#### REGULATIONS UNDER THE BETTING TAX ACT 1916.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
twenty-seventh day of May, 1921.

#### PRESENT:

**U**NDER and by virtue of the powers and authorities conferred by the Stamps Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1915*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the Regulations heretofore made under the *Betting Tax Act 1916* be rescinded on the first day of September. One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and doth hereby make the following Regulations which shall have effect on and after the said first day of September. One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (that is to say):—

1. The rescission of the Regulations made under the *Betting Tax Act 1916* shall not affect anything done or suffered under the said Regulations before the commencement of these Regulations.

#### DUTY STAMPS.

2. (1) Duty stamps shall be impressed at the Chief Office for Stamp Duties, 267 Queen-street, Melbourne, upon licences and permits issued by racing clubs only in accordance with requisitions by persons requiring them who shall provide such licences and permits.

(2) All requisitions for duty stamps to be impressed on licences and permits must be made in duplicate on Form "A" in the Schedule to the Regulations under the *Stamps Act 1915*, published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd March, 1916.

(3) No stamps shall be impressed unless the value thereof shall have been paid in advance, nor shall cheques other than bank cheques be accepted in payment.

#### BETTING TICKETS.

3. (1) Only betting tickets which have been manufactured by the Government Printer shall be issued by the Comptroller of Stamps. Such betting tickets shall have printed thereon the number of the ticket and shall have impressed thereon the amount of stamp duty payable.

(2) All requisitions for the purchase of betting tickets so numbered and impressed with stamp duty must be made in duplicate on Form "A" in the Schedule to the Regulations under the *Stamps Act 1915*, published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd March, 1916. Cheques other than bank cheques shall not be accepted in payment thereof. Such requisitions must show clearly the name of the bookmaker in respect of whom the betting tickets are purchased. A sum of Four shillings and eightpence or such other sum as may be necessary to cover the cost of manufacture shall be charged for every thousand betting tickets sold in addition to the value of the duty stamps impressed thereon.

(3) Betting tickets shall be used by bookmakers in proper consecutive order and shall have printed thereon the bookmaker's name. The name of any bookmaker impressed with a rubber stamp shall not be deemed to have been printed thereon, and any bookmaker who issues a betting ticket upon which his name has been impressed by a rubber stamp shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds and not more than Twenty pounds.

(4) On the thirty-first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, every bookmaker who is licensed to bet at any race-course in Victoria during the year ending 31st October, 1921, shall forward to the Comptroller of Stamps a verified statement of the number of duly stamped unused betting tickets he has on hand at the close of that day's business.

#### BETTING TICKETS SHALL NOT BE SOLD OR TRANSFERRED.

4. (1) Any bookmaker who has in his possession a betting ticket upon which the name of any other bookmaker has been printed, unless such ticket is held by the bookmaker in respect of a bet made with such other bookmaker, and any bookmaker who sells or transfers a betting ticket to any other bookmaker or to any person on his behalf shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds and not more than Fifty pounds.

#### CANCELLATION OF BETTING TICKETS.

(2) (a) In the case of a bet in which cash is then paid to the bookmaker the betting ticket shall be cancelled by the bookmaker entering particulars of the bet thereon and delivering it to the backer.

(b) In the case of a bet in respect of which cash is not then paid to the bookmaker he shall cancel a duly stamped betting ticket by tearing such ticket in two at the moment the bet is made. Any bookmaker who fails to so cancel a duly stamped betting ticket in respect of a credit bet at the moment the bet is made shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds and not more than Fifty pounds.

#### BETTING BOOKS.

5. (1) Particulars of every bet made by a bookmaker on a race-course must be entered in his betting book opposite the number of the ticket issued in respect of each bet. In the case of a bet in respect of which payment is not then made, such particulars shall be entered opposite the name of the backer. Such betting book shall be produced to the Comptroller of Stamps, at the Chief Office for Stamp Duties, 267 Queen-street, Melbourne, when so required by him in writing. Any bookmaker who fails to produce such betting book within seven days of the date requiring him so to do shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(2) Before recording a bet on any page of his betting book the bookmaker shall write on the top thereof the name of the part of the race-course in which he is carrying on his vocation, and the date of the race meeting.

#### RETURNS.

6. (1) The secretary of every racing club and every person who has the management or control of any race-course shall, within fourteen days of the date of the requisition requiring such to be done, prepare and forward to the Comptroller of Stamps a statement setting forth—

(a) the name of every bookmaker who was licensed or permitted to carry on his vocation at any race meeting held on the race-course under the management or control of such racing club or person.

(b) The name of every bookmaker who was licensed or permitted during any particular period mentioned in such requisition to carry on his vocation on the race-course under the management or control of such racing club or person.

(2) Such statement shall, if so required by the Comptroller of Stamps indicate the particular part of the race-course in respect of which such licence or permit was issued. The secretary of any racing club and any person who has the management or control of any race-course who fails to prepare and forward such statement within the prescribed time shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### RECORDS.

7. The Comptroller of Stamps shall keep a record of—

(a) the numbers and particulars of all betting tickets impressed;

(b) the particulars of all betting books initialed by him or on his written authority;

(c) the particulars of every licence and permit on which stamp duty has been impressed.

8. The Comptroller of Stamps may enter any part of a race-course at any time to inquire into the correct observance of the provisions of this Act, or he may authorize in writing an officer of his staff to do so.

9. The Comptroller of Stamps may require any bookmaker to furnish a statement in respect of any entry in the betting book of such bookmaker or in respect of any betting ticket, whether cancelled or uncancelled, and may require such statement to be verified by statutory declaration.

And the Honorable Arthur Robinson, His Majesty's Attorney-General and Solicitor-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel the Right Honorable George Edward John Mowbray, Earl of Stradbroke, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., C.B.E., Aide-de-Camp to His Majesty the King; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January, to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1915* :—

PART OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

All that portion of the parish of Gracedale, county of Evelyn, containing about 427 acres, and described as follows:— Bounded on the north by the road forming the southern boundary of allotments 141, 120, 119A, 119, 118, 117A, and 112; on the east by the road forming the western boundary of allotments 107, 95, 94, 93, 84, and 83; on the south by the road forming the northern boundary of allotments 153 and 154, and on the west by the road from Healesville to Launching Place, which area includes the eastern portion of the Coranderrk Aboriginal Reserve, and the area in the occupation of the Australian Institute of Anatomical Research.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE HOTSPUR TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 21st October, 1915, the majority of the managers of the Hotspur Town Common having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council on the 7th September, 1885, in respect of such commons.

## REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of the Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of 5 miles from the Common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the Common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and 1st day of October in every year for depasturing stock on the Common shall be as follows:—

For every horse, 4s. per quarter for the quarters commencing 1st January, 1st April, and 1st July, and 12s. for the quarter commencing 1st October, respectively, in every year.

For every horse, 16s. per annum if the fee be paid on the 1st January in every year.

For every head of other large cattle, 3s. per quarter for the quarters commencing 1st January, 1st April, and 1st July, and 9s. for the quarter commencing 1st October, respectively, in every year.

For every head of other large cattle, 12s. per annum if the fee be paid on the 1st January in every year.

For every head of small cattle, 1s. per quarter for the quarters commencing 1st January, 1st April, and 1st July, and 3s. for the quarter commencing 1st October, respectively, in every year.

For every head of small cattle, 4s. per annum if the fee be paid on the 1st January in every year.

4. No bull over six months, entire horses over nine months, rams, or he-goats shall be allowed to depasture on the Common without the consent in writing of the managers first obtained.

5. Sheep or goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the Common as the managers may from time to time set apart for that purpose.

6. No person shall depasture on the Common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

7. Fourteen clear days before the beginning of each quarter all persons entitled to depasture stock and desirous of obtaining permit shall send in an application to the managers, who shall direct what permit shall issue for the then ensuing year.

8. When stock are placed on the Common during the currency of a quarter the full fee for such quarter shall be paid.

9. All persons taking stock to depasture on the Common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, together with a written statement of the number and description of such stock, and shall pay the fee thereon for the current quarter, or proportionate part thereof, who upon receiving the fee shall give a receipt for the same in the prescribed form.

10. The managers shall not be held responsible for any straying; or loss of, or injury to stock legally depastured on the Common, but shall by their herdsman take every care of such stock, and in the event of straying or loss, or injury, shall give to the owners every information and assistance.

11. All cows, oxen, heifers, and steers legally depastured on the Common shall be branded with the Common brand, and the owner of such cattle shall muster them at such places

as may be appointed by the managers, as often as the latter may deem necessary, for the purpose of branding them, notice being given by the managers or herdsman at least four clear days before such mustering, and the herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous place with the Common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and shall be renewed when necessary so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle may depasture on the Common.

12. All cattle found unbranded at or after the expiration of the last muster shall be deemed to be trespassing on the Common, and shall be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

13. No person shall be permitted to remove any stock, whether registered on the books or not, from the Common without having applied to and obtained permission from the managers or herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt for the same, and no person other than the *bona fide* owner of such stock shall be permitted to remove them without authority in writing so to do from such owner previously delivered to the herdsman.

14. All stock depastured on the Common on which the prescribed fee shall not have been paid within ten (10) clear days after the date for renewal of permit, or which shall not be registered, shall be deemed to be trespassing on the Common, and shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

15. Whenever the managers believe that any animal depasturing on the Common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the Common on receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman so to do, and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing to remove such animal, the managers or herdsman may cause such animal to be removed at the owner's expense.

16. All carcasses found on the Common which the owners or owner may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice from the managers or herdsman so to do, may be removed, buried, or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

Any person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

BOROUGH OF GEELONG WEST.

BY-LAW No. 38.

A By-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under the joint provisions of sections 197 and 198 and Part 7, section 2, clause 3, of the 13th Schedule, *Local Government Act* 1915, for regulating and restraining the storage of inflammable materials in the Borough of Geelong West.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall have force and effect throughout the whole of the municipality.

3. This By-law shall come into operation on the 1st December, 1921.

4. No place or premises shall be used for depositing, placing or storing any of the combustible material, articles, or things mentioned in clause 5 hereof unless and until a plan of such premises containing all such particulars relating thereto as may be required by the Council shall have been submitted to the Council and approved by it as being safe and suitable for the purposes required.

5. The quantities of materials to which this By-law shall apply are as follows:—

- Firewood, exceeding 500 cubic feet.
- Old timber, exceeding 300 cubic feet.
- Cool, exceeding 10 tons.
- Coke, exceeding 10 tons.
- Charcoal, exceeding 10 tons.
- Empty wooden casks, barrels, cases, or boxes, exceeding 50 in number.

6. Where materials as specified in clause 5 hereof are stacked or stored in any part of the Borough of Geelong West, with the exception of the brick area, they shall not be placed within 4 feet 6 inches of the boundary of the allotment or premises where such materials are kept upon any one curtilage, or within 3 feet of the boundary where the adjoining property is vacant land, providing that the Council may allow materials to be stacked at a closer distance to the boundary where such boundary is a public street or right-of-way.

7. Where it is desired to stack or store any materials as specified in clause 5 hereof within the brick area, the side boundaries of the premises shall be enclosed with a wall of brick, stone, concrete, or like non-combustible substance without openings except for the purpose of doors from any street of number, width, or height approved of by the Council. Where the length of the walls exceed 30 feet and the height does not exceed 15 feet, the thickness of the wall shall be 9 inches. In excess of that length and height provision must be made for 18-inch piers every 15 feet.

8. The brick area is bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point in the south side of Waratah-street at a point 50 feet distant west of Pakington-street and bounded on the north by Waratah-street, being a line bearing east 50 feet to Pakington-street; thence by a line approximately 66 feet bearing north-easterly across Pakington-street; thence bounded on the north by Wellington-street being a line bearing east 50 feet; thence

on the east by a line parallel to and distant 50 feet from Pakington-street bearing south to Autumn-street; thence on the south by Autumn-street, being a line bearing 50 feet to Fakington-street; thence by a line bearing further north-easterly approximately 66 feet across Pakington-street; thence on the south by Upper Autumn-street, being a line bearing westerly 50 feet; thence on the west by a line parallel to and distant 50 feet from Pakington-street bearing north to Waratah-street, home to the commencing point.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have effect throughout the whole of the Borough of Mentone and Mordialloc.
