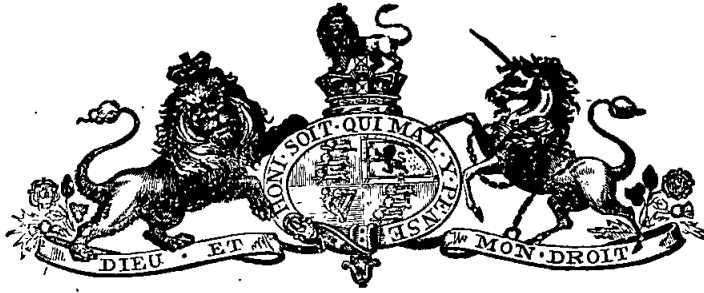

The Wheat Marketing and Transportation Act 1920.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of December, 1920.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by the *Wheat Marketing and Transportation Act 1920* (No. 3076), it is provided that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for (among other things)—

- (i) Prescribing the duties of agents, officers, servants, and other persons appointed or authorized by the Minister pursuant to the Act, and
- (ii) Prescribing forms which may be used under the Act, and
- (iii) Generally all matters and things necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying out the provisions and the purposes of the Act.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby prescribe as follows, that is to say :—

(A) *Regulation prescribing certain of the duties of certain Officers appointed by the Minister pursuant to the Act as "Flour Inspectors."*

1. Every Flour Inspector appointed as such by the Minister shall discharge (*inter alia*) the following duties :—
 - (a) Make inquiries of millers, bakers, flour merchants, and of all parties believed by him to have, or since the 1st day of January, 1920, to have had the possession or custody of any flour, to ascertain if in fact any flour be in the possession or custody of such millers, bakers, flour merchants, or parties, and also the disposition made by them of any flour which had been in the custody or possession of them since the said 1st day of January, 1920, and the quantity and qualities of such flour in such possession or custody or disposed of, and of the name and address of any party having any interest of ownership in the flour the custody or possession of which may be disclosed in answer to such inquiries; and the nature and extent of the interest of ownership of every such party in such flour; and the name and address of any party to whom any such flour had been disposed of since the said 1st day of January, 1920, and the quantity of every disposition.
 - (b) Make inquiries of millers, bakers, flour merchants, and of all parties believed by him to have any interest of ownership in any flour, to ascertain where and in what custody or possession any such flour may be and from what party the same was acquired.
 - (c) Require of any miller, baker, flour merchant, and of any party believed by him to have or since the 1st day of January, 1920, to have had any interest of ownership in any flour or the possession or custody of any flour, permission to inspect the books and stocks of such miller, baker, flour merchant, or party, including all books, accounts, vouchers, and documents in the custody or power of such miller, baker, flour merchant, or party which relate to his flour transactions. And to inspect such books, accounts, vouchers, and documents for the purpose of tracing out and checking the flour transactions of such miller, baker, flour merchant, or party.
 - (d) Seek for and do all things necessary to enable him to discover the existence of any flour stocks and the manner in which any flour may have been disposed of and from time to time report to the Minister the result of his investigations.

The above Statement should show the Flour-holding in parcels according to location, custody, or ownership. As thus If the owner "A" have an interest of ownership in say 300 tons of flour, whereof (a) 100 tons is in some public or private outside store, but of this 25 tons is "A's" own, but he and "B" and "C" are owners of 50 tons, and he and "D" are owners of 25 tons; and (b) 100 tons is at the place of business of "A," but he and "E" own 50 tons in shares, and he ("A") owns the remaining 50 tons; and (c) 100 tons which is in some outside premises of "A," but of which 100 tons he is sole owner, then the holding (a) should be returned in three parcels—No. 1 (25 tons), No. 2 (50 tons), and No. 3 (25 tons)—and the required particulars in respect of each parcel should be filled in in the Statement, and so on with the other holdings; (b) should be returned in two parcels; and (c) in one parcel.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Farm Produce Agents Act 1920 (No. 3082) to make Regulations with respect (among other matters) for prescribing forms to be used thereunder, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the Regulations following:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Farm Produce Agents' (Forms) Regulations, 1920.
2. The form of notice of intention to apply for a farm produce agent's licence, under the provisions of the Farm Produce Agents Act 1920 (No. 3082), shall be in the form or to the effect of the one in the First Schedule hereto, and the certificate to be signed in their own handwriting by six householders residing in the locality in which the applicant resides in the form or to the effect of the one in the Second Schedule hereto.
3. The form of licence to be granted to a successful applicant shall be in the form or to the effect of the one in the Third Schedule hereto.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE DRAPERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 8th January, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in the business of a seller of goods usually sold by drapers or haberdashers (other than boots of any kind and articles of male attire), including mantles, costumes, millinery, gloves, stockings, and underclothing, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 8th day of January, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 47 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than 23½ hours) shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, and time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
