CHAPTER II.

PROFESSIONAL DIVISION.

Appointment to-

- 1. Every applicant for appointment to the Professional Division must furnish the Commissioner with an application in his own handwriting, stating his name in full, his address, the date and place of his birth, and the position for which he applies. He should furnish a certificate satisfactory to the Commissioner of his good moral character and industrious habits, and documentary evidence of his qualifications and experience.
- 2. An applicant must, when called upon so to do, furnish the Commissioner with a properly certified extract from an official register of births or other evidence of age satisfactory to the Commissioner, and also a certificate of sound bodily health and freedom from physical defects from the Government Medical Officer or other medical practitioner registered in Victoria approved by the Commissioner. Provided that in the case of applicants who are eligible discharged soldiers, it shall be sufficient if the said medical certificate sets forth that they are of sound bodily health, and do not suffer from any physical defect which would incapacitate them from the proper performance of the duties of the position for which they apply.

Failure to comply with the provisions of this clause will preclude the registration of an applicant.

3. The requirements of clause 2 as to the medical certificate shall not apply to applicants for appointment to the Professional Division of the teaching staff of the Department of Public Instruction.

In such cases the applicant must furnish a medical certificate from the Government Medical Officer or other medical practitioner registered in Victoria approved by the Commissioner, of sound bodily health and freedom from any defect likely to impair the efficiency of such applicant as a teacher.

4. When it is necessary to fill an office in the Professional Division it shall—unless it be found requisite to appoint to such vacancy a duly qualified person from outside the Service—be filled by the transfer or promotion thereto of the officer who in the opinion of the Commissioner possesses the particular qualifications required for the vacant office, and is next entitled by merit, good and diligent conduct, length of service, relative seniority, and the nature of the work performed by him.

Classification of—

- 5. In the case of appointments, transfers, or promotions to any office in the Professional Division, the scale or amount of salary assigned to the several offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be that respectively entered opposite the name of the office in such Schedule.
- 6. Officers appointed to the offices mentioned in the Schedule may—at intervals of not less than twelve months—be granted sub-divisional promotion. Every sub-divisional promotion shall be discretionary, and shall not be made except on the certificate of the permanent head of the Department that such sub-divisional promotion has been earned by good conduct and efficient service, and the recommendation of the Commissioner. In the promotion of an officer from one sub-division to another sub-division regard shall be had to the nature of the work performed by him.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or water supplied under terms of sub-section (g) of section 1 of this By-law, One shilling per 1,000 gal-

(f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(g) Water supplied to Government Departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.

(h) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum, where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed £20. Such trough charge of Twenty shillings will mean to include the rate at valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £20, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary. necessary.

(i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, by measurement at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.

(j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected.
at a rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour
and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any other work where water is used,
and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.

(k) The service-pipe for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

(1) For domestic supply of premises with annual municipal valuation of £40 or over, a three-quarter-inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal value, half (½) inch diameter.

(2) For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.
