Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SEWER BUILDERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 19th November, 1920, applied to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed as Labourers in connexion with the construction of sewers has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That, on the 19th November, 1920, the last previous Determination shall be revoked, and replaced by this Determination.

				(i) be wetted continuously from the feet to the knees; or		
				(ii) be wetted above the waist in the course of a shift through working clothes other than oilskins or other waterproof clothing, by water settling in or falling or dripping upon him,		
				shall be paid 1½d. per hour in addition to the above rates.		
				Any employee working at a depth of more than 20 feet and any topman working at a depth of more than 10 feet shall be paid 2d. per hour in addition to the above rates.		

(3) OVERTIME.—That any employee who works for any time in excess of 44 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and thereafter double time.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
