Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WIREWORKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 31st July, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to “determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed either inside or outside a factory or work-room in the process, trade, or business of:—

“A wire-worker, using six gauge or smaller wire, but not including persons employed in making wire netting, barbed wire, wire nails, or wire mattresses,”

has made the following Determination, viz. :—

(1) That on the 31st day of July, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(2) Apprentices or Improvers.	Juvenile Workers, i.e., persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices and Improvers) engaged minding swift, blacking, painting, or oiling, carrying or moving material, packing, cleaning up factory, or going messages. (5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Health Act 1919.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area, viz.:—

- (a) From the intersection of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commissioners' Water Channel and Mason-street, Bacchus Marsh (at Mr. George Muir's), along the said Water Channel to the Melbourne-Ballarat railway line; thence in a direct line to the south-west corner of Gaynor's Estate; thence along the southerly boundary of the estate of the intersection with Fiskens-street; thence along Fiskens-street to its intersection with the Melbourne-Ballarat road; thence easterly to the boundary between Messrs. Charlton and Loeper's properties; thence in a direct line to the south-east corner of the subdivision of Dickson's Estate and Mason-street; thence along Mason-street to the starting point.—From the intersection of Mason-street to the Lerderberg River, including the whole of the township of Darley.

- (b) The above description shall include all houses abutting on both sides of the streets and roads mentioned, which are built within 100-yards of the said street or road.

4. The occupier of all premises within the prescribed area shall provide a closet or privy on such premises, and shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used, for the double-pan service, hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The closet or privy to be provided shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the necessary apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material, to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and situated so as to afford

easy means of access for the purpose of removing and replacing the pan. All privies shall also be provided with proper openings or flues for ventilation.

6. The Council shall cause every closet or privy to be supplied and kept supplied with two pans for the reception of night-soil and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

7. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such privy or closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly, and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

8. The Council shall, at least once a week, cause the pan in use to be closed with a lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the day-time, and the other pan to be left in its place.

9. The Council, before leaving any pan in a closet or privy, shall cause the same to be thoroughly cleansed by superheated steam and tar-painted inside, or by some equally efficient means.

10. The Council may, where a satisfactory septic tank is installed, and on the written recommendation of the Health Officer and Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the area above defined from the operation of this By-law.

11. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises except in accordance with this By-law.

12. The Council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied, and for the removal of night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

13. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or it shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 10th day of May, 1920, and confirmed on the 14th day of June, 1920.

(5) The rates and conditions which shall be imposed in respect of the carriage of Theatrical Scenery, Properties and Luggage; Commercial Travellers' Samples; Circuses by Special Trains; and Light and Bulky Traffic carried by Goods Trains, both for local and Inter-State traffic, shall be as set forth hereunder:—

(a) Theatrical Scenery, Properties and Luggage.

The rates to be charged for the conveyance of theatrical scenery, properties and luggage, shall be 9d. per 4-wheeled truck per mile, minimum charge 23s., and 1s. per bogie truck per mile, minimum charge 34s. 6d., and that when two 4-wheeled trucks are used in lieu of a bogie truck the charge for the two 4-wheeled trucks shall be the same as for a bogie truck.

The same allowance shall be made to Assistants travelling with Commercial Travellers on production of satisfactory evidence that they are *bonâ fide* Assistants.

The rates to be charged for the conveyance of excess samples carried by Commercial Travellers holding periodical tickets for the period covered by their tickets shall be as follow :—

Yearly Ticket holders	£9 per cwt. per annum.
Half-yearly Ticket holders	£6 14s. per cwt. per half-year.
Quarterly Ticket holders	£3 18s. per cwt. per quarter.

(c) Charges for Circuses by Special Trains.

When Circuses are conveyed by Special Trains, and the load does not exceed the capacity of a "DD" Class Engine, the charge shall be 16s. for each train mile on the forward, and 13s. for each train mile on the Return Journey, if completed within one month. If the load of any such Special Train exceeds the capacity of a "DD" Class Engine and a second engine is necessary for the whole, or part, of the journey, the charge shall be 5s. per mile extra in respect of the mileage over which the second engine is used. The loading and unloading shall be performed by the owners or their agents at their own risk and expense, and the average revenue payable to the Department shall not be less than £25 per day in respect of each Special Train.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1920.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1920 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Trust District:—

I. For each vacant allotment of land of an area not exceeding one acre in extent, and on which no service-pipe has been laid, but which abuts on a street or road on which a main is laid, a rate of Five shillings shall be paid for the year; and for each such allotment of land of an area exceeding one acre in extent, a rate of Threepence for each additional acre shall be paid. Vacant allotments on which a service-pipe is laid shall be charged double the above rate.

II. For all lands and tenements within the Trust District of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

III. For all lands and tenements of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Seymour.

IV. For every steam-boiler supplied with water, a charge of Five pounds will be made for the year 1920.

V. Water troughs will be supplied at charges as follows:— For each trough or tub in an allotment of five acres or under, a charge of Fifteen shillings shall be made for the year; and for each acre above five acres, a charge of One shilling per acre shall be made in addition to the payment of Fifteen shillings for the first five acres. But this charge shall not be enforced on tubs or receptacles of any kind in a house yard unless used to water stock. The maximum amount to be paid for a supply of water to any trough shall be Five pounds per annum. For the supply of water to each hotel trough, a charge of One pound ten shillings shall be paid for the year.

VI. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum amount so charged for the year 1920 shall be 10,000 gallons.

VII. Gardens or orchards using water will be supplied by meter at the following charges:—Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; the minimum amount to be charged for the year 1920 shall be 15,000 gallons.

VIII. The above-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1920, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1920, and such rate shall be payable on the first day of July, 1920.

The charge for water shall be payable quarterly or at such time as payment may be demanded by the Trust. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

TOWER HILL GENERAL CEMETERY. RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1915*, the Trustees of the Tower Hill General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be, and are, hereby rescinded.
2. That all fees and charges payable to the Trustees shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
3. That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, or tombstone, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such persons so applying a grant in the form specified in Schedule A.
4. That the Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under direction of the Sexton, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
5. That any person desiring to add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to add to or amend a monument or tombstone, or to erect a cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the Cemetery, shall apply in writing to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work. And a drawing of every pedestal or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the Trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given.
6. That all applications for interment shall be made at the Cemetery at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
7. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
8. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased thereon.
9. That every adult grave shall be at least six feet deep and every child's grave four feet six inches deep.

10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the Deputy-Registrar of Deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the Cemetery.

11. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follow:—
On week days—September to April, inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August, inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

12. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the Trustees.

13. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

14. That every funeral shall enter the Cemetery by the principal entrance. No vehicle, except hearses and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or stand opposite the entrance gates, save for the purpose of with all due despatch driving away, after loading or unloading. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery.

15. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave. No bath, caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.

16. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

17. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

18. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

19. That the Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.

20. That before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the Trustees a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the licence of a law officer authorized in that behalf, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

21. That any workman or other employee, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the Cemetery be subject to the supervision, directions, and control of the Sexton, and shall obey all such directions, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the Regulations, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

22. That any person taking any part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—
First—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work. Second—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave. Third—That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the Sexton, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft from rain or otherwise. Work in all cases is to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

23. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.

24. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the Cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

25. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein.

26. That no dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery.

27. That no person in the Cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance, or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border, railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying-place.

28. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

29. That "the Sexton," as referred to in these Rules, means the person for the time being in charge of the Cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the directions of the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be, and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

30. That no person employed under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees.

31. That any person employed under the Trustees accepting any such gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

32. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees or the Sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

33. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, shall be kept at the office of the Trustees and may be inspected at the charge set out in the Schedule, and registers of all grants will be kept by the Secretary.

The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.

COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

How Votes to be Marked by Voter.

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each deputy returning officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

(3) The returning officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.

Invalid Ballot-papers.

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

Ballot-papers Not Invalid.

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect to according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.

295. The returning officer (for the riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

Procedure where only Two Candidates.

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Procedure where more than Two Candidates.

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer, and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
 - arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
 - count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
 - make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
 - abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
 - add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

(5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—
 (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and
 (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

Deposit Moneys.

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

Voting by Post.

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and
 (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the shire of Keilor of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.
