The estimated cost of such works, including portion of the cost of main channel from Waranga Reservoir for the supply of this and other districts is £30,000, whereof £550 represents liability to be transferred from the Deakin Irrigation and Water Supply District and £850 represents liability to be transferred from the Rochester Irrigation and Water Supply District.

The quantity of water proposed to be assigned to such district is thirty (30) cubic feet per second.

The source of supply is to be the Goulburn River by way of the Goulburn-Waranga main channel, the Waranga Reservoir, and the main channel westward therefrom.

The season at which such supply is to be received is to embrace the whole year.

RATING BY-LAW No. 1 MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF BET BET UNDER THE POWERS CONFERRED BY THE WATER ACTS.

THE following are the rates which owners and occupiers of houses and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year ending 30th September, 1921, in respect of water supplied by the Bet Bet Shire Council within the township of Tarnagulla, that is to say:—

On every occupied private tenement connected by pipe with the Council's main and on all stores and business places where one horse only is kept, a sum of One pound sterling.

On every tenement not connected with the main and on every unoccupied tenement, Ten shillings sterling.

On every store-room, Five shillings sterling.

On every store or business place where two or more horses are kept, on all butchers' premises, and all bank premises, Two pounds sterling.

On all hotels, including attached stables and domiciles, Two pounds ten shillings sterling.

On all Government buildings, including quarters, Three pounds sterling.

In all the above cases water shall be for domestic purposes only.

For every boiler used to generate steam for milling or other industrial purposes, a charge of Ten pounds shall be made, the Council reserving the right to discontinue the supply when necessary to conserve a domestic supply for householders.

No person shall attach a hose to any tap or pipe for the purpose of watering gardens. Any person so using water without written permission from the Council will be liable to be prosecuted.

The above rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1921, and such person as the Bet Bet Shire Council may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the above said rates.

By virtue of the Water Acts, By-law for Imposing, Levying, and Receiving Water Rates and Charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

THE following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1921, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being of the annual value of Twenty pounds or less, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.).

3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement, being above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in the pound of such valuation.

4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid a main pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Eighteen pounds. Where such valuation exceeds Eighteen pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Seventeen shillings be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall have been laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall be paid.

6. Every consumer of water must provide meters; all excess water over allotment covered by the valuation rate to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons.

The above rates shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921, No. 16.

THE Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

By-law No. 16.

1. For determining the rates to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic use.

2. For making and levying such rate—

(1) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used

- either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement does not exceed the sum of Two hundred pounds, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid. Provided that the said rate shall not in any case be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings per annum.
- (2) For every house or tenement situate in any street or road where pipes have been laid for the supply of water thereto, such house or tenement being used either wholly or partly as a domicile, where the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement exceeds the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling, a rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling for the first Two hundred pounds and Fourpence in the pound sterling for any amount over and above the sum of Two hundred pounds sterling upon the municipal valuation, for the time being, of such house or tenement shall be paid.
- (3) For every occupied or unoccupied allotment, or vacant lot, the rate to be paid shall be at the rate of Eightpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuation of such allotment. Provided that in no case shall a less rate than Six shillings be charged.
- (4) For every township allotment on which there is a stock trough or any other facility for watering stock, a charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum shall be paid.
- (5) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

3. The foregoing rate for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1921, shall be due and payable in two equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July, 1921.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rate.

MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust.

(1) For every house, including not more than $\frac{1}{4}$ acre of land, and of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the minimum charge shall be Thirty shillings.

(2) For every house, &c., of annual municipal value of £21 to £60 inclusive, a rate of Two shillings in the £ shall be paid, and any such properties exceeding £60 annual municipal value, shall pay a rate of One shilling in the £ for every pound over and above £60 annual valuation.

(3) All shops and places of business, with an annual municipal value below £20, shall be rated at Two shillings in the £. The stationmaster's residence to be charged for only $\frac{1}{2}$ connected, at the same rate as house and $\frac{1}{4}$ acre below £20 valuation.

(4) Land adjoining house properties of value not exceeding £20, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for each quarter acre over and above the $\frac{1}{4}$ acre allowed with the house, up to a maximum of Ten shillings.

(5) Detached allotments shall be charged for as follows:—Not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ acre Five shillings, not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre Seven shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 1 acre Ten shillings, not exceeding $1\frac{1}{4}$ acres Twelve shillings and sixpence, not exceeding 2 acres Fifteen shillings, and if more than 2 acres Twenty shillings.

(6) The charge for water supplied by the Trust, by measure, except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust, shall be One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(7) For water supplied to public buildings, and other similar properties, the charge shall be as follows:—Police Station, State School, Post Office, Railway Station, £2. Mechanics' Institute, Recreation Reserve, £1 10s. Masonic Hall, Temperance Hall, £1 per annum. The water for church, and Sunday school grounds shall not be charged for.

(8) For every public water trough, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be £4 per annum.

(9) The Trust may in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier, using water for domestic or other purposes, that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide and fix a meter within 21 days after the sending of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, and at his own expense, provide and fix an approved meter.

(10) Provided that where any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, and is willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have the power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment of the water supplied.

(11) In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

(12) In the event of any dispute which may arise, regarding the charge made by the Trust, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special charge.

(13) The beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February, 1921, except in the cases of water supplied by measure, the charges for which shall be annual and payable on the first day of December in each year.

(14) For water supplied from standpipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge of 1s. for every 200 gallons or under.

(15) Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose, shall be authorized to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of the By-law, the word person shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust, shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 24 of the Education Act 1915 (No. 2844), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XII.(A), Teachers' College Courses, and Regulation XII.(B), Trained Teachers' Certificate, Commercial Subjects, of the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, and doth substitute the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XII.(A).—TEACHERS' COLLEGE COURSES.

1. The members of the Teachers' College shall be a principal, two vice-principals, masters and mistresses of method, lecturers, and students.

The students in attendance at the College shall be—

- (a) Studentship holders—those to whom the course of instruction is free.
- (b) Students who pay the fees hereinafter prescribed.
2. Training will be conducted at the College and at the Melbourne University, and in such other institutions as the Director may determine.

Practising schools for the training of students in teaching shall be associated with the College, and training therein shall be conducted under the supervision of the Principal and such officers of the College as he may appoint.

3. The duration of the courses of training shall be—

- (a) Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate—four years (of which only the second, third, and fourth are spent at the College).
- (b) Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate—two years (of which only the second is spent at the College).
- (c) Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate—three years (of which only the second and third are spent at the College).

4. (a) Awards of studentships will be made annually by the Director in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

(b) The number of studentships to be awarded for each of the Certificates mentioned in clause 3 above shall be determined annually by the Director.

Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate.

5. The qualifications for studentships admitting to the second year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate are:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least eighteen years of age.
- (b) They must have passed the School Leaving Certificate examination or hold an approved equivalent qualification.
- (c) They must, except in the case of University graduates in Arts or Science, have had at least one year's teaching experience in an approved school and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

6. Applicants holding the qualifications prescribed for admission to the third or the fourth year of the course may, at the discretion of the Principal, be admitted to the year for which they are qualified, provided that any such applicant who has not had sufficient preliminary teaching experience may be required to spend a year upon the staff of a school, and during this year, if employed in a State school, he shall be paid the salary of a junior teacher of the second year.

7. When the number of qualified applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate under clause 5 above exceeds the number of studentships available, studentships will be awarded in order of merit as determined by the following considerations:—

- (a) The number and standard of the subjects passed at examinations by the applicants. (Studentships will be distributed among applicants specially qualified, in the following groups:—English and history, mathematics, science, modern languages, classics.)
- (b) The records of the applicants as teachers.
- (c) Length of service and age of the applicants.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in the above clauses, holders of senior scholarships under the provisions of Regulation XXI. may enter at once upon the second year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate.

9. (a) The course of training for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate shall extend over four years, the first of which shall be spent as a teacher on the staff of an approved school.

(b) The second, third, and fourth years of the course shall be the course for the Diploma of Education at the Melbourne University, together with a course in drawing, music, manual work, and physical training.

Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.

10. The qualifications for studentships admitting to the second year of the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate are:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least eighteen years of age.
- (b) They must have passed the examination (including a pass in the subject of arithmetic) qualifying them for matriculation at the Melbourne University, or must hold an approved equivalent qualification.
- (c) They must have had at least one year's experience as a teacher in an approved school and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

11. (a) The course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate shall extend over two years, the first of which shall be spent as a teacher on the staff of an approved school.

(b) The course for the second year shall include:—

Professional Subjects.

1. Regular and continuous practice in teaching and observation, extending over at least 150 hours, of which at least 30 hours shall be devoted to a study of rural school organization and methods.
2. Attendance and taking part in criticism and demonstration lessons.
3. Psychology and theory and history of education.
4. Methods of teaching English and English literature, mathematics, science and agriculture, nature-study, history, and geography.
5. Blackboard work—writing and illustration.
6. Hygiene.
7. Voice culture.
8. Physical training.

Culture Subjects.

1. English literature.
2. History (including European history).
3. Choral singing and music.
4. Drawing.
5. Manual arts.
6. Nature-study and agriculture.

Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate.

12. The qualifications for studentships admitting to the second year of the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate are:—

- (a) Applicants must be at least eighteen years of age.
- (b) They must have passed the examination (including a pass in the subject of arithmetic) qualifying them for matriculation at the Melbourne University, or must hold an approved equivalent qualification.
- (c) They must have had at least one year's experience as a teacher in an approved school and be recommended for a studentship by an inspector of schools.

13. (a) The course of training for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate shall, except as hereinafter provided, extend over a period of three years, the first of which shall be spent as a teacher on the staff of an approved school.

(b) The course for the second year shall include:—

1. Psychology and child study.
2. Kindergarten principles and biography.
3. Management and method of kindergarten.
4. English literature.
5. Voice production, physical training, games.
6. Music—Singing (theory and practice), instrumental music.

7. Drawing.
8. Kindergarten gifts, and occupations; needlework.
9. Nature-study.
10. Practice and observation in the kindergarten and infants' school extending over at least 200 hours.

(c) The courses for the third year shall include:—

1. Psychology and child study.
2. Mother play, Montessori, and other developments.
3. History and principles of education.
4. Infant-school management, method, and organization; rural school method and organization.
5. Art studies, myths, stories and storytelling.
6. Voice production, physical training, games, drills.
7. Music—Singing (theory and practice), instrumental music.
8. Drawing.
9. Educational handwork and needlework.
10. Nature-study and gardening.
11. Hygiene.
12. Practice and observation as for the first year, but mainly taken with sub-primary grades, and extending over at least 200 hours.

Method of Award of Studentships.

14. When the number of qualified applicants for studentships in the course for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate under clause 10 or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate under clause 12 exceeds the number of studentships available, studentships will be awarded in order of merit as determined by the following considerations:—

- (a) The number and standard of the subjects passed at examinations by the applicants.
- (b) The records of the applicants as teachers.
- (c) Length of service and age of the applicants.

Allowances.

15. (a) Holders of studentships may be allowed to reside at the College upon the payment of £12 per annum towards the expense of their board and residence. In the event of the holder of such studentship not being in a position to pay the amount above stipulated (viz. £12 for each year during the currency of his studentship), the Minister may allow him, on his entering into a bond by himself and an approved surety, to pay such amount at such time and in such instalments as the Minister may determine.

(b) Holders of studentships who do not reside at the College will be entitled to an allowance at the rate of £18 per annum towards board and residence.

(c) Holders of studentships will be granted an allowance at the rate of £12 per annum towards defraying their personal expenses during the currency of their studentships.

(d) The provisions of sub-clauses (a), (b), and (c) of this clause shall not apply to those holders of studentships who are also holders of senior scholarships under the provisions of Regulation XXI.

Agreement to Serve.

16. Every person awarded a studentship will be required as a condition of such studentship to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for the four years next after the termination of his studentship, to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.

Women students may, in the event of their marriage, be permitted to resign at the expiration of three years' service after the termination of their studentships.

Examinations.

17. Examinations in the subjects of the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate and of the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, and in such subjects of the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate as are not provided for in the course for the Diploma of Education, shall be conducted by the Board of Examiners for the College appointed for the purpose by the Director, and composed of representatives of the College staff and of external examiners.

18. Students who complete successfully any of the courses set out under clauses 9, 11, and 13 above shall be awarded the Trained Teacher's Certificate for that course, but in no case shall the certificate be issued to any student till such student has satisfactorily performed the duties of a teacher for a period of two years after the termination of his studentship, and has also fully qualified for the Primary Teacher's Certificate—Second Class—as set out in Regulation XI.

19. (a) Any student who is a candidate for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate and who fails to pass in either the second or third year of his course may, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners for the College, be allowed to enter upon the second year of the course of training for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, and upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects of this year of the course shall be regarded as having completed such course, or, by special permission of the Director, such student may have his studentship suspended for one or more years in order that he may, at his own expense, complete such second or third year of his course. Any student who fails to pass in the fourth year of the course for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate may, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners, be permitted to complete the course at his own expense, or he may apply to the Board to review the examinations and tests he has passed during his course of training, in order to determine if he has qualified for a pass in the second year of the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate.

(b) Any student who fails to pass in not more than two subjects of the second year for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate but who shows satisfactory progress during that year, may, at the discretion of the Board of Examiners for the College, be allowed to enter upon the course for the third year, and upon passing a satisfactory examination in the subjects of such year of the course may be regarded as having completed the course.

(c) Students who at the end of their course of training have failed to pass in any subject or subjects prescribed for a Trained Teacher's Certificate may be allowed to present themselves in such subject or subjects at any examination for such Trained Teacher's Certificate.

Extension of Studentships.

20. (a) Students, not exceeding six in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting

special merit and aptitude for further training, may be selected to undertake a further course for one or two years under such conditions as the Director may from time to time determine.

(b) Students not exceeding ten in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training may have their studentships extended for one year for the purpose of undertaking a special course in some branch or branches of study, and of attending such courses of study as the Director may determine.

(c) Students, not exceeding four in number in each year, who have qualified for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, and are recommended by the Principal as exhibiting special merit and aptitude for further training, may have their studentships extended for one year for the purpose of undertaking a special course in some branch or branches of study, and of attending such courses of study as the Director may determine.

(d) Each year two students of the College may be selected, by reason of special merit and aptitude, to undertake at the Melbourne University the course for the degree of Bachelor of Agricultural Science. During the currency of this course, such students will retain all the rights and privileges of studentship holders in the matter of status and allowances. They will spend the second year of this course at Dookie Agricultural College or other institution recommended by the Professor of Agriculture, and the cost of their maintenance during this year will be defrayed by the Council of Agricultural Education.

21. In special cases, any person awarded a studentship may have his studentship suspended for one year at the discretion of the Director, but shall not be entitled to any rights and privileges as a studentship holder other than those accruing to him in virtue of his original studentship.

Fees for Students Not Holders of Studentships.

22. (a) Students other than holders of studentships, may on payment of a fee of £6 6s. per annum to the Accountant of the Education Department, and of £6 6s. per annum to the Melbourne University, be admitted to the course of instruction at the College for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate, provided that they have passed the examination prescribed for matriculation at the Melbourne University, and are at least 17 years of age, and are of good character and physique. The receipts for this fee must be presented to the Principal of the College on or before the first day of each term.

(b) Students, other than holders of studentships, may, on payment of a fee of £10 10s. per annum, be admitted to the course of instruction at the College for the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate. The above fee must be paid to the Accountant of the Education Department, and the receipts presented to the Principal of the College on or before the first day of each term. Students admitted under this sub-clause must be at least 17 years of age, of good character and physique, and must have passed the School Intermediate examination or an approved equivalent examination.

(c) Students, other than holders of studentships, may, on payment of a fee of £6 6s. per annum, be admitted to the course of lectures for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate extending over two years. On passing through a course of practical training approved by the Director in each year, they will be examined in the theory and practice of infant-room work and in the other subjects of their course. Students who successfully complete this course and the necessary examinations will be awarded the Infant Teacher's Certificate.

(d) Students may be admitted to the College for portions of any of the courses mentioned in clause 3. The fees payable for subjects not taken at the University are:—

- (1) For education (theory and practice), £6 6s. per annum.
- (2) For education (theory only), £3 3s. per annum.
- (3) For education (practice only), £3 3s. per annum.
- (4) For other subjects, £1 1s. per annum.

The above fees must be paid to the Accountant of the Education Department, and the receipt presented to the Principal of the College on or before the first day of each term.

23. Special students, such as graduates of the University, holders of the Infant Teacher's Certificate—First Class—or persons holding Trained Teacher's Certificates entitling them to registration as primary or secondary teachers, may be allowed to complete the course for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate in one year. Such students will be required to pass in the subjects of the third year's course and in hygiene, and in gifts and occupations of the second year's course, and will be required also to pass the tests in practice of teaching prescribed for both years.

24. Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and who have attended a course of instruction and training specified above, and who have complied with the conditions prescribed, will be admitted to the final examination for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, as the case may be, without further payment.

25. Students who have paid the prescribed fees, and who qualify for the Trained Secondary Teacher's Certificate or Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate, or for the Trained Infant Teacher's Certificate, will be awarded certificates, but such certificates shall not necessarily entitle the holders to employment in State schools. Such persons, however, are eligible to be recorded on the Employment Register for appointment to positions in State schools as classified teachers.

Discipline.

26. Students will be required to attend such lectures, courses of instruction, criticism lessons, and teaching practice as the Principal may direct.

27. (a) Students will be liable to dismissal from the College for idleness, misconduct, unpunctuality, absence from lectures, or breaches of the rules of the College.

(b) Students who at any period of their course fail to show satisfactory progress, or fail to pass the annual examinations, may have their studentships withdrawn; and thereupon all allowances and benefits under this regulation shall cease and determine.

(c) Students will be examined from time to time by a medical officer; and, if the medical report is not satisfactory, a student may have his studentship withdrawn.

28. The Principal will furnish an annual report to the Minister, and he will also twice each year furnish to the Director a report on the conduct, efficiency, and aptitude of each student, and for purposes of classification will assign to each a numerical estimate.

29. No person shall be awarded a studentship in any of the courses of training mentioned above until he has submitted a certificate from a School Medical Officer or from a qualified medical practitioner approved for this purpose by the Director that he is of sound constitution, and is free from any physical defect likely to impair his usefulness as a teacher. When the medical examination of such persons discloses minor defects of a remediable character, such as unsound teeth, post-nasal growths, or defects in eyesight or hearing, such student may, at the discretion of the Director, be allowed to enter upon his studentship for a period of three months on probation. At the end of such probationary period, the studentship may be withdrawn from such student if satisfactory treatment of the defects referred to has not been carried out.

REGULATION XII. (B).—TRAINED TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.— COMMERCIAL SUBJECTS.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish a course of training to be conducted at the Teachers' College and the Essendon High School or such other institutions as the Director may determine for persons desirous of qualifying as teachers of commercial subjects. This course will be under the supervision of the Principal of the Teachers' College, the Head Master of the Essendon High School, and such other officers as may be appointed.

2. Studentships will carry with them the salary to which the applicants would be entitled as junior teachers in State schools, and will be awarded under the following conditions:—

(a) Applicants must be junior teachers in the service of the Education Department, and must be not less than 17 years of age on the date of commencement of the course.

(b) They must have passed the School Intermediate examination or some higher examination of the Melbourne University, or must hold an approved equivalent qualification.

(c) They must produce satisfactory evidence of having undergone sufficient preliminary preparation in commercial subjects to enable them to enter on the course.

(d) They must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character, of sound bodily health, and of freedom from defects likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.

3. Students who satisfactorily complete the course of training mentioned in clause 1 above will be awarded the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Commercial Subjects.

4. For the purpose of classification, appointment, and promotion, the Trained Teacher's Certificate—Commercial Subjects—shall be regarded as equivalent to the Trained Primary Teacher's Certificate under Regulation XII. (A); and the conditions specified in that regulation with regard to agreement to serve, failure to pass examinations, and discipline shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to students under this regulation.

5. This regulation shall come into force as from 1st January, 1920, and shall expire on 31st December, 1920. Provided, however, that, in a special case, a student who does not complete his course during the year 1920 may have his studentship extended during the whole or portion of the year 1921.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council is empowered by the *Stock Foods Act 1915* (Consolidated) to make Regulations as to any matters whatsoever not being contrary to the provisions of this Act necessary to give effect to this Act. And whereas certain Regulations were made under the *Stock Foods Act 1915* on the 28th day of August, 1916. And whereas it is desired to rescind such Regulations and to make others in lieu thereof. Now therefore the Governor in Council in the State of Victoria doth hereby rescind the aforesaid Regulations, and order as follows, that is to say:—

1. The substances mentioned and set forth in the second column of the Schedule hereunder are hereby prescribed to be "foreign ingredients" relative to "stock food". The proportion or amount of such "foreign ingredients" which may be contained in any kind of "stock food" shall not exceed the proportion or amount placed in the third column of the said Schedule opposite the name or description of such kind of "stock food" in the first column of such Schedule.

2. The word "person" wherever appearing in these Regulations shall include a firm, company, or association, and words importing the singular shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

3. On the sale or offering or exposure for sale of any hay or hay chaff the vendor shall set forth in every invoice, agreement, or circular, or advertisement relating thereto, the nature of the cereal or cereals, legume or legumes, grass or grasses, whereof the same has been, or is to be, made, and if not made wholly from one sort of cereal, legume, or grass, the relative proportions of the constituents thereof.

4. On the sale or offering or exposure for sale of any mixed, concentrated, or prepared stock food or by-products, the vendor shall set forth in every invoice, agreement, circular, or advertisement relating thereto the relative proportions of the constituents thereof.

5. No person shall sell or have in his possession or control for the purpose of sale any straw-chaff unless the bins, boxes, bags or other receptacles thereof, of whatsoever nature are distinctly and indelibly marked in a prominent place with the words "straw-chaff" in letters not less than 2½ inches in height and ½ inch in thickness.

6. No person dealing in chaff shall keep or store straw-chaff within a distance of 10 feet from any hay-chaff, unless in a separate room or store with no door or opening immediately communicating with the place of storage of such hay-chaff.

7. No person dealing in chaff shall place or permit or suffer any straw-chaff to be placed or to be in the same room or compartment as or adjacent to any machine or implement used or intended for, the mixing or blending of chaff or any such machine or contrivance for conveyance of chaff to such mixer or blender.

8. (a) Every person dealing in straw-chaff or grain-hulls shall keep a register in the form and giving the particulars as under:—

(b) Such person shall keep such Register or cause the same to be kept entered up to date; and shall keep or cause the same to be kept available at all reasonable times for the inspection of any Inspector.

9. On the face of every document delivered as an "invoice" under the Act the "vendor" shall cause to be legibly printed or written the word "invoice".

10. The fee for any analysis under the Act shall be Ten shillings and sixpence per statutory sample (or for any sample of equal amount).

11. Every person dealing in stock food shall keep a copy of these Regulations constantly affixed in legible characters in or on some conspicuous place in every shop, shed, warehouse, or other place whatsoever (whether enclosed or not) where such person or any employee or agent of such person shall be engaged in cutting, selling, or distributing chaff.

12. The penalty for any contravention of these Regulations shall be a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

And the HONORABLE HENRY SUTHERLAND WIGHTMAN LAWSON, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.**

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act* 1915 (No. 2761) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the municipalities of the city of Ballarat and the town of Ballarat East for the proclamation of a sewerage district and for the constitution of a Sewerage Authority to carry out works for the sewerage of the city of Ballarat and the town of Ballarat East for the purposes of the said Act, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

- (a) That the amount of money to be borrowed by such Sewerage Authority shall be Six thousand pounds (£6,000) for detail, survey, revised estimates, and report on scheme.
- (b) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation, branch mains, sub-mains, main outfall sewer, works for treatment; and for discharge of purified effluent into the Yarrowee Creek.
- (c) That the limits of the land within which the said Sewerage Authority shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at a point fifty links east of the north-east angle of allotment 25, section U, Sol-

diers' Hill, parish of Ballaarat, county of Grenville; thence by a straight line bearing due west to the north-west angle of the Public Gardens Reserve; thence by a line bearing south to the southern side of the main line of road from Ballaarat to Raglan; thence by southern boundary of said road bearing north seventy degrees thirty minutes west to the north-east angle of allotment 6 of section 11, in the parish of Cardigan; thence by a straight line bearing south to the north-east angle of allotment 12, section 1, in the last-named parish; thence by a line bearing east to the north-east angle of allotment 4, section 3, same parish; thence south by the eastern boundary of that allotment and part of eastern boundary of allotment 8, same section, bearing south forty-eight chains forty-seven links; thence by a line bearing due east, being the centre line of Rubicon-street to the Yarrowee River; thence by the centre of the Yarrowee River northerly to Prest-street; thence east by a line three miles ten chains and twenty-five links, more or less; thence by a line bearing north two miles and forty chains; thence by a line bearing due west two miles and forty chains to the point of commencement. No person shall stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, or trees or cut or paint names, letters, or marks on the trees, rocks, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon or destroy, break, cut, dig up, damage, or injure in any way, or take away any trees, shrubs, scrub, undergrowth, ferns, flowers, or any other vegetation or soil in this Reserve.
 5. No person shall light fires in the Reserve except in fire-places provided for the purpose by the Committee of Management.
 6. No person shall shoot, trap, or destroy any bird or native game within the Reserve.
- Every person offending against any of these regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not

more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be £25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. Deposits must be in bank notes, or bank drafts payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application; such deposit will be forfeited in the event of the tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his tender, or of the successful tenderer failing to complete the necessary bond within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to hold contracts for Government supplies for a period of two years.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot and institutions other than police, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other institutions a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted, such bonds to be entered into within a reasonable time after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from the oat straw of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new stations be formed or additional horses be required, at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Unless otherwise specified in the tender form the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station, should the additional number of permanent horses exceed two.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

A By-law of the town of Coburg made under section 283 of the *Health Act 1919*, for the fixing of the fees for examining and branding carcasses of animals or meat fattened and slaughtered by any person on his own premises, which premises are situated outside the meat area, and also the carcasses of animals or meat slaughtered at any abattoir situated within the limits of the meat area as at present constituted from time to time within the town of Coburg.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 283 of the *Health Act 1919*, the Council of the town of Coburg, being the Municipal Council of the municipal district of Coburg, doth hereby make the following By-law thirty-seven (37) in place of Regulation thirty-five (35), which is hereby repealed.

By-law No. 37.

The fees payable for the examining and branding of carcasses or meat by or under the direction of the Meat Inspector shall be as follows:—

For every bull	1s. 0d.
For every bullock	1s. 0d.
For every cow or calf	1s. 0d.
For every sheep, lamb, or goat	0s. 1½d.
For every swine	1s. 0d.

And such fees shall be paid to the Town Clerk, at the Town Hall, once at least in every week, and the amount of such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the Meat Inspector.

TOWN OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 38.

BY-LAW No. 38 made pursuant to and in exercise of the power conferred by the Local Government Acts for appointing stands in streets, roads, and public places within the town of Coburg for street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs, and prescribing the charges to be paid for the right to use such stands and other matters relating to the use thereof.

1. Stands for street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs, are hereby appointed in streets, roads, and public places within the town of Coburg, in the several positions hereunder stated:—

Sydney-road, east to the north of the shelter or waiting room, near Bell-street.

Blair-street, north, 50 feet west of De Carle-street.

Barrow-street, west, near Moreland-road east.

Rennie-street, south, 100 feet from Sydney-road.

Walsh-street, south, 50 feet from Sydney-road.

Victoria-street, south, 50 feet from Sydney-road.

Victoria-street, south, 100 feet from railway property.

Bell-street, south, west of the first right-of-way from Sydney-road west.

Bell-street, south, east of the entrance to the railway station.

Bell-street, south, at the western end of the infant school.

Moreland-road, west, 20 feet from west building line of Sydney-road.

Moreland-road, west, and Cameron-street, west side.

2. The Council from time to time, may abolish, enlarge or diminish such stands, and appoint any new stand or stands in such position or positions as the Council may determine and may abolish, enlarge, or diminish any such stand so appointed.

3. The Council may from time to time, grant licences to use and occupy such stands to street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in foodstuffs. Every such licence shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, under the hand of the Town Clerk.

4. The charges to be paid for the right to use and occupy any such stand, shall be fixed from time to time, by the Council, and payable in advance, and shall not exceed the sum of Thirty shillings per month, or be less than Ten shillings per month.

5. The time within which such stands may be used or occupied shall be such as shopkeepers selling foodstuffs may sell under the *Shops and Factories Act 1915*, or regulations made thereunder, but no person shall use or occupy any of such stands on any Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or other day or portion of a day which may at any time be fixed by the Council by resolution.

6. Save and except those persons duly authorized to occupy appointed stands, no hawker shall take up any fixed position in any road, street, or public place, and trade or attempt to trade therefrom, but this prohibition shall not prevent any itinerant hawker from vending his wares from house to house.

7. The following rules shall be observed by all persons licensed to use and occupy such stands:—

(a) Every person shall at all times keep his stand clean and free from rubbish, paper, fruit stems, fruit skins, and peelings, and refuse, thrown upon the roadway or footway contiguous to his stand, or under or near any cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle used by him upon his stand.

(b) Not at any time cause, permit, or suffer any nuisance to exist upon or contiguous to his stand.

(c) Not place any box, package, basket, receptacle or other thing except the cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle used by him and the contents thereof upon his stand, nor upon the footway or roadway contiguous to his stand (or near such cart, truck, or other vehicle).

(d) Not cause, permit, or suffer any horse or other animal to remain attached to such cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle while upon his stand, or while not so attached, to remain upon his stand or upon the street.

(e) Not at any time clean fish, or permit, or suffer fish to be cleaned upon his stand.

(f) Not cry or shout his goods or wares or permit or suffer his goods or wares to be cried or shouted by any other person at or near, or while going to or from his stand.

(g) Produce his licence to the Market Inspector or to any member of the Police Force when demanded.

(h) Have his name and address painted legibly and in a conspicuous place on the right or left side of any cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle used upon his stand, in Roman letters of not less than one inch in the shortest diameter of the same, either in white on a black ground, or in black on a white ground, and at all times have such name legibly and plainly visible.

(i) Not use any flap, shelf, or other device on such cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle whereby the length or width thereof is increased beyond the measurements by this By-law specified and prescribed.

(j) Not paint or write on such cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle, or display, affix, or carry thereon, or suspend therefrom, any trade or other advertisements or any placard, poster, streamer, flag, or sign of any kind whatsoever, if the Council objects thereto.

(k) Not sell at any place other than at the stand he is licensed to occupy.

These rules shall be printed on the back of every licence authorizing any person to use any such stand.

8. No cart, truck, barrow or other vehicle shall be used upon any such stand, unless the same shall—

(a) Be not greater in length than ten feet, and in width than four feet.

(b) Have been previously approved by the Market Inspector, or other officer appointed by the Council.

(c) No vehicle shall be approved unless the same be provided with a roof or cover, and have provision for the protection of the goods offered for sale from sun, dust and flies.

9. The Council may from time to time revoke any licence to use and occupy any such stand, if the holder thereof—

(a) Fails to observe any of the rules by clause 7 of this By-law, required to be observed by him or otherwise offends against this By-law.

(b) Is convicted of assault, drunkenness, or disorderliness, using obscene or insulting language, brawling or riotous or insulting behaviour or such like offence.

(c) Is not cleanly in habits and appearance.

(d) Is convicted of any offence under the Health, Game, Fruit, or Weights and Measures Act, or any other Act relating to the sale of food.

(e) Acts in any offensive or discreditable manner in the conduct of his stand.

10. When a licence is revoked under clause 9 of this By-law notice in writing of such revocation under the hand of the Town Clerk, shall be served on the holder thereof, either personally or by posting same in a registered letter addressed to such person at his address stated in the licence, and the right of such person to occupy such stand shall then cease, and any moneys which may be declared forfeited by the Council.

11. If any stand is abolished and any person is then licensed to use such stand, the Council, through the Town Clerk, may allot to such licensee a new stand in place thereof, or shall if such licensee so demand, repay to such licensee a proportionate part of any charges which may have been paid in advance by such licensee for the use of such stand, and such repayment shall be in full satisfaction of all claims and demands by such licensee.

12. No person shall use or occupy any stand save and except a person to whom a licence to use such stand has been granted or transferred under the provisions of and pursuant to this By-law.

13. A licence to use and occupy any stand may be transferred to any street hawker or itinerant trader not already licensed to use or occupy any other stand, who shall be approved of by the Council.

(a) Every transfer of any such licence shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, and shall be signed by the person named in such licence, or his executors, administrators or assigns, and by the transferee.

(c) Where a proposed transferee of a licence is approved of by the Council, the licence and transfer duly signed and executed shall be lodged with the Town Clerk, who shall note upon the licence, the name of the transferee, and the particulars of the transfer and retain the transfer, and after the payment of the transfer fee herein provided, deliver the licence so noted to the transferee. Such transferee shall thereafter be the only person authorized to use or occupy the stand named in such licence.

(d) A transfer fee of One shilling shall be charged upon every such transfer, and shall be paid when such licence and transfer are lodged with the Town Clerk as aforesaid.

14. No person other than the licensee of a stand shall sell or take any part in selling any goods at such stand, or assist such licensee in selling at such stand unless and until he has been approved of and licensed in that behalf by the Town Clerk.

(b) Every such licence shall be for a period not exceeding one month and shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk and any such licence may be revoked by the Council through the Town Clerk at any time.

(c) No fee shall be payable in respect of such licence.

15. All applications for licences under this By-law shall be in writing in the form prescribed by the Council, and signed by the applicant.

16. No boy under the age of 14 years shall manage or occupy any stand (or assist or be employed or take part in selling at such stand).

17. No licence to use or occupy any stand shall be granted, and no transfer of any such licence shall be made to any person other than a natural-born or naturalized subject of His Majesty the King.

18. No person shall, either personally or by his nominee, or any other person on his behalf, use or occupy more than one stand.

19. No licence to use or occupy any stand shall be granted, and no transfer of any such licence shall be made to a corporation or to a female.

20. Every person desiring to use or occupy any stand, whether any applicant for licence so to do, or a proposed transferee of such licence, must be and be certified by at least two ratepayers of the town of Coburg, to be of good character, but the Council may in its absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor, refuse to issue such licence and to approve of such transfer.

21. Every person who shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law, shall upon conviction for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. Where under this By-law notice in writing is required to be served on any person, such notice may be served personally or sent through the post in a registered letter addressed to such person at his address mentioned in the licence used. Where service is by registered letter it shall be deemed to have been made within twenty-four hours from the posting thereof.

BY-LAW No. 52.

A By-law of the borough of Ararat, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 25 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and the *Motor Car Act 1915*, and numbered 52, for prohibiting the obstruction of carriage-ways and footways of public places within the borough of Ararat by assembling thereon, and riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting behaviour and words in the aforesaid places, and controlling the negligent and dangerous driving and riding of motor cars and cycles within the borough of Ararat.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, *Police Offences Act 1915*, and the *Motor Car Act 1915*, of every other power enabling it in this behalf, the Council of the borough of Ararat, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, orders as follows, that is to say:—

1. That no person shall obstruct any of the carriage-ways or footways of public places within the borough of Ararat by assembling thereon.

2. Every person when requested by any authorized officer of the Municipal Council or the Police Force, to move on will immediately do so.

3. No person in or near any carriage-ways or footways of public places or within the view or hearing of any person being or passing therein, shall behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening or insulting manner and use any threatening, abusive or insulting words.

4. Any person who drives a motor car or rides a motor cycle on a public highway recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public having regard to all the circumstances of the case including the nature, condition and use of the highway and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on the highway or drives or rides at a pace exceeding at any time at the rate of twenty miles per hour, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

5. Any person who drives a motor car or rides a motor cycle on any road of the borough of Ararat will, at all times, have affixed to such car or cycle a silencer actually working and preventing any unnecessary noise.

Any failure against this clause will be an offence against this By-law.

Regulation No. 5 of the borough of Ararat respecting the obstruction of carriage-ways and footways is hereby repealed.

Any person who shall commit a breach of the By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

DEFINITION.—Juvenile Workers.—Persons under 21 years of age (other than apprentices or improvers) who, if females, are employed as wrappers, or, if males, are employed in (a) chipping or casting; (b) wrapping, packing, or moving material; or (c) cleaning, heating, or closing tubes, angle or bar-iron.

(3) **Overtime.**—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

(4) **Special Rates.**—That double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, Good Friday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) **Piece-work.**—The Board determines, under the provisions of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rates fixed by the Board for such work.
