THE ROYAL ASSENT TO A RESERVED BILL ENTITLED "AN ACT TO MAKE INSANITY A GROUND FOR DIVORCE OR JUDICIAL SEPARATION."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Common-wealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, in pursuance of provisions contained in An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land (5 and 6 Vict.), also in An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies (13 and 14 Vict.), and in The Constitution Act, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill, the title whereof is herein set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to make Insanity a Ground for Divorce or Judicial Separation,"

which was reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon, has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and that by an Order in Council made at the Court at Buckingham Palace, and bearing date the eleventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, a copy where-of is hereto appended, His Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Vic-toria, at Melbourne, this eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and in the eleventh year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

III S Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the city of Footscray doth by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the Local Government Act 1915 (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the Local Government Act 1918 (No. 2981), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied. provisions as so applied.

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

(a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
(b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Bullot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling

295. The returning officer (for the ward) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each ward to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:-

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

(a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he

(a) open the ballot-ora at the poining booth at which he presides; and
(b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected;

are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and.

(c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and

(d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and

(a) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

(a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915.

(3) The returning officer shall—

(a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and

(b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officer shall as soon as practicable—

(4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
(a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
(b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole ward the number of first preference votes malled by each candidate return for the whole ward the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons them—

(1) open all the scaled parcels containing weed hellet.

(a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballotpapers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballotpapers made up by himself; and
(b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot papers counted to such defeated candidates shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the yoters' preference.

candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly efected. lufe majority of voiclared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared de-

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes-
 - (a) all ballot papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballotboxes: and
 - (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.
- (13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the Local Government Act 1915.

Deposit Moneus.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the Local Government Act 1915 as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the can-
- (b) also write on the bands-paper the suitable of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and
 mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
 (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent
 votes for such remaining candidates numbering them
 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.
- (2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the city of Footscray of the provisions of The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915 relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.

For funerals separate prices must be stated for adults, for children above five years under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including still-born—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees. For removals separate prices must be stated for adults and children under seven years of age.

Tenderers are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- I. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the Cemeteries Act 1915 (No. 2620), section 50, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.
- 2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the decased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.
- 3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.
- 4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or rehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 16.
- 5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.
- 6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drouned and long in the water, or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an injectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinclined coffins, hermetically scaled by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.
- 7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.
- 8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.
- 9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.
- 10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the Contractor.

- 11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.
- 12. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and vater-tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.
- 13. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.
- 14. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, on report of the Tender Board, to the immediate cancellation of his contract. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.
