ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in a Despatch bearing date the 22nd April, 1921, has intimated to the Governor of the State of Victoria that His Majesty will not be advised to exercise his power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 11th year of His Majesty's reign, the numbers and titles of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:-

THIS indenture made the _____ day of _____ 19____ between _____ employer _____ apprentice _____ parent or guardian for themselves their executors administrators or assigns.

Witnesseth that the said _____ the employer doth hereby covenant with the said _____ apprentice and the said _____ parent or guardian that he the said employer will—

- (a) Take and receive the said apprentice as his apprentice for the full term of _____ years from the day of _____ 19____
- (b) To the best of his power knowledge and ability teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said apprentice in the following branch or branches of piano or gramophone manufacturing or repairing and in all things incident or relating thereto, viz.:—
- (c) Pay to the said apprentice (during such time as he shall observe and perform the terms of this indenture) wages at the rates prescribed for apprentices from time to time by the Determination of the Musical Instruments Board.
- (d) Pay to the said apprentice such rates for overtime worked as may be fixed by the Determination of the Musical Instruments Board.
- (e) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the said apprentice this indenture with a certificate thereon to the effect that the said term has been served. Provided that this shall be conditional on the said apprentice serving the said term and observing and fulfilling the covenants herein.
- (f) If at any time during the said term he or his executors administrators or assigns cease to carry on the branch or branches of his business to which this indenture applies and as now carried on by him within a radius of five miles from his present place of business he or they will with the assistance of the parent or guardian within one month thereafter find and provide some other employer carrying on the business aforesaid within such radius if any there be and transfer this indenture to such employer.

- (a) Well faithfully and honestly serve the said employer as an apprentice in his trade or business aforesaid.
- (b) Willingly obey the lawful orders and commands of the said employer or of such of his representatives as he the said apprentice shall be placed under in the said business.
- (c) Not do or commit nor suffer to be done or committed any waste damage or other injury to the property or goods of the said employer or any firm or company of which he may be a member or lend them to any person without the consent, in writing, of the said employer.
- (d) Not unlawfully absent himself from the service of the said employer during business hours.
- (e) Not by word or action induce other apprentices to disobedience.
- (f) Wherever practicable shall attend some technical school at least once a week.

and that the said _____ parent or guardian shall provide all necessary tools usually provided by the worker to enable the said apprentice during the term of this indenture to perform his work.

And it is hereby specially agreed by all the parties to this indenture that in case any of the covenants hereof are broken by any party hereto any Police Magistrate of Victoria shall have power to cancel and make an end of this indenture of apprenticeship if he is satisfied that any covenant or covenants have been broken and that it is desirable to do so.

- (4) That the said apprentice shall not be entitled to a higher rate of pay until he has made up time lost through illness (in excess of six days) or through his own wilful default or neglect during the preceding six or twelve months as the case may be.
- (5) That in computing the period of six or twelve months as the case may be all time worked as overtime shall be allowed as a set-off against any absence during the said period.
- (6) That a copy of this indenture shall be handed to the apprentice within one month after the signing thereof.
- (7) That if within three months from the date hereof the appearance is in the opinion of the employer unsuitable for the trade or if the said apprentice is unwilling to continue his apprenticeship either party may determine these presents.

And for the true performance of all and every of the said covenants and agreements each of the said parties bindeth himself to the other by these presents.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR 1921.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges herein specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1921 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July, 1921:—

- On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the rate shall be of such percentage on the valuation in each case as shall produce the sum of Twenty-seven shillings and sixpence.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds according to the municipal valuation for the time being, the sum of Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.
- For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated separately from any building, Two shillings and ninepence in the pound of the municipal valuation thereof.
- Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, and not supplied with a service pipe from the main, shall be charged one-half the assessed rate.
- Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile but within half-a-mile of a stand-pipe shall be charged one-quarter the assessed rate.
- All accounts for water supplied by special agreement shall be paid as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates.

UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

RATING BY-LAW No. 33 FOR 1920-1921, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES, FIXING A SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, AND REGULATING THE TIMES OF PAYMENT.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district of Beechworth, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes.

On every house and tenement of the annual value of (£15) Fifteen pounds and under, at rate of £1 per annum.

On every house and tenement above the annual value of (£15) Fifteen pounds, a rate of Six pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence per centum per annum on the amount of such valuation (annual).

The rates shall be paid in advance, by equal half-yearly payments, on the 1st day of October, 1920, and on the 1st day of April, 1921.

Water supplied by measure to any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, or to any other person, (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), shall be supplied, charged, and paid for, at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum of water to be charged and paid for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for quarterly, on the 1st day of October, the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, and the 1st day of July.

This By-law shall be deemed to have come into operation and shall take effect from the first day of October, 1920.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC
PURPOSES AND FOR PROTECTION OF THE NATURAL
FEATURES IN THE PARISH OF BUCHAN KNOWN AS
THE "CAVES RESERVES," HEREINAFTER CALLED
THE RESERVES.**

WE, Alexander Bruce Lang, Augustus Albert Peverill, George Kermode, William Edward Nicholas Koast, and Joseph Martin Reed, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserves for Public Purposes and for protection of the Natural Features in the parish of Buchan, known as the "Caves Reserves," hereinafter called the Reserves, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or other improvements in the Reserves, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
3. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management, light any fire in the Reserves, and then only in the place authorized for the purpose.
4. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the owners of any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals found trespassing will be liable to prosecution for breach of these Regulations.
5. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall erect in the Reserves any dwelling, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall interfere with, damage, destroy, or take away any animals, birds' eggs, or fish, or any trees, shrubs, ferns, or other vegetation on the Reserves.
8. No person shall bring into the Reserves any rifle, or firearm of a like nature, or sporting gun, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. The use of ball cartridge or any form of bullet is not permitted.
9. No person shall camp in the Reserves without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, and shall pay One shilling for one day, or Two shillings per week, and shall camp only on the site indicated by the caretaker.
10. Any person duly authorized to camp on the Reserves may obtain from the Committee of Management a permit to graze therein any horse used by him on payment of One shilling for one day, or Two shillings for one week.
11. All persons camping in the Reserves shall be subject to the control of the caretaker, and his direction as to the lighting and use of fires, the care of the site, and orderly and sanitary conditions shall be fully observed.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserves on Sundays.

13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Conduct of Caves.

14. No person shall enter any Cave in any of the Reserves unless duly authorized and accompanied by the caretaker or authorized guide.

15. The caretaker or authorized guide shall have full authority to exclude from the Caves or to remove therefrom any person creating any nuisance, or who fails to confine himself to the pathways provided in the Caves, or to exercise reasonable care, or who is guilty of any improper conduct, or fails to comply with any of these Regulations or any direction of the caretaker or authorized guide. Any person so offending shall be liable to be proceeded against for a breach of these Regulations.

16. Not more than 10 (ten) persons, other than the caretaker or authorized guide, shall enter any of the Caves at any one time.

17. Tickets indorsed with the name of the purchaser shall be issued by the caretaker or authorized guide, and no person shall enter any of the Caves without being in possession of a ticket duly issued to him.

18. The following shall be the scale of charges which may be charged and taken for the admission during the day of any person to the Caves respectively mentioned hereunder:—

To the Fairy Cave—Two shillings and sixpence for each person.

To the Royal Cave—Two shillings and sixpence for each person.

To the Murrindal Cave or Lilly Pilly Cave, or both—Two shillings and sixpence for each person.

To the Federal Cave—One shilling and sixpence for each person.

To the Moon Cave—One shilling for each person.

In the evening the charge for the admission of any person either to the Fairy or Royal Cave shall be three shillings.

Half the above rates may be charged and taken for any person not over the age of 14 (fourteen) years.

19. The times appointed for the inspection of the Caves shall be 10 a.m., 2.30 p.m., and 7.30 p.m. daily (Sundays excepted). Any person desiring to make an inspection at the time last mentioned must give due notice to the caretaker.

20. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy any stalactite, stalagmite, or rock formation, or any railing or other improvement, in any of the Caves.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 (Five pounds), and any person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the police force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force, and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10 (Ten pounds).

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AS SELECTION PURCHASE ALLOTMENTS.

The land is situated on the Murray River frontage between Piangil and Belcher's Island, and is served by the Coonimur, Natya, Kooloonong, and Annuello Railway Stations.

SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

BY-LAW NO. 68.

Greensborough Park Regulations.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under the provision of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 68, for regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the reserve known as the Greensborough Park.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the said park, reserve, land, or ground, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said park, reserve, land, or ground, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person except those in the employ of, or authorized by, the Council, shall bring into the said park, reserve, land, or ground any horse vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.

4. All dogs, goats, and all poultry found within the said park, reserve, land, or ground shall be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to make compensation for any damage done.

5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the said park, reserve, land, or ground unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said park, reserve, land, or ground any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. No person except those in the employ of, or authorized by, the Council, shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the said park, reserve, land, or ground.

8. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the park, reserve, land, or ground, and to make a charge for admission thereto.

9. The Council shall have power to let the park, reserve, land, or ground to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

10. No charge or fee for admission to such park, reserve, land, or ground shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years, unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.

11. No person except the members of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employees of the Council on duty shall enter any portion of such park, reserve, land, or ground when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

12. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

13. No person shall carry firearms in or through the park, reserve, land, or ground, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein, unless by authority of the Council.

14. No person shall engage in training, or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the park, reserve, land, or ground without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wager for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such park, reserve, land, or ground.

16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employees engaged in the park, reserve, land, or ground by conversation or otherwise.

17. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such park, reserve, land, or ground, any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in such park, reserve, land, or ground at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in such park, reserve, land, or ground.

20. No persons shall assemble in the park, reserve, land, or ground for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the enclosure known as the Greensborough Park.
