**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. County Court Act 1915.

RULES OF COURT.

WE, WILLIAM HENRY MOULE, JOSIAH STEPHEN WASLEY, CASIMIR JULIUS ZICHY WOJNARSKI, and GEORGE JAMES DETHRIDGE, being four of the County Court Judges, have under the powers vested in us by the County Court Act 1915 framed the following amended Rules for regulating the practice and proceedings in the County Court, and we do hereby certify the same under our hands to a law officer of the Crown namely the Honorable ARTHUR ROBINSON, Solicitor-General accordingly.

The existing Rules 210, 444, and 457 of the County Court are hereby repealed, and the following Rules are hereby enacted in lieu thereof, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1921:—

Rule 210.—In county cases the Registrar of the Court where the summons was issued may issue a chamber summons returnable in Melbourne before the Judge taking chamber business in Melbourne without any express direction by a Judge in that behalf.

Rule 444.—In an action for damages for nuisance or in an action for an injunction coupled with a claim for damages or without such claim or in a suit or matter within the equitable jurisdiction of the Court or in an arbitration proceeding under Sections 72 and 73 of the County Court Act 1915 the Court or the Judge, when an order for costs shall be made in favour of any party or parties, may, notwithstanding the provisions contained in Rule 446, either at the hearing or within a reasonable time thereafter at his discretion fix the scale of costs which shall be applicable.

Rule 457.—Where a summons or any other proceeding or document has been served by any person other than a bailiff at a distance of more than 2 miles from the nearest place of business or office of the solicitor serving the same the Registrar shall fix the amount payable for such service having regard to the time occupied and fares (if any) paid.

## CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

## BY-LAW No. 30.

THE Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose water District has for the purpose of the said Acts been proclaimed an Urban District) make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of land and tenements shall pay in advance in one instalment for the period from the first day of October, 1920, to the thirtieth day of September, 1921, in respect of water supplied by the Council (that is to say):—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelve pence (1s.) for each Pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) sterling.

(b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months commencing on the first day of October, or the first day of April, shall be charged two-thirds rate.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the Pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(e) Private water troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Council shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.

(f) For water supplied by the Council by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

(g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three pence per 1,000 gallons, and the ratepayers shall be charged for quantity of water, which at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from the stand-pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(i) For steam boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse power of each boiler, except in cases where the Council shall order a meter to be used.

(j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Council pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per centum for wooden buildings lined with plaster, or Two shillings and sixpence per cent. for wooden buildings when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Council, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payment in either case to be made in advance.

(k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

(l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Council shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Council before a supply can be taken or used.

(m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Council shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.

(n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons is equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the period which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(o) For water supplied to public parks and show grounds the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(p) For water supplied to the Botanic Gardens, the Manifold-street Reserve and Flagstaff Hill Reserve the charge shall be Twopence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

(q) The before-mentioned rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January of the said year, and such charges shall be payable on the fourteenth day of January of the said year.

(r) Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

## WATER-SUPPLY DISTRICT OF THE CLUNES BOROUGH COUNCIL.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1920-21.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Water Supply District of the Clunes Borough Council do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

By-law No. 20 fixing the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the district, such rate being made for the year ending on the 30th day of September, 1921.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the occupiers or owners of the lands or tenements within the Water Supply District of the Clunes Borough Council, who are supplied with water shall be as follow:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound five shillings per annum.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound of the municipal valuation.

3. On unoccupied lands and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation.

4. Water supplied for steam boiler purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied for irrigation and to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons until the amount so payable is equal to the amount of the assessed annual rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by meter. For a further supply, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons provided that when the value of the water used as above shall equal the sum of Five pounds, the charge for water then used in excess of such value shall be reduced to Twopence per 1,000 gallons until the quantity used reaches the maximum annual quantity used on the same rateable area (during the previous three years, after which the price will be reduced to One penny half-penny per 1,000 gallons up to a further quantity of 50,000 gallons, and thereafter the price will be reduced to One penny per 1,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied to troughs in the streets of the borough, Eighteen shillings per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stone-work, brick-work, or plastering, or the Commissioners may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

8. Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable wrought-iron trough, with strong cover for locking down, and fixes a suitable ball-cock, the following shall be the scale of charges per annum for supplying stock with water, unless the Commissioners decide that the water must be taken by measure, and at such rate per 1,000 gallons as fixed by them—

(a) On land not exceeding 20 acres, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

(b) On land above 20 acres, but not exceeding 50 acres, the sum of Eighteen shillings per annum.

(c) On land above 50 acres, but not exceeding 75 acres, the sum of Twenty-five shillings per annum.

(d) On land above 75 acres, but not exceeding 100 acres, the sum of Thirty-one shillings per annum.

(e) On land above 100 acres, the sum of Thirty-six shillings and sixpence per annum.

9. In addition to the foregoing scale of charges, there shall be paid the sum of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal valuation of such land or lands and tenements. All payments to be made in advance.

10. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering of stock, or irrigation of private or other gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

11. For small lots under cultivation for trade purposes or for the supply of vegetable products to hotels, boarding-houses, and such like, occupied by the same persons, the following scale shall be applied:—

- (a) If not exceeding one-quarter of an acre in extent each, the sum of Ten shillings per annum.
- (b) If exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding one-half of an acre, the sum of Twenty shillings each per annum.

12. The rates and charges shall be payable by equal instalments on the 1st day of February, 1921, and the 1st day of April, 1921, at the Town Hall, Clunes.

13. Such person as shall be appointed from time to time for that purpose by the Commissioners is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect and sue for the recovery of the rates and charges hereby made.

The foregoing By-law, numbered 20, was made and adopted by the Water Supply Commission of the Clunes Borough Council, and the common seal of the said corporation was hereto affixed this 1st day of December, 1920.

A By-law of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, made under the Water Acts.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Lancefield riding of the shire of Romsey in which such lands and tenements are situated for one year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1921, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1921.

#### LILLYDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

By-law for the making of a rate for the year 1921 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Lillydale Waterworks Trust; also for dealing with charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust—

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District according to the valuation, for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Lillydale, but no such rate for tenements of £20 net annual value and under shall be less than Twenty-five shillings per annum.

2. A rate of Five shillings per annum shall be charged on all vacant lands facing the mains.

3. Where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied. Where water is supplied for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall

be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons. Charges for water shall be due and payable on the 1st January and 1st July, 1921.

##### BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Marysville Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1921 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District of the Trust, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds, a rate of 15 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

4. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be charged.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per annum shall be made.

6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

7. No service pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

8. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the thirtieth day of April, 1921.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

## TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW No. 1, 1921.

**T**HE Tatura Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of all lands and tenements within the district of the said Waterworks Trust comprised in and affected by any notice or notices heretofore or hereafter to be published in the *Government Gazette*, pursuant to sections 236 and 237 of the *Water Act 1915*:—

For the supply of Water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure:—

- (a) For all lands and tenements within the said district, excepting and excluding all lands set out and described in paragraph (b) hereof, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (b) For every Crown allotment and lesser piece of land upon which no building is erected or which is unoccupied or vacant, and which is not supplied with water, a rate of Ten shillings for every such Crown allotment or lesser piece thereof.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1921, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1921, and shall be payable in equal half-yearly moieties, in advance, on the first days of January and July in the year 1921.

3. The valuation for the time being of the lands and tenements within the said district, for the municipal rate in the municipal district of the shire of Rodney in which such lands and tenements are situated, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purpose of making and levying such rates.

4. Water will also be supplied by measurement, and in such case the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter, and maintain the same in good working order and pay for the water according to measurement thereby at the rate following:—

- (a) For steam boilers, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) For shire water troughs at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (c) In all other cases, water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons until the amount payable equals the amount of the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied. Excess water over and above such amount will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to 200,000; over and above 200,000 gallons sixpence for each additional 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will, in each case, be fixed by the Trust.

5. Water will also be supplied for the year in paragraph two hereof set out for watering gardens according to the area hereof and the following scale of charges payable yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, 1921, is hereby fixed for water supplied otherwise than by measure for watering gardens:—

- (a) For water supplied solely for watering gardens not exceeding in area 75 square yards, Ten shillings.
- (b) For water supplied solely for watering gardens not exceeding in area 150 square yards, Twenty shillings.

6. Supplies of water for any purpose not specified herein, and otherwise than by measure, must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken.

7. The minimum amount to be paid for water supplied by measurement for domestic purposes only, or both for domestic purposes and for purposes other than domestic combined, shall be the amount which at One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.

8. For water supplied by measure, the minimum charge therefor being the same amount as the rate for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure shall be paid half-yearly in advance, upon the same days as the said rate is hereinbefore made payable, and shall be deemed to be in satisfaction of the said rate; and the excess over and above the amount allowed by the rate shall be paid for upon demand, in writing, immediately after the amount thereof shall be ascertainable by the reading of the meter at the end of each year.

9. In no case will water be supplied to any person whatsoever at a lesser rate or charge than Twenty shillings sterling per annum.

10. Such person or persons as the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate and all moneys made payable hereunder.

- (a) If for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

(iii) Such rate is made for the year 1921, commencing the first day of January, 1921, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from the public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on the first day of January, 1921.

(iv) All other charges by measurement shall be paid on the 1st day of January, 1921.

(v) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 37(e) of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918* (No. 2995), doth hereby approve of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board constructing curves connecting the Board's electric tramways in Glenferrie and Riversdale roads, Hawthorn, for the purpose of enabling cars to be transferred or pass from one line to another, and for the more efficient operation of the tramway undertakings of the Board.

## ROUTE.

That the route of the said curves shall be as follows:—  
(1) Commencing at a point in Glenferrie-road approximately eighty-eight (88) feet south of the centre intersection of Glenferrie-road and Riversdale-road, and thence in a north-westerly direction to a point in Riversdale-road approximately eighty-six (86) feet west of the centre intersection of Glenferrie-road and Riversdale-road, Hawthorn.

(2) Commencing at a point in Glenferrie-road approximately eighty-eight (88) feet south of the centre intersection of Glenferrie-road and Riversdale-road, and thence in a north-easterly direction to a point in Riversdale-road approximately eighty-eight (88) feet east of the centre intersection of Glenferrie-road and Riversdale-road, Hawthorn.

## GAUGE.

That the gauge of such tramway curves shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 7 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Board. Provided always that all cars shall be stopped before entering the curves, and that the conductor shall proceed to obtain a full view of the thoroughfare into which the car is about to enter, and shall signal the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that the road at the curves is clear.

## MAXIMUM SPEED.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars while travelling on the said curves shall not exceed four (4) miles an hour.

And the Honorable Frank Clarke, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## REGULATION No. 11.

A Regulation of the shire of Werribee numbered 11 made under  
 section i of Part 9 of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Govern-  
 ment Act 1915*, in force in the shire of Werribee, by virtue

 for regulating open bathing.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Govern-

 shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of  
 the municipal district, that is to say:—

1. All persons over 8 years of age bathing in any waters  
 exposed to the public view shall be clad in a bathing costume  
 covering the body from neck to knee, so as to secure the ob-  
 servance of decency, any employee of the Council or any  
 police constable, or any person authorized by the Council in  
 writing under the seal of the Council may require any person  
 contravening this provision to at once resume his ordinary  
 clothes.

2 (a) No person shall dress or undress or remove any part  
 of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

(b) Every person about to bathe shall proceed from the  
 dressing place direct to the river or sea by the nearest prac-  
 ticable line, and on leaving the river or sea shall return thereto  
 in the same manner.

(c) Except as aforesaid, or when rendering aid in case of  
 accident, no person shall, in bathing costume, walk, run, exer-  
 cise, stand, loiter, lie down, or sit down, upon any part of  
 the beach or any place whatever which is exposed to the public  
 view.

3. The dressing enclosure or shed shall be used for dressing  
 and undressing only. No person shall play games or loiter  
 therein.

4. No person shall bring or deposit any filth, papers, rags,  
 glass, debris of any sort, or rubbish, in any such enclosure or  
 shed. No person shall damage, disfigure, or write in or upon  
 any such enclosure or shed.

5. In or upon any part of the beach, dressing enclosure, or  
 waters used by the public:—

(a) No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper,  
 riotous, or noisy manner, to the annoyance of the  
 public.

(b) No person shall blaspheme or use profane language  
 or behave in an indecent manner.

6. The Council may by resolution fix, and from time to time  
 alter, fees for the use of bathing and dressing accommodation  
 and requisites and for the safe custody of valuables.

7. No person, unless authorized by the Council, shall use,  
 displace, injure or destroy any appliances provided by  
 the Council or by any club or association, except such use or  
 displacement be necessary for the purpose of saving life, or  
 such.

8. No person shall deposit any filth, glass, *débris* of any sort or refuse upon any public bathing reserve or in any waters adjacent thereto or suffer any filth or refuse to run upon or into any such reserve or waters. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown into any such waters any dead animals or any offensive matter.

9. No male over the age of 12 years shall trespass on any part of the beach, or any dressing shed reserved for the use of females, and no female over the age of 12 years shall trespass on any part of the beach or dressing shed reserved for males except for the purpose of rendering assistance in case of accident.

10. (a) The Council may in writing, under its seal, authorize any person to carry out the provisions of this Regulation, and to prosecute on behalf of the Council any persons or person offending under this Regulation.

(b) Any person committing any breach of this Regulation, who refuses to state his name and place of abode to any officer or employee of the Council or any person authorized by the Council in writing, under seal of the Council, or who in the opinion of such employee or any person authorized by the Council in writing under seal of the Council, states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence under this Regulation.

Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE ENGRAVERS BOARD.

**NOTE.**—(1) This Determination on the 22nd January, 1921, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warrnambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

(2) The Engravers Board when first constituted had power to fix rates for any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a process engraver. This power was taken away by Order in Council dated 26th August, 1913.

(3) On the 2nd October, 1917, the powers of the Engravers Board were extended to enable it to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of making (but not enamelling) metal badges.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of an engraver or die-sinker," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 22nd day of January, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

## DETERMINATION OF THE CARPENTERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applied on the 10th day of January, 1921, to the whole of the State.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a carpenter or joiner (including labouring work in connexion therewith) engaged in connexion with the erecting or repairing of buildings" has made the following Determination, namely:—

NOTE.—On the 15th June, 1915, the Board's powers were extended to include "persons engaged in connexion with the erecting or repairing of fittings in or on buildings."

(1) That on the 10th day of January, 1921, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked, and replaced by this Determination.

(4) ALLOWANCES.—The following extra rates shall be paid on all work distant from the centre:—

1. (a) 3 miles and up to 5 miles,  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour extra;
- (b) Over 5 miles and up to 9 miles,  $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour extra;
- (c) Over 9 miles and up to 12 miles, 3d. per hour extra;
- (d) Over 12 miles and up to 16 miles, 4d. per hour extra;
- (e) Over 16 miles,  $4\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour extra.

(5) DEFINITION.—Wherever occurring in this Determination the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

- (a) A carpenter's "centre" shall mean the Melbourne (Elizabeth-street) General Post Office if the carpenter resides within a radius of 20 miles therefrom, and shall in all other cases mean the chief post office of the municipal district in or nearest to which the carpenter resides.
- (b) "Insulating work" means work which is carried on in a dust-laden atmosphere caused by the use of charcoal, pumice stone, or other insulating material.

(6) PUBLIC HOLIDAYS AND SUNDAYS.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th day of January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, the 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but, if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(7) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work) shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hour.
