REGULATIONS RELATING TO VACCINATION
AGAINST SMALL-POX.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of
July, 1920.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Lawson | Mr. Mackinnon.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, No. 3041, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Vaccination Regulations 1920," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. All Regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein are hereby repealed.
3. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Successful Vaccination" means that the course of the eruption produced by inoculation with vaccine corresponds with the description contained in the Schedule hereto.

"Vaccine" means the lymph obtained from the lesions produced by inoculating a calf with the virus of or derived from cow-pox, and includes the vaccine provided by the Commission and such other vaccine as is approved by the Commission.

4. The manner in which vaccination shall be performed and the precautions to be observed by those performing it and by the persons vaccinated or by the parents of children vaccinated shall be as hereunder prescribed :—

(1) Every vaccinator shall—

- (a) Thoroughly cleanse the skin at the site selected for inoculation and render it aseptic by any generally accepted surgical method;
- (b) Sterilize the inoculating instrument immediately before using;
- (c) Penetrate the asepticized skin with the inoculating instrument to the upper layers of the dermis by—
 - (i) puncture, or
 - (ii) oblique incision, or
 - (iii) linear scarification or abrasion, and the extent of the lesions so produced shall be such as to cause the formation of at least one-half of one square inch of vesicular surface;
- (d) Smear the vaccine over the wounded parts and gently rub it in with a sterile appliance; and
- (e) Place over the inoculated parts sterile dressing, and fix it in position by strips of plaster or by other suitable means.

(2) Every person vaccinated and the parent of every child vaccinated shall faithfully carry out the directions of the vaccinator.

5. The fees to be paid to public vaccinators and registrars for the performance of duties imposed on them under the Act shall be as prescribed hereunder :—

- (1) A fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be paid by the Public Health Department to every public vaccinator for every certificate of successful vaccination or of insusceptibility issued by him provided the provisions of the Act and the Regulations thereunder have been duly complied with.
- (2) No fee shall be paid to any public vaccinator for any certificate of successful vaccination or of insusceptibility issued by him unless the vaccination shall have been done in the place for which he is the duly appointed public vaccinator.
- (3) A fee of One shilling shall be paid by the Public Health Department to the registrar (not being a member of the Public Service) for every case of successful vaccination in his district registered by him in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Regulations thereunder, and a similar fee for registering every statutory declaration made and transmitted to him in accordance with the provisions of the Act and issuing a certificate, in the form of the Seventh Schedule of the Act, to the parent.

6. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations or is guilty of any neglect or disobedience thereof is liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

7. The forms of certificates, notices, statements, returns, and books of record to be used in connexion with vaccination or otherwise under Part VII. of the *Health Act 1919* and the particulars therein contained shall be as hereunder prescribed :—

SCHEDULE.

PRIMARY VACCINATION.

*Stage of Incubation (1st to 5th day).—*Shortly after inoculation with vaccine, a faint wheal appears at the site of the lesions, but this soon vanishes. Slight irritation and itching may persist for about 24 hours. On the 3rd day the lesions are surrounded by a narrow zone of redness, and on the 5th day vesicles appear.

*Stage of Vesiculation (5th to 8th day).—*At first the lymph in the vesicles is clear, but gradually becomes turbid, causing the epidermal covering to have a pearly appearance. The vesicles, which are multilocular, increase superficially until the 8th day, when they attain their maximum size. Shortly after the vesicle is well developed its centre becomes depressed, forming an umbilication. Surrounding the vesicle at the 8th day is a distinct inflammatory areola.

*Stage of Maturation (8th to 10th day).—*During this period the contents of the vesicles become thicker, and finally purulent. The inflammatory areola extends to the subjacent tissues, and increases in superficial area. The glands receiving the lymph from the part become enlarged and tender, and may be painful.

*Stage of Desiccation and Cicatrization (10th to 21st day).—*About the 11th day the centre of the lesion begins to form a crust of a brownish colour. The crust increases in size peripherally, until at about the 14th day the site of the vesicle is covered by a tough brown scab firmly adherent to subjacent tissue. This scab contracts, dries, and becomes of a blackish colour, and has usually become detached about the 21st day. The inflammatory areola concurrently with the formation of the crust begins to subside with epidermal desquamation. The cicatrix is at first slightly raised above the general surface and of a pink colour. It finally becomes depressed, and has a whitish appearance, with its surface dotted with foveations. Occasionally in place of foveations small ridges of a radial character appear.

SECONDARY VACCINATION.

The course of re-vaccination depends on the degree of immunity of the person inoculated. If the protective effect is exhausted, the course of the eruption will be similar to that of primary vaccination.

In some cases papules with a slightly inflamed base develop on the 5th day but do not go on to vesiculation.

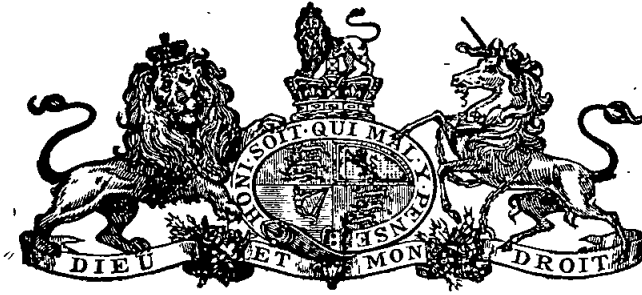
In other cases vesicles appear about the 5th day, forming crusts in a day or two. These crusts are superficial, and fall off about the 10th or 12th day.

In other instances the course varies between the foregoing and that of primary vaccination according to the degree of exhaustion of immunity.

And the Honorable Matthew Baird, His Majesty's Minister for Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
