VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 245.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf under the provisions of the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law, and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith:—

COAL—

(a) The ordinary rate for the carriage of coal shall be Class "M," less 5 per cent., provided that the minimum charge shall be 2s. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 6 miles; 2s. 4d. per ton for distances over 6 and up to and inclusive of 8 miles; and 2s. 6d. per ton for distances beyond 8 miles.

(b) In respect of coal forwarded by rail on the "Up" journey from any coal-field direct to any station, the rate for the carriage of such coal over the whole or any part of the line from the coal-field to Melbourne shall be two-thirds of one penny per ton per mile, and the rate for the carriage of such coal on any other line shall be the difference between Class "M" rate, less 5 per cent. for the mileage journey from the coal-field to Melbourne, or any portion of such journey over which the coal has been hauled, and Class "M" rate, less 5 per cent. for the total mileage from the coal-field to the station of destination, provided that the minimum charge to be paid by the consignor or consignee shall be 2s. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 6 miles; 2s. 4d. per ton for distances over 6 and up to and inclusive of 8 miles, and 2s. 6d. per ton for distances beyond 8 miles; and that the freight charge to be paid by the consignor or consignee for the carriage of coal from the coal-field to any station on any other line shall not be less than the mileage rate from Melbourne to such station. Class "M" rate, less 5 per cent., may be charged if in any instance it is cheaper than to compute the freight charges as prescribed in the preceding part of this clause.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 1st day of April, 1920.

TOWN OF SANDRINGHAM.**By-Law No. 53.**

A By-law of the Town of Sandringham made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and Part V. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915*, with the approval of the Governor in Council, and numbered 53, for the carrying out of certain of the purposes provided for in the said section and part, namely:—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road.
- (b) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- (c) Regulating the height, thickness, construction or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys and the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.
- (d) Exercising all, any and every of the powers of the said Council under the *Local Government Act 1915* and the 13th Schedule thereto, or otherwise enabling it in connexion with the foregoing.

IN pursuance of the powers of the said Council under the *Local Government Act 1915* and the 13th Schedule thereto, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Sandringham order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.
2. No person shall erect build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection contrary to the provisions of this By-law.
3. No person shall erect build construct or cause to be erected built or constructed any building or erection which shall be or be adapted or intended in the opinion of the Council or its surveyor, to be used as a shop or shop and dwelling unless the site or curtilage thereof has a superficial area of at least 1,800 square feet and has a frontage of not less than 18 lineal feet to a street or road and has a depth of not less than 100 feet.
4. Every building or erection which shall be or in the opinion of the Council or surveyor may be adapted or intended to be used as a shop or shop and dwelling shall have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers an area of open land not less than 600 square feet.
5. No building or erection which shall or may in the opinion of the Council be adapted or intended for use as a shop shall be built or erected unless the external walls thereof and of all dwelling rooms attached thereto are constructed of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or stone at least 8½ inches in thickness.
6. Any matter or thing arising under this By-law may be from time to time determined applied dispensed with or regulated by the Council by resolution or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.
7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
