A SUM of One thousand five hundred pounds (£1,500) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,500) shall be dealt with as follows:—

- 1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1919, and 31st December, 1919, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1920.
