Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE ELECTRICAL SUPPLY BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 24th December, 1920, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

(a) the generation or distribution of electricity,
(b) the manufacture, repair, or maintenance of electrical appliances when such work is done by generators, distributers, or installers,"

has made the following Determination, namely:-

(1) That on the 24th December, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) Time of Beginning and Ending Work.—For any person (other than a patrolman, switchman, sub-station attendant, tation switchboard attendant, carboner, or person attending to dynamos or motor generators) shall be—
Time of beginning, not earlier than— Time of ending, not later than—
Monday to Friday (inclusive) . 7 a.m 6 p.m. Saturday 7 a.m
(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for work done during the times specified hereunder, by-
(a) A patrolman, switchman, sub-station attendant, station switchboard attendant, carboner or person attending to dynamos or motor generators—
In excess of 48 hours in any week
(b) Any other person—
Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 48 hours in any week Time and a half.
(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Any person (other than a switchman, carboner, or person attending to dynamos or motor generators) shall be paid time and a half for all work done on Snuday, and double time for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
