IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. WHEREAS by section 18 of the *Unimproved Values Act 1915* (No. 3718), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations prescribing any matters necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying into effect the objects of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, for the purpose of giving effect to the objects of the said Act, make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

That where the provisions of the *Rating on Unimproved Values Act 1915* (No. 2718), as amended by the *Rating on Unimproved Values Act 1920* (No. 3060), has been adopted in any municipality, the forms and notices referred to hereafter shall be modified to conform to the requirements of the said Acts in the manner following:—

**FORM OF VALUATION AND RETURN.**

That the Form of Valuation and Return prescribed in the Fifteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* or under the provisions of any Act relating to local government shall be modified by setting forth in such form two additional columns under the respective headings "Unimproved Capital Value" and "Capital Improved Value."

**FORM OF RATE.**

That the Form of Rate prescribed in the Seventeenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* or under the provisions of any Act relating to local government shall be modified by setting forth in such form two additional columns under the respective headings "Unimproved Capital Value" and "Capital Improved Value."

That the heading to the said Seventeenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall be modified to read as follows:—

*Form of Rate.*

An assessment to the General Rate for the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 19\_\_\_\_, after the rate of \_\_\_\_\_ pence in the pound, by virtue of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the *Rating on Unimproved Values Act* for the period ending the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 19\_\_\_\_.

That under the provisions of any other Act relating to local government the Form of Rate prescribed or adopted shall be modified by indicating in such form that the rate is also by virtue of the *Rating on Unimproved Values Act*.

**ALTERATION OF VALUATIONS.**

That with regard to valuations made of rateable property on the basis of its capital improved value and at its annual value or net annual value (as the case may be), it shall only be necessary in event of any alteration being made in one or both of the said valuations as the result of successful appeals, for the said valuation or valuations, as the case requires, to be ruled through in red ink and the amended valuation or valuations written in red ink immediately above the original valuation and initialed in accordance with the provisions of any Act relating to local government.

That the columns "Reduced on Appeal," and "Initials of Chairman," as set out in the Form of Rate, shall be set apart and used only in cases of successful appeals against valuations on the basis of the unimproved capital value thereof.

**VALUATIONS TO BE MADE.**

That for the purpose of giving effect to the requirements of the *Rating on Unimproved Values Act* it shall be necessary for the Municipal Council to make the following valuations of rateable property, viz.:—

- (1) A valuation of rateable property computed at its unimproved capital value thereof.
- (2) A valuation of rateable property computed at its capital improved value thereof.
- (3) A valuation of rateable property computed at its annual value or net annual value (as the case may be).

**NOTICE OF VALUATIONS.**

That where it is required by the *Local Government Act 1915* or under the provisions of any Act relating to local government, for the Municipal Council to give notice in respect of each rateable property valued, it shall be necessary to set out in such notice the following valuations made in respect of such rateable property on the basis of—

- (1) the unimproved capital value;
- (2) the capital improved value; and
- (3) the annual value or net annual value (as the case may be).

*"Capital Improved Value."*

"Capital improved value" of land means the sum which the land if unencumbered by any lease mortgage or other charge thereon, might be expected to realize at the time of valuation or assessment if offered for sale on such reasonable terms and conditions as a *bona fide* seller might in ordinary circumstances be expected to require.

*"Unimproved Capital Value."*

"Unimproved capital value" of land means the sum which the owner's estate or interest therein if unencumbered by any mortgage or other charge thereon might in ordinary circumstances be expected to realize at the time of valuation or assessment if offered for sale on such reasonable terms and conditions as a *bona fide* seller might be expected to require and assuming that the improvements (if any) had not been made, provided that the unimproved capital value of land held under any lease or licence from the Crown for purposes other than mining is the unimproved value for the time being of such land after deducting such amount of the purchase money as has not for the time being become due and payable to the Crown.

*"Value of Improvements."*

"Value of improvements" means the sum by which the improvements upon land are estimated to increase its value if offered for sale on such reasonable terms and conditions as a *bona fide* seller might in ordinary circumstances be expected to require. Provided that the value of improvements (other than vineyards, orchards, hop gardens, and lucerne pastures) shall in no case be deemed to be more than the cost of such improvements estimated at the time of valuation or assessment exclusive of the cost of repairs and maintenance.

*"Annual Value" and "Net Annual Value."*

The "annual value" or the "net annual value" (as the case may be) of any rateable property means the annual value or the net annual value thereof computed as provided in any Act relating to local government.

## SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK IN THE PARISH OF WALLAN WALLAN.

THE Council of the shire of Broadmeadows, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park in the parish of Wallan Wallan, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

*Regulations.*

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for adjustment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care

shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations or by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

4. All such agreements to be for the period from the 1st day of October in any year to the 30th day of September in the following year, and to terminate on such latter date, irrespective of the date when entered into.

5. All such agreements to be subject to any restrictions as to supply of water for gardens which the Council may from time to time find it necessary or expedient to make.

6. The above charge to be payable in advance.

7. Sections 19 and 20 of the By-law numbered seven shall not apply to holders of garden licences.

8. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

- (c) use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene or insulting words; or
- (d) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive or insulting manner; or
- (e) be drunk; or
- (f) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such buildings, or in the corridors, aisles, landings, gangways or passages within the same.

3. Every person who shall by any wilful act be guilty of any breach of any provision of the foregoing By-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for any such breach.

One apprentice and one improver to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 78s. per week of 48 hours.

#### Females.

One apprentice and one improver to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 40s. per week of 48 hours.

(3) DEFINITION OF JUVENILE WORKERS.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed turning bags, sweeping trucks, receiving and placing sacks, driving friction winch, sewing mouths of bags, trucking sugar, sheathing bags, collecting samples, labelling, filling golden syrup and treacle tins.

(4) OVERTIME.—All work done in excess of 48 hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATE FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—All time worked excepting between 10 p.m. and midnight on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All time worked, excepting between 10 p.m. and midnight, on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), King's Birthday, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed the minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
