No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall nut in the Reserve any cattle horses.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for adjustment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Recovery of the committee of the Recovery o serve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in early while accordance of

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding (£10) Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care

3. The rate to be charged for each such garden licence shall be (in addition to the water rate payable in respect of the property) the following amount, viz.:—Seven shillings and sixpence.

4. All such agreements to be for the period from the 1st day of October in any year to the 30th day of September in the following year, and to terminate on such latter date, irrespective of the date when entered into.

5. All such agreements to be subject to any restrictions as to supply of water for gardens which the Council may from time to time find it necessary or expedient to make.

6. The above charge to be payable in advance.

7. Sections 19 and 20 of the By-law numbered seven shall not apply to holders of garden licences.

(b) disturb or interrupt any such meeting or gathering,
or take part, or in any manner connive at or assist
in such disturbances or interruption; or

(c) use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene or in-

sulting words; or (d) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive or insulting

manner; or

(c) be drunk; or

(f) cause any obstruction by standing or otherwise in the approaches to the external doors of such buildings, or in the corridors, aisles, landings, gangways or passages within the same.

3. Every person who shall by any wilful act be guilty of any breach of any provision of the foregoing By-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for any such breach. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the borough of Queenscliffe, and shall come into operation imediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

DETERMINATION OF THE SUGAR REFINERS BOARD.

⁽³⁾ Definition of Juvenile Workers.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) employed turning bags, sweeping trucks, receiving and placing sacks, driving friction which, sewing mouths of bags, trucking sugar, sheathing bags, collecting samples, labelling, filling golden syrup and treacte tims.

(4) Overtime.—All work done in excess of 48 hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(5) Special Rate for Suddays and Public Holidays.—All time worked excepting between 10 p.m. and midnight on Sundays. Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All time worked, excepting between 10 p.m. and midnight, on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Monday, 21st April (Right Hours Day), King's Birthday, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so embstituted.

(6) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines, under the provisions of Section 144 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person or persons or classes of persons employed at any work for which the Board has fixed the minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under tike conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can carn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
