By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2618), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

SATURDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1921, at Casterton and Merino;

WEDNESDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1921, at Newstead.

ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Hill Irvine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- "An Act relating to the providing of Dwellings for Persons of Small Means and for the Reclamation and Improvement of Insanitary Low-lying or Overcrowded Areas."
- "An Act relating to the Surplus Revenue of the Financial Year ended on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty."
- "An Act to declare the Rates of Income Tax for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one and to amend and continue the Income Tax Acts."
- "An Act to declare the Rate of Land Tax for the year ending the thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one."

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"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for Public Works and other purposes."

"An Act relating to the Appointment of Wages Boards under the Factories and Shops Acts by the Governor in Council and to the Powers of the Governor in Council with respect thereto."

"An Act relating to the Sale of certain Crown Lands in the County of Polwarth for the purposes of the Construction of a Highway to be known as the Great Ocean Road."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to Juries."

"An Act to ratify an Agreement for the Variation of the Agreement entered into between the Prime Minister of the Commonwealth and the Premiers of the States of New South Wales Victoria and South Australia respecting the River Murray and Lake Victoria and other Waters and to amend the River Murray Waters Acts."

"An Act to amend the First Schedule to the *Anglo-Persian Oil Company's Act 1920*."

"An Act to provide for Advances by the Commissioners of the State Savings Bank of Victoria to Companies for the purposes of certain Undertakings in connexion with Industries in Country Districts and to amend the State Savings Bank Acts."

"An Act to provide for the Sale of certain Land in the Parish of Tragowel temporarily reserved from Sale as a Site for Public Recreation and for the Application of Part of the Proceeds of the Sale thereof to the Acquisition of certain Land in the Parish of Macorna for the purposes of a Site for Public Recreation and a Public Park."

"An Act to amend the Unauthorized Documents Acts."

"An Act to authorize the raising of Money for the Purposes of Works and Undertakings of the Electricity Commissioners and to sanction the Issue and Application of such Money for the said purposes."

"An Act to amend certain provisions of the *Metropolitan Gas Company's Act 1878* with respect to the Capital and the Borrowing Powers of the said Company."

"An Act relating to the Payment of certain Moneys during the current Financial Year for the purposes of the *Railways Classification Board Act 1919* and by reason of the Increased Cost of Coal for the Railways."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to the Electricity Commissioners and to Electric Light and Power and for other purposes."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to the Sale and Occupation of Crown Lands and for other purposes."

"An Act relating to the Sale of certain Crown Land near Spotswood Railway Station."

"An Act to amend the Mildura Irrigation Trusts Acts."

"An Act to refer to the Parliament of the Commonwealth certain matters in connexion with Air Navigation."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to Banking Accounts of Trustees."

"An Act to authorize the Construction by the State of an Electric Street Railway from Black Rock to Beaumaris."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to Pharmaceutical Chemists and for other purposes."

"An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the Service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this and the last preceding Session of Parliament."

The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1915.
REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1915* the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. Regulation 20A is hereby made as follows:—

20A. No vessel of less than 50 tons gross measurement shall enter or leave the Victoria Dock between sunset and sunrise without the special permission, in writing, of the Harbormaster.

2. Regulation 109 (3) is hereby amended in manner following, viz:—

By striking out after the letter (a) the words, "That such notice shall not be given until six days after the vessel from which the goods were unshipped ceased to discharge at the berth," and inserting in lieu thereof the words following, viz:—"That such notice shall not be given prior to 5 p.m. on the sixth day after the vessel from which the goods were unshipped ceased to discharge at the berth."

3. Regulation 143 is hereby amended in manner hereinafter set out provided that nothing in such amendment shall affect or alter any rights or liabilities acquired, accrued, or incurred before the date of the coming into operation of these regulations, by substituting for the first sentence thereof the following sentence:—

"Should any goods be not removed within the time limited by Regulation 141 there shall be payable by the owner as and by way of storage fees in respect thereof the sum of 1s. per ton of such goods for the first three days, and for every subsequent three days the sum of 6d. per ton additional to the amounts per ton payable for each immediately preceding three days, that is to say, 1s. 6d. per ton for the second three days, 2s. per ton for the third three days, and so on."

4. Regulations 299 and 299A are hereby repealed provided always such repeal shall not affect or alter any rights or liabilities acquired, accrued, or incurred thereunder before the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations.

5. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 299:—

299. The master, owner, or agent of a vessel occupying any berth at a wharf or part of a wharf on which a shed is erected shall, unless otherwise agreed upon, pay to the Commissioners for the right to use such shed the following charges, namely, where the shed does not exceed 60 feet in width for the first day on which the vessel is so berthed the sum of £21 if cargo is unshipped and the sum of £3 if cargo is shipped, and for each subsequent quarter of a day on which the vessel is so berthed the sum of 15s. irrespective of whether the cargo is shipped or unshipped. When such shed exceeds 60 feet in width but does not exceed 80 feet in width, the charge for the first day shall be the sum of £28 if cargo is unshipped and the sum of £4 if cargo is shipped, and for each subsequent quarter of a day the sum of £1 irrespective of whether cargo is shipped or unshipped. When such shed exceeds 80 feet in width the charge for the first day shall be the sum of £35 if cargo is unshipped and the sum of £5 if cargo is shipped, and for each subsequent quarter of a day the sum of £1 5s. irrespective of whether cargo is shipped or unshipped: Provided always that the charge for any part of a day of or less than six hours shall be that specified for a quarter of a day, and the minimum charge shall be for one day. Should the charges paid under this Regulation exceed a sum equal to 6d. per ton on the cargo unshipped from and/or shipped into the vessel, the Commissioners shall, on application being made to them, refund the amount paid in excess of such sum.

6. The following Regulation is made in place of Regulation 299A:—

299A. The master, owner, or agent of a vessel requiring any wharf or part of a wharf or shed for the storage of outward cargo prior to the berthing of the vessel by which it is to be shipped shall pay to the Commissioners for the use of such wharf, or part thereof, and shed (if any) from the time when such wharf and/or shed is set apart for the storage of such cargo until the berthing of the vessel the following charges, namely, when there is no shed available exceeding 60 feet in width the sum of £3 for the first day and 15s. for each subsequent quarter of a day. When there is a shed available of more than 60 feet in width but not more than 80 feet in width, the sum of £4 for the first day and £1 for each subsequent quarter of a day, and when there is a shed available of more than 80 feet in width the sum of £5 for the first day and £1 5s. for each subsequent quarter of a day: Provided always that the charge for any part of a day of or less than six hours shall be that specified for a quarter of a day, and the minimum charge shall be for one day. If the whole of the cargo

stored be not shipped by the vessel, such master, owner, or agent shall pay the said charges until all the cargo stored has been removed from the wharf or shed. The granting of the use of any wharf and/or shed for the storage of outward cargo shall be in the discretion of the Commissioners, and any such grant may be revoked.

7. Regulation 303 is hereby amended in manner hereinafter set out, provided that nothing in such amendment shall affect or alter any rights or liabilities acquired, accrued, or incurred before the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations:—

By substituting for the words "one halfpenny" therein the words "three farthings."

8. Regulation No. 310 is hereby amended in manner hereinafter set out, provided always that nothing in such amendment shall affect or alter any rights or liabilities acquired, accrued, or incurred thereunder before the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations:—

(a) By repealing the schedule to the said Regulation and substituting in lieu thereof the following:—

(c) By substituting the figure (3) for the figure (2) opposite the second proviso of the said Regulation.

(d) By inserting after the said provisos to the same Regulation the provisos following:—

- "(4) That goods brought in a vessel from any other place within the port of Melbourne shall, when landed, pay the same rate as goods arriving from any place within Port Phillip Heads.
- (5) That the rates specified in the schedule hereto at per ton may be calculated by the Commissioners by weight or by measurement at their option."

REGULATION RESCINDED, REGULATION SUBSTITUTED.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 81 of the *Education Act 1915* (No. 2644), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XLIII, Training of Teachers for Technical Schools, of the Regulations under the aforesaid Act, and doth substitute the following in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATION XLIII.—STUDENT-TEACHERS IN TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

1. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Director, establish courses of training to be conducted in such Technical Schools and Junior Technical Schools as the Director may determine for persons desiring to qualify as teachers in Technical Schools.

2. These courses of training will be under the supervision of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Technical Art, and such other officers as may be instructed by the Director to undertake such duty.

3. Studentships will be awarded to qualified candidates from time to time by the Minister, who will determine the number of studentships to be granted in any school in any year, and also the special branch of technical work to which the student shall devote himself.

4. The qualifications of candidates for studentships shall be—

- (a) Candidates must not be less than sixteen years of age.
- (b) They must have passed successfully through the full course of study in a Junior Technical School or hold an approved equivalent qualification.
- (c) They must produce a certificate from the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools or from the head master or principal of a Technical School that they exhibit aptitude and general suitability for the work of a teacher in a Technical School.
- (d) They must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character.
- (e) They must submit a certificate from a School Medical Officer, or from a medical practitioner approved for this purpose, by the Director, that they are of sound constitution and free from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers.

5. Where the number of qualified applicants is in excess of the number of studentships to be awarded, awards of studentships will be determined by a consideration of—

- (a) The educational qualifications of the applicants as shown in their school records.
- (b) The special qualifications of the applicants in respect of any special branch of technical work.
- (c) The aptitude and general suitability of the applicants for the profession of teaching.

6. The awards of studentships will be made upon the recommendation of a committee, consisting of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, the Inspector of Technical Art, and a third person nominated by the Director. If it is deemed necessary, a competitive examination may be held in such subjects as the committee may determine.

7. Persons to whom studentships are awarded shall be known as student-teachers, and their period of service will be regarded as commencing on the 1st of January of the year in which they commence duty.

8. The course of training for the Technical School Teacher's Certificate shall extend over five years, and shall include—

- (a) A course of study in English.
- (b) The principles and practice of teaching.
- (c) A technical course in an approved branch of industry.
- (d) Approved workshop or other technical experience.

During the currency of their studentships, student-teachers will be required to attend such classes of instruction, perform such duties and undergo such workshop experience as may be determined.

9. The Minister, on the recommendation of the Director, may, in the case of a student-teacher certified as possessing special qualifications by the committee appointed under clause 6, reduce the course of training to four years.

10. Student-teachers who at any period of their course fail to show satisfactory progress or fail to pass the annual examinations, or are found guilty of idleness, misconduct, unpunctuality, or absence from school, may have their studentships withdrawn, and thereupon all allowances under this Regulation shall cease and determine.

11. During their course of training student-teachers will receive an annual allowance in the first year at the rate of £40 per annum, which will be subject to an annual increase at the rate of £10 per annum until a maximum of £80 per annum is reached. The payment of each annual increment will be conditional upon a favorable report being received by the Director upon the progress of the student-teacher. A student-teacher will not receive an annual increment unless during the year he shall have passed the examination prescribed for that year of his trade course.

12. Student-teachers will be required each year to complete their corresponding technical examinations in the subjects prescribed for that year.

13. No student-teacher may proceed to higher grades in any subject without having passed in the lower grades, except where special permission is given by the Director.

14. Each student-teacher will be required, as a condition of such studentship, to enter into an agreement by himself and an approved surety not to relinquish his course of training without the permission of the Minister, and for the four years next after the termination of his studentship to teach in any school to which he may be appointed.

15. Student-teachers who relinquish their course of training or whose studentships have been withdrawn under clause 10 above may be required by the Minister to refund the whole or part of the allowance paid to them under clause 11 above.

16. Student-teachers who pass in the complete course as prescribed, who are certified by the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools as having satisfactorily completed a sufficient amount of workshop practice under approved conditions, and who have passed an examination approved by the Director in the theory and practice of teaching, shall be granted the Technical School Teacher's Certificate.

17. Student-teachers who hold a Technical School Teacher's Certificate shall be eligible for appointment as teachers on the staff of Junior Technical Schools and Technical Schools, or as relieving teachers in Technical Schools and Junior Technical Schools. On appointment they shall be classified in Class E, Professional Division, Technical Schools, subdivision 8.

18. The relative seniority of teachers and relieving teachers under clause 17 shall be determined by their records as student-teachers.

And the Honorable Sir A. J. Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
