LEONGATHA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Commissioners of the Leongatha Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts do hereby make the following By-law:—

*By-law No. 16.*

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate.

(I.) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partially as a domicile, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement shall be paid, provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to any tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building.

(II.) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment or vacant lot situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid, the rate to be paid shall be One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Ten shillings each be payable, except where the municipal valuation is less than Three pounds each, in which case the said rate shall not be less than Seven shillings and sixpence.

(III.) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in the streets or roads in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The rates herein made are for the year ending 31st December, 1920, and shall be due and payable in advance on the 2nd April, 1920.

4. Such person as the Commissioners shall appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates.

BY-LAW No. 27.

A By-law making rates and charges for water supplied within the Water Supply District of the Shire of Chiltern.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts Nos. 2747 and 2852, make the following rates upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Chiltern, such rates to come into operation for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1920, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1920, and the said rate shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, viz., on the 1st day of January, 1920, and the 1st day of July, 1920.

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds and under, 10 per cent. per annum on the amount of the 1915 valuation.
2. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, One pound per annum.
3. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding Thirty pounds, One pound five shillings per annum.
4. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds, and not exceeding Forty pounds, One pound ten shillings per annum.
5. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Forty pounds, and not exceeding Fifty pounds, One pound fifteen shillings per annum.
6. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifty pounds, and not exceeding Sixty pounds, Two pounds per annum.
7. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Sixty pounds, and not exceeding Eighty pounds, Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
8. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Eighty pounds and not exceeding One hundred pounds, Three pounds per annum.
9. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred pounds, and not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds, Four pounds per annum.
10. On every house and tenement above the annual value of One hundred and fifty pounds, and not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds, Five pounds per annum.
11. On every house and tenement above the annual value of Two hundred and fifty pounds, Six pounds per annum.
12. Water from the stand-pipe and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only at the following rates:—  
A licence to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand pipes, One pound per annum.  
A licence to cart water (with horse and dray) for use of licensee only, Ten shillings per annum.  
A licence to carry away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray, Five shillings per annum.
13. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure or by special agreement.
14. Water troughs, Five shillings per annum (providing ball regulating taps are used).
15. Livery stables, Ten shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).
16. Hotel, with stabling (not being a livery stable), Four shillings per stall (one stall allowed for every £50 of annual value).

- (1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the township of Toora, within the municipal district of the shire of South Gippsland, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the aforesaid Act.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
  - (a) Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
  - (b) Six o'clock on the evening of Friday;
  - (c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Thursday.

REGULATIONS IN CONNEXION WITH THE VOTE OF THREE THOUSAND POUNDS (£3,000) FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES, UNDER THE CONTROL OF BOROUGH COUNCILS, TRUSTEES, COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT, ETC.

A SUM of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1919, and 31st December, 1919, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1920. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A," and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B."
2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January, 1919, and 31st December, 1919, but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1919.
3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1919 (*vide* Form "A"), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

## CITY OF HAWTHORN.

## BY-LAW No. 76.

A By-law of the city of Hawthorn, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 76, for repealing clause B of By-law 71, for altering By-law No. 68, and for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings or erections.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. Clause (b) of By-law No. 71 of the city is hereby repealed.

2. The provisions of this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Hawthorn.

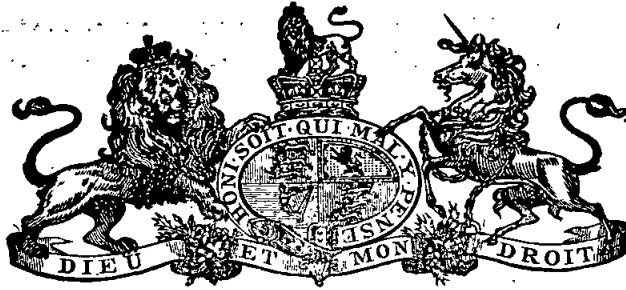
