Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE MEN'S CLOTHING BOARD.

Norz.—This Determination, on the 26th April, 1920, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, and Warmambool; the towns of Ballarat East and Sandringham; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in the business of a seller of any article of men's or boys clothing, mercery, or wearing apparel, including underclothing, hats, and caps, but not including boots or shoes (being a business usually or frequently carried on in a shop)," has made the following Determination, viz.:—

(1) That on the 26th April, 1920, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) OVEETIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 47 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.
- (4) Casual Labour.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than 23½ hours) shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.
- (5) Special Rates.—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
