REGULATIONS UNDER THE LIFTS REGULATION ACT
1915.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of June, 1921.

WHEREAS by the *Lifts Regulation Act 1915* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order repeal the Regulations made on the seventeenth day of February, 1916, and the seventh day of July, 1919, under the provisions of the said Act, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof (that is to say):—

- (1) Parts I. and II. of these Regulations shall apply to all lifts in use on and after the first day of July, 1912.
- (2) Parts III., IV., V., VI., and VII. of these Regulations shall apply to—
 - (a) All lifts erected after the 1st day of July, 1912.
 - (b) All lifts which, after the 1st day of July, 1912, are re-constructed or materially altered.
 - (c) Every part of any lift which requires renewal after the 1st day of July, 1912.

PART I.

Fees.

(3) The owner, lessee, or occupier of any building in or in connexion with which there is a lift in use shall, on the 1st day of July in each year, or on the day such lift first comes into use, pay to the Inspector for inspection and certificate of inspection—

For each lift (mechanical power), 2s.
For each lift (hand power), 1s. 6d.

In the case of a lift which comes into use after the 1st day of January in any year, the fee shall be half the above rates.

(4) No person shall be called upon to pay more than £10 in respect of any number of lifts within one enclosure for any period of twelve months.

PART II.

INTRODUCTION.

(5) No lift shall be erected, re-erected, or materially altered unless a permit, in the form following, has first been obtained from the Inspector.

LIFTS REGULATION ACT.

PERMIT.

I hereby authorize the _____ of a lift at _____ in accordance with the plans and drawings filed this day.

Dated at Melbourne this _____ day of _____ 19 _____

Chief Inspector of Factories.

(6) Every applicant for such permit shall file at the Factories Office complete plans, drawings, and specifications, showing correct measurements and describing fully the whole machine and its position in the building, unless only alterations are intended, in which case it will be sufficient if the alterations are described.

(7) Before granting such permit the Inspector may require any alterations in design to be made which appear to him to be necessary for the safe working of the lift, and may, upon being satisfied, grant such permit.

(8) All work done and all machines, apparatus, and material used in connexion with any lift shall be subject to the final approval of the Inspector, who shall, as often as appears to him necessary, inspect and test every lift.

(9) No lift which comprises a platform or car shall be erected in such a position as will leave a road for persons to pass under the platform or car.

(10) In these Regulations the word "Inspector" wherever used shall be taken to mean the Chief Inspector of Factories.

PART III.

GENERAL RULES APPLYING TO ALL LIFTS.

Lubrication.

(11) Every lift shall be provided with a proper platform, hand-rail, and ladder to enable the attendant to oil and attend to all parts of the machinery without risk of accident.

Overhead Construction.

(12) All overhead construction shall be of sufficient strength and stability to bear at least four times the load to be put upon it.

(13) All overhead gear shall be supported on steel joists.

(14) In the well, immediately under the overhead sheaves, of any suspended lift there shall be built a substantial platform or grating with means of access from outside the well.

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Lift Wells.

(15) Every lift well shall be so lighted as not to endanger the safety of persons using or operating the lift. The Inspector may, if he considers the lighting insufficient, order suitable lighting to be provided.

(16) Sufficient space for the over-running of the cage shall be provided at the top and bottom of the lift well, and such space shall be not less than 3 feet, measuring at the top from the top of the car beam to the underside of the overhead girders or ceiling joists, and at the bottom from the underside of the car beams to the bottom of the well. Provided that this Regulation shall not be enforced in the case of any lift which was installed on the 1st day of January, 1916, if the Inspector considers that sufficient space for ordinary safety requirements has been provided.

(17) The Inspector may, wherever he considers it necessary, order the whole or any part of the machinery and lift well to be enclosed.

(18) The lift well of any passenger or goods lift shall, on any side in which there is a car entrance, be without projection and (doorways excepted) be enclosed throughout the travel of the car.

Guides.

(19) All guides, whether for cars or for counter-weights, shall be of steel.

Whip Hatches.

(20) All whip hatches on floors to or from which goods are delivered or discharged shall be provided with flaps or rolling platforms, or other suitable contrivance.

Lifting Ropes.

(21) Every suspended lift (other than a whip or crane or goods lift to carry less than 3 cwt.), shall be provided with at least four metallic lifting ropes. Provided that all lifts registered and running on 1st July, 1912, with only two lifting ropes shall be allowed to continue without extra ropes, but any rope on such lift shall be replaced immediately on one wire in any strand becoming broken.

(22) When the number is four, each such rope, when new, shall be sufficiently strong to bear at least five times the maximum load and weight of the car.

(23) When the number is more than four, such ropes, when new, shall be sufficiently strong to bear at least twenty times the maximum load and weight of the car.

(24) In the case of whips or cranes, or goods lifts carrying less than 3 cwt., where one rope only is provided, such rope, when new, shall be sufficiently strong to bear at least ten times the maximum load to be carried.

(25) All balance-weight ropes shall have a proportion of strength to load similar to that of the lift in each case.

(26) The method of binding all lifting ropes and balance-weight ropes around eyes shall be by splicing only.

No metallic lifting rope shall be installed in any lift unless and until a certificate that the rope has been tested showing the breaking load of such rope has been filed in the office of the Inspector.

Diameter of Pulleys, Drums, and Sheaves.

(27) The minimum ratio of the diameter of any pulley, drum, or sheave to the diameter of the rope wound on it, shall be as under:—

For power driven lifts carrying 3 cwt. or over, 45 to 1.
For power driven lifts carrying less than 3 cwt., and for whips or cranes, 14 to 1.
For hand-power lifts, 8 to 1.

Factor of Safety of Suspended Lifts.

(28) Every part (other than a lifting or balance-weight rope) of a suspended lift shall, when new, have sufficient strength to carry a load of at least the following proportions:—

Where material used is cast iron, at least ten times the maximum load to be put upon it.

Where material used is wood, at least eight times the maximum load to be put upon it.

Where material used is wrought iron, brass, or steel, at least five times the maximum load to be put upon it.

Speed.

(29) Lifts operated by lift attendants shall be so constructed as to be incapable of being driven at a rate exceeding 300 feet per minute. Automatic and other lifts shall be so constructed as to be incapable of being driven at a rate exceeding 200 feet per minute.

Roof to Car.

(30) All lifts (other than goods lifts, carrying less than 3 cwt.) shall have a substantial roof fitted to the car.

Doors.

(31) All enclosures, doors, and gates shall be made, where possible, at least 5 ft. 6 in. in height.

Well-doors shall be fitted to all well entrances, and except for automatic passenger lifts shall be of such construction that it will be impossible to open them from the outside without a key (which must not at any time be left in the door).

Car-doors shall only be necessary in passenger cars with more than one entrance.

Safety Gear.

(32) All lifts, excepting direct acting ram lifts, parcels lifts, and dinner lifts, shall be provided with an approved and efficient safety gear which, in the event of the failure of the ropes, will automatically and with certainty bring the car to rest within a safe distance and with minimum shock.

(33) The Inspector may in any case where, on inquiry, he is satisfied such should be done, exempt from the operation of this section any carriage lift.

Testing Safety Gear.

(34) Tests of the cam gripper gear shall be made in the manner prescribed in Regulation (35).

Tests of all other kinds of safety gear shall be made only by an Inspector, and shall be conducted in any manner the Inspector thinks fit.

(35) The car shall be raised to any height he directs, and suspended by hempen rope. The lifting ropes shall be either detached or slackened sufficiently. The hempen rope shall then be cut.

(36) The owner, lessee, or sole occupier of a building within or attached to which there is a lift fitted with cam gripper safety gear, shall cause such gear to be tested in the manner prescribed in clause (35) of these Regulations at least once in every three months by some person authorized under these Regulations to conduct such tests.

(37) Regulation (36) shall not apply to direct acting ram lifts or to lifts which do not exceed in height 3 ft. 6 in., in depth 2 ft. 6 in., and in breadth 2 ft. 6 in., and are constructed for a maximum load of one hundredweight.

(38) The owner, lessee, or sole occupier of a building within or attached to which there is a lift, shall provide and keep a record book in the form hereunder, in which particulars of every test shall be entered and signed by the person who conducts the test.

(39) (1) Every Inspector appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts shall be deemed to be qualified to test any safety gear.

(2) The Chief Inspector may issue to any person who satisfies him as to his qualification and fitness, a permit authorizing him to conduct tests of safety gear under clause (35) of these Regulations.

(3) Every such permit shall expire on the 30th June following the date of the issue thereof, and shall be in the following form:—

Notice as to Load, &c.

(40) Every passenger lift shall have a prominent notice stating the maximum number of passengers allowed, and such number of passengers shall not at any time be exceeded.

(41) Every goods lift shall have a prominent notice stating—
(a) The maximum load of such lift.

(b) That no person, other than the lift attendant and the person attending to the goods, shall be permitted in the lift car at any time.

Such load shall not at any time be exceeded, nor shall any person, other than the lift attendant and the person attending to the goods, be permitted in the lift car.

Signal Bells.

(42) Signal bells, or similar apparatus, which may be operated from any floor, and which works in conjunction with an indicator in the car, shall be provided on all passenger lifts, except in the case of automatic lifts in which an attendant is not employed.

Maintenance of Lifts.

(43) All lifts shall be maintained in conformity with the Regulations, and in proper working condition, clean and free from accumulations of rubbish, dust, and dirt.

All controlling, lifting, or balance-weight ropes that show indications of wear, splinterings, stranding, or bunching must be at once discarded and replaced by new ropes.

Interference with Safety Appliances.

(44) Any person (other than a person mentioned in clause 39 of these Regulations) who wilfully interferes with any safety appliance provided in connexion with a lift or lift well so as to defeat the object of such appliance shall be guilty of a contravention of these Regulations.

Inspection of Lifts.

(45) Every lift shall be inspected at least once in each year, and the owners of, or persons using, such lift shall take all necessary measures to facilitate inspection.

If the Inspector considers that everything is satisfactory, he may issue a certificate to that effect.

PART IV.

Goods Lifts.

(46) Every automatic goods lift controlled by a push button and every electrically-driven goods lift with hand control shall be so designed that it will not move until every lift-well door or gate is closed.

Locks and doors or gates shall be such that it will be impossible to open them from outside except when the lift is opposite.

Every other goods lift shall be provided with gear which, on the car leaving any floor, automatically closes the door or the gate at that floor, and such door or gate shall be so constructed that it will be impossible to open it from the outside without a key, which must not at any time be left in the door.

(47) Every goods lift operated by a hand rope shall be provided with an appliance whereby the person using the car may be able to lock the rope at any floor at which the car is standing.

PART V.

Hydraulic Lifts.

(48) All apparatus subject to hydraulic pressure shall be tested to three times the proposed working pressure per square inch, and a certificate, under the maker's hand, that it has been successfully tested to stand that pressure shall be furnished to the Inspector before it is put into use.

(49) The whole of the machinery shall be tested to twice the working pressure in the presence of the Inspector after erection and before being used.

(50) When any material alteration, addition to, or reinstatement of existing machinery or pipes is made, a similar test shall be made in the presence of the Inspector before use.

(51) Hydraulic machinery having rams working in cylinders shall, in addition to valves or tappet gear, be provided with permanent stops.

(52) An independent screw-down-pressure stop valve and exhaust cock shall be fitted to every service pipe.

(53) A back-pressure valve shall be fitted to every service pipe.

(54) All hydraulic cylinders shall be fitted with air cocks.

(55) Means shall be provided for preventing water syphoning out of cylinders.

(56) No direct acting lift shall be fitted with flying balance-weights unless the ram of such lift is fitted with one or more tie-bolts carried from the bottom of the ram to the girders of the car platform. Other types of balance to be approved by the Inspector.

(57) The controlling valve shall cut off automatically at either limit of travel. The valve must also shut off the water in the case of breakage of the hand-rope.

PART VI.

Electric Lifts.

(58) The location of the electric apparatus shall be such that it shall not be subject to moisture or dampness.

(59) The electrical attachments and apparatus shall be efficiently insulated from body or earth.

(60) Electrical tests effected and approved by the Electrical Inspectors of the Melbourne City Council, or of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, shall be deemed sufficient and satisfactory.

(61) The supply main shall be suitably insulated and fixed, and shall be of sufficient sectional area to carry the maximum current permissible under the rules of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria.

(62) The machinery and apparatus shall be seen and tested by the Inspector before it is put into use.

(63) At the nearest point of entrance to the building the supply mains shall be connected to suitable and efficient double pole fuses or circuit breakers, and also a double pole quick break switch.

(64) The said double pole fuses or circuit breakers shall be accurate, and shall be such that the circuit shall be broken should the current exceed the normal carrying capacity of the main cables by 50 per cent.

(65) An automatic stop, which will instantly break the circuit should the over-run of the car exceed 12 inches, shall be fitted to every goods or passenger lift. This stop must be operated by the car.

(66) All electric lifting apparatus shall be provided with limit stops, or other approved means, to prevent over-winding. These stops must be attached to the lift machine in drum-winding gears, and must operate by the car in friction-driving gears.

(67) The electric controlling gear shall automatically slow down and cut off at either limit of travel. It must operate without causing excessive strain in any part of the apparatus. The electric controls must so operate as to obviate any excessive and deleterious sparking, and must be provided with locks or other means that will hold the controls in the "stop" position.

(68) All drums of electric lifts shall be grooved to prevent any over-riding or jamming of lifting ropes.

(69) The anchoring of the drum ropes shall be such that not less than one and a half turns of each rope shall be round the drum when the lift cage is at the top or bottom limit.

(70) All electric lifts shall be fitted with an automatic device so arranged that should the lifting ropes from any cause whatsoever become slack the current shall be immediately and automatically cut off.

(71) All lift machines shall be provided with an efficient brake gear.

(72) Suitable spring buffers must be provided, to come into operation if the lift over-runs more than 3 inches. These springs must be capable of stopping the lift from full speed at full load without exceeding their safe working deflection.

Automatic Passenger Lifts.

(73) In all lifts controlled by a push button, such push button control shall be so designed that—

(a) the lift will not move until every lift-well door is closed. Locks and doors shall be such that it will be impossible to open them from outside except when the lift is opposite;

(b) as soon as it is operated by any person the car shall be beyond the control of any other person until the completion of its run;

(c) a time interval between the arrival and departure of the car at the completion of its run (sufficient to allow the door to be opened) shall be provided.

PART VII.

Belt-driven or other Power Lifts.

(74) Every belt-driven or other power lift shall be fitted with efficient brake gear, to operate on the worm shaft automatically, when the machine is stopped. Where the angle of any worm is more than the angle of reversibility, efficient provision shall be made to prevent rotation, so that any tendency of the car to descend, except under power, is obviated. Two limit stops shall be provided, one controlled by the hand rope, and one an integral part of the lift gear.

(75) The use of direct spur-gearing or direct friction drive shall not be allowed where it is intended that an attendant or passengers are to travel in the car.

(76) The striking or reversing gear shall operate by means of one hand-rope or rod.

(77) Every drum-winding lift in which any person travels shall be provided with gear, so that, should the lifting ropes by any means become slack, the machine shall automatically stop.

And the Honorable Sir Alexander James Peacock, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Wages Board (hereinafter referred to as the Factory Engine Drivers Board) appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in the occupation of a fireman, boiler attendant, or engine-driver in connexion with the use of steam-boilers or steam-engines other than steam-boilers or steam-engines connected with mines and whose powers were extended to enable it to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the occupation of (a) a boiler cleaner, (b) an engine-driver or attendant in connexion with the use of internal combustion engines or electrical engines other than internal combustion engines or electrical engines connected with mines, did by a certain Determination made on the 11th day of March, 1921, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the fifth day of April, 1921, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas a majority of the representatives of the employers on the said Board have in the prescribed manner appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the Factories and Shops Acts: Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Acts that a Court of Industrial Appeals consisting of the President His Honor Mr. Justice Mann and Percival John Pringle, of Wendouree-parade, Ballarat, a person who is *bona fide* and actually engaged in the trade concerned duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employers on the Factory Engine Drivers Board to represent the employers and Francis King, of Francis-street, Yarraville, a person who has been *bona fide* and actually engaged in such trade for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination duly nominated by a majority of the representatives of the employees on the said Board to represent the employees be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Factory Engine Drivers Board and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

- (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to such By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under such By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such regulations, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house may thereafter be erected.
- (f) Providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof, a prescribed area of open land.
- (g) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution or by an officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, either generally or for any class or cases, or in any particular case.

1. Amending, altering, or revoking clauses 14, 16, 18, 23, 26, and 29 of By-law No. 17.

2. By-law to be construed as one with By-law No. 17.

- XV. Enforcement of By-law and penalties.
- XVI. Fees payable under this By-law.
