon which to invite tenders for the supply of plant and materials.
- (d) The proper supervision of all work carried out by contract or otherwise.
- (e) The manner of conducting and operating an undertaking, including the organizing of means for carrying out the several functions of generation, distribution, and administration.
- (f) Appraising of the material condition of the assets of an undertaking and of its commercial and financial position, together with analyses of working costs and the proper allocation of all expenditure and revenue.
- (g) The preparing or furnishing of the necessary materials for the preparation of a periodical financial statement of accounts showing profit and loss, depreciation, renewals, and other matters as required by the specimen books of accounts of electric supply undertakings under section 415 of *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (h) The obligations placed upon the undertakers under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915*.

4. In addition to the foregoing, in so far as they appertain to a Council's undertaking, applicants must, if required by the Minister, furnish evidence of qualification and practical knowledge in regard to—

- (i) The type of plant to be operated, or in operation, and the measures necessary to maintain such plant in good working order and to carry out extensions to same.
- (j) Switchboard apparatus, also meters used for measuring electrical supply to consumers, the determining of the accuracy of meters and of their proper adjustment.
- (k) Overhead line construction and laying of underground mains, services, and systems of reticulation; calculation of losses in transmission and distribution.
- (l) Systems of internal wiring of consumers' premises and of the wiring rules in force in this State, and of methods of carrying out tests.

(m) Proper operation and maintenance of electric storage batteries, including cell-switches, boosters, and other accessories.

5. If it be shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that an officer in the employment of a Council is—

- (a) possessed of the necessary qualification to perform the duties of an Electrical Adviser as aforesaid, or
- (b) is sufficiently qualified to operate and be in charge of such Council's electric supply undertaking, which is already established and in operation,

the Minister shall approve of his being granted a certificate in accordance with the provisions of clause 8 of these Regulations.

The issue of a certificate under clause 5 (b) shall not entitle the holder to act as sole adviser in regard to extensions of the undertaking involving further capital expenditure, nor as to any change of the system of generating and supply, nor to expensive replacement of machinery or batteries, nor to material expenditure upon plant and works.

6. Applications under clause 5 (a) shall be accompanied by a fee of £2 2s., and for any such subsequent application by a fee of 10s. 6d.

Applications under clause 5 (b) shall be accompanied by a fee of 10s. 6d., and for any subsequent application a fee of 5s.

7. If it be shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that any Electrical Adviser has failed in the carrying out of his duties to a Council employing him, or that he has not acted solely in the interests of such Council, or has been in receipt of any payment, commission, or valuable consideration other than from such Council in respect of works advised upon by him or carried out under his supervision, the Minister, after he has given such Electrical Adviser the opportunity to be heard, may revoke his approval in relation to such Council. It is, nevertheless, provided that a Council may pay commission to its Electrical Adviser by way of partial or complete remuneration for his services in respect of works advised upon or carried out under his supervision.

8. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1919. Application forms referred to in clause 3 can be obtained from the Local Government Branch of the Department of Public Works, as also copies of these Regulations.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1915.
