The Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby repeals Chapter II. of the Regulations, made on the 15th November, 1915, and all amendments thereof, and makes the following Regulations, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council.

To take effect as from the 1st July, 1920.

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**CHAPTER II.****PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.***Appointment to—*

1. Every applicant for appointment to the Professional Division must furnish the Commissioner with an application in his own handwriting, stating his name in full, his address, the date and place of his birth, and the position for which he applies. He should furnish a certificate satisfactory to the Commissioner of his good moral character and industrious habits, and documentary evidence of his qualifications and experience.

2. An applicant must, when called upon so to do, furnish the Commissioner with a properly certified extract from an official register of births or other evidence of age satisfactory to the Commissioner, and also a certificate of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects from the Government Medical Officer or other medical practitioner registered in Victoria approved by the Commissioner. Provided that in the case of applicants who are eligible discharged soldiers, it shall be sufficient if the said medical certificate sets forth that they are of sound bodily health, and do not suffer from any physical defect which would incapacitate them from the proper performance of the duties of the position for which they apply.

Failure to comply with the provisions of this clause will preclude the registration of an applicant.

3. The requirements of clause 2 as to the medical certificate shall not apply to applicants for appointment to the Professional Division of the teaching staff of the Department of Public Instruction.

In such cases the applicant must furnish a medical certificate from the Government Medical Officer or other medical practitioner registered in Victoria approved by the Commissioner, of sound bodily health and freedom from any defect likely to impair the efficiency of such applicant as a teacher.

4. When it is necessary to fill an office in the Professional Division it shall—unless it be found requisite to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service—be filled by the transfer or promotion thereto of the officer who in the opinion of the Commissioner possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

*Classification of—*

5. In the case of appointments, transfers, or promotions to any office in the Professional Division, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule.

6. Officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the Schedule may—at intervals of not less than twelve months—be granted sub-divisional promotion. Every sub-divisional promotion shall be discretionary, and shall not be made except on the certificate of the permanent head of the Department that such sub-divisional promotion has been earned by good conduct and efficient service, and the recommendation of the Commissioner. In the promotion of an officer from one sub-division to another sub-division regard shall be had to the nature of the work performed by him.

SWAN HILL WATERWORKS TRUST.  
AMENDMENT OF BUILDING RATE.*By-law.*

BY-LAW No. 23.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED—  
WEDDERBURN WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

**T**HE Council of the shire of Korong, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which occupiers and owners of land and tenements within the township of Wedderburn shall pay for the year ending 30th September, 1921—

- (a) On every house and tenement supplied with water, whether occupied or not, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal annual valuation, with a minimum of Thirty shillings.
- (b) Occupied or unoccupied allotments where no water is supplied a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal annual valuation, with a minimum of Two shillings and sixpence.
- (c) On every house and tenement not supplied with water, but within the area supplied with water by the Council's mains, a rate of Sixpence in the pound on the municipal annual valuation, with a minimum of Ten shillings.
- (d) On market gardens supplied with water a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound on the municipal annual valuation, with a minimum of Two pounds or by measure, or by special agreement.
- (e) For water supplied by measure the sum of One shilling per each thousand gallons of water consumed—30,000 gallons to be the minimum quantity to be charged for under this section.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the 1st day of February, 1921, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Waste of water.—Any person supplied with water by the Council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(c) For water supplied by measure the sum of Two shillings per thousand gallons, with an allowance free equal in amount to the rate paid on each house allotment or tenement, reckoned at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons. The said free allowance to apply only to the year in which the rate is made.

2. The rate hereby made shall be due and payable on the 1st day of February, 1921, at the Shire Office, Wedderburn.

3. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for and recover the said rates and charges.

## BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1921.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law for determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the calendar year 1921:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, and tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land, houses, or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements, if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1921, and ending on the 31st December, 1921, and such person or persons as Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges—

- (a) On every house or tenement of £20 annual municipal value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of £20, at a rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at a rate of One shilling for every one pound per annum of municipal value thereof, except where there is a water service to the allotment when the minimum charge shall be One pound.
- (d) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of Twenty shillings will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at a rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.



(k) The service-pipe for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

- (1) For domestic supply of premises with annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter-inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) inch diameter.
- (2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

(l) Each house or tenement must be provided with separate service from the main.

(m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any irrigation purposes shall be charged for by meter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons in addition to the usual rate for a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for domestic supply may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under the By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

3. The said rates and all charges for water supplied, otherwise than by meter or by special agreement, shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the first day of January, 1921, and on the first day of July, 1921.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when owner or occupier shall become liable to pay rates for the supply of water herebefore mentioned.

In construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

1. On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Thirty shillings.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a stand-pipe or hydrant water for each load of 250 gallons or under, One shilling.

(3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work, brick work, and plastering, or in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stone work, brick work, and plastering.

(4) All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid as agreed upon.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

5. For water supplied by measure a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than purely domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons and shall be paid for in advance or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect to the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1921.

(4) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-seven pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence shall be paid.

(5) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-seven pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

(6) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be:—Under Seven pounds—Seven shillings and sixpence, over Seven pounds the rate shall be One shilling in the pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

(7) For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate, and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

(8) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 54,000 gallons.

(9) The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st of July, 1921.

(10) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

2. For all unoccupied allotments a minimum sum of Ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For water supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which would be equal to the assessed rate payable for the premises so supplied. Water used in excess of that quantity shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence for every thousand gallons except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

4. For any public water trough supplied by the Trust the sum of Thirty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by meter.

5. For water supplied from the stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of two hundred gallons or under the sum of One shilling shall be charged.

The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of April, 1921, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds sterling (£17) and not more than Twenty-four pounds sterling (£24) a rate of One pound fifteen shillings (35s.) per annum shall be payable.

3. Upon properties valued at Thirteen pounds (£13) to Sixteen pounds sterling (£16) a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable according to the municipal

value of such properties, and on properties valued under Thirteen pounds sterling (£13) municipal value per annum a uniform rate of Twenty-five shillings sterling (25s.) shall be payable.

4. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling (£10) per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

5. For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangements with the Trust) the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also in case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust for domestic and garden purposes will be charged for at One shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per thousand gallons up to the amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises and at the rate of Ninepence (9d.) per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

8. For water supplied for other than domestic purposes a rate not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons may be charged by the Trust or the Trust may make special agreements as required.

9. Ratepayers supplied with meters by the Trust shall pay an annual rental for such meters at Nine shillings (9s.) per annum.

10. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show grounds, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be made by special arrangements with the Trust.

11. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant for each load of 200 gallons or under the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* on above scale.

12. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stone work, brickwork, or plastering; or in the absence of a contract of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, according to clause 9 of this By-law.

13. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings shall be chargeable to persons using water for ornamental, garden or other like purposes, and any owner or occupier using more water than in the opinion of the Trust or its officers they are entitled to, the Trust may compel such owner or occupier to put on a meter, or may cut off the water supply from such premises. No water shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than purely domestic use except between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m. or such other times as the Trust may by resolution determine.

14. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust for the purpose of cooling houses or other like purpose the sum of Ten shillings per annum shall be chargeable in addition to the charges under any previous clause of this By-law provided such spray shall only be used between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Eight o'clock p.m.

15. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5).

16. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1921 and are payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January and 1st day of July in the year or in one payment in full on or before 1st day of July, excepting those by measure and special agreements which shall be paid quarterly or as the Trust may direct.

17. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

**H**IS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 37 (e) of the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Act 1918* (No. 2995), doth hereby approve of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board constructing a double cable tramway track in Lonsdale-street, Melbourne, with curves connecting the Board's cable tramways in Swanston and Elizabeth streets, Melbourne, so as to permit of the through running of cable cars between the St. Kilda-road cable tramway and the Elizabeth-street cable tramway, and for the more efficient operation of the tramway undertakings of the Board.

## Route.

That the route of the said tramway track in Lonsdale-street, Melbourne, and of curves connecting the Board's cable tramways in Swanston and Elizabeth streets, Melbourne, shall be as shown on plan (No. 2) referred to in this Order.

## Gauge.

That the gauge of such tramway track and curves shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 ft. 8½ in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from 1 to 4 inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

## Necessary Precautions for Safety of Passengers and Public to be Observed.

That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said Board. Provided always that all cars shall be stopped before entering the curves, and that the conductor shall proceed to obtain a full view of the thoroughfare into which the car is about to enter, and shall signal the driver to proceed only when he (the conductor) shall have satisfied himself that the road at the curves is clear.

## Maximum Speed.

That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars while travelling on the said curves shall not exceed four (4) miles an hour.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and pursuant to the petition of the Council of the municipality of the shire of Walpeup, does by this Order, under the provisions of section 148 of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686) as amended by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1918* (No. 2931), direct that the provisions of Division 14 of Part V. of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, applicable and severally hereinafter set out, shall apply to the election of councillors for the said municipality, with the alterations of such provisions as are shown below, the same being alterations deemed necessary for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions as so applied.

*The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915.*

## COMPULSORY PREFERENTIAL VOTING.

(Part V.—Division 14.)

*How Votes to be Marked by Voter.*

292. (1) When at any election for the municipality a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

(2) The candidate opposite whose name the figure 1 is so placed shall be deemed to be the candidate to whom the elector gives his vote for the purpose of the election.

*Marking of Ballot-paper where only Two Candidates.*

293. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Division, at any election where there are only two candidates—

- (a) the requirements of this Division as to the marking of ballot-papers by electors shall be deemed to be sufficiently complied with in the case of any ballot-paper marked so as to indicate the elector's first preference only; and
- (b) in the case of a postal ballot-paper the elector's first preference shall be deemed to be sufficiently indicated if the surname of only one candidate is written thereon.

*Invalid Ballot-papers.*

294. (1) A ballot-paper shall under this Division be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the elector's first preference for one candidate and in the case of any election where there are more than two candidates his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

*Ballot-papers Not Invalid.*

(2) Except as otherwise expressly provided a ballot-paper shall not be rejected for any reason other than the reasons enumerated in this section but shall be given effect according to the elector's intention so far as his intention is clear.

*Returning Officer to ascertain Results of Polling.*

295. The returning officer (for the riding) shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

*Procedure where only Two Candidates.*

296. At elections where there are only two candidates section one hundred and forty-four of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

*Procedure where more than Two Candidates.*

297. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the returning officer and deputy returning officers for each riding to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer and every deputy returning officer at the polling place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the

inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling booth at which he presides; and
  - (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and
  - (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively; and
  - (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
  - (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.
- (2) Each deputy returning officer shall—
- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the returning officer together with the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll as required by section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.
- (3) The returning officer shall—
- (a) make out in respect of the polling booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling booth the ballot-papers and voters' rolls in like manner as is required in the case of deputy returning officers.
- (4) The returning officer shall as soon as practicable—
- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from deputy returning officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
  - (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole riding the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.
- (5) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes shall if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the returning officer if necessary) be declared by the returning officer duly elected.

*Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.*

(6) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes the returning officer shall upon receipt of the several sealed parcels from the deputy returning officers declare the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes to be a defeated candidate, and with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary shall (notwithstanding anything contained in the Act) in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons then—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers as well as the sealed parcel of used ballot-papers made up by himself; and
- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected; and the ballot-papers counted to such defeated candidate shall be distributed among the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference.

(7) After such distribution the number of votes given to each non-defeated candidate shall again be ascertained.

(8) If no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of declaring the candidate who has the fewest votes to be defeated and distributing his ballot-papers amongst the non-defeated candidates next in order of the voters' preference shall be repeated and the votes recounted after every such redistribution until one candidate has obtained an absolute majority of votes, and such candidate shall then be declared duly elected.

*Casting Vote for Exclusion during Progress of Count.*

(9) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be declared defeated the returning officer shall decide which is to be declared defeated.

*Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.*

(10) If on the polling day the count of the votes by the returning officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

(11) The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the returning officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the returning officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot-boxes.

- (12) Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—  
 (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot-boxes; and  
 (b) the returning officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot-box or boxes; and before re-commencing the count the seal on such ballot-box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

(13) In declaring a candidate duly elected under this section the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the *Local Government Act 1915* shall have full force and effect.

Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets according to Class and Sealed, &c.

298. At the conclusion of the count of votes the returning officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the *Local Government Act 1915*.

*Deposit Moneys.*

299. The moneys paid to the returning officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the *Local Government Act 1915* as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Voting by Post.*

300. When an elector votes by post, then (in lieu of writing on his ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes) such elector shall in the presence of the person authorized to witness his signature, but so that the witness cannot see the vote—

- (a) first write on the ballot-paper the surname of the candidate for whom he votes in the first instance and mark the figure 1 against such surname; and  
 (b) also write the surnames of all the remaining candidates underneath such name and record contingent votes for such remaining candidates numbering them 2, 3, 4, and so on in the order of his preference.

(2) Any instructions to electors required by the Act relating to voting by post to be printed on postal ballot-papers shall for the purposes only of this section be altered so far as is necessary to make them correspond with the provisions of this section, and shall as so altered be printed on the ballot-papers accordingly.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF BALLOT-PAPER AND THE FORMS FOR RECORDING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PREFERENTIAL VOTES.

For the purpose of giving effect to the application to the election of councillors for the shire of Walpeup of the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915* relating to compulsory preferential voting at elections the Governor in Council doth make the regulations following prescribing the form of ballot-paper and the forms for recording the distribution of preferential votes.
